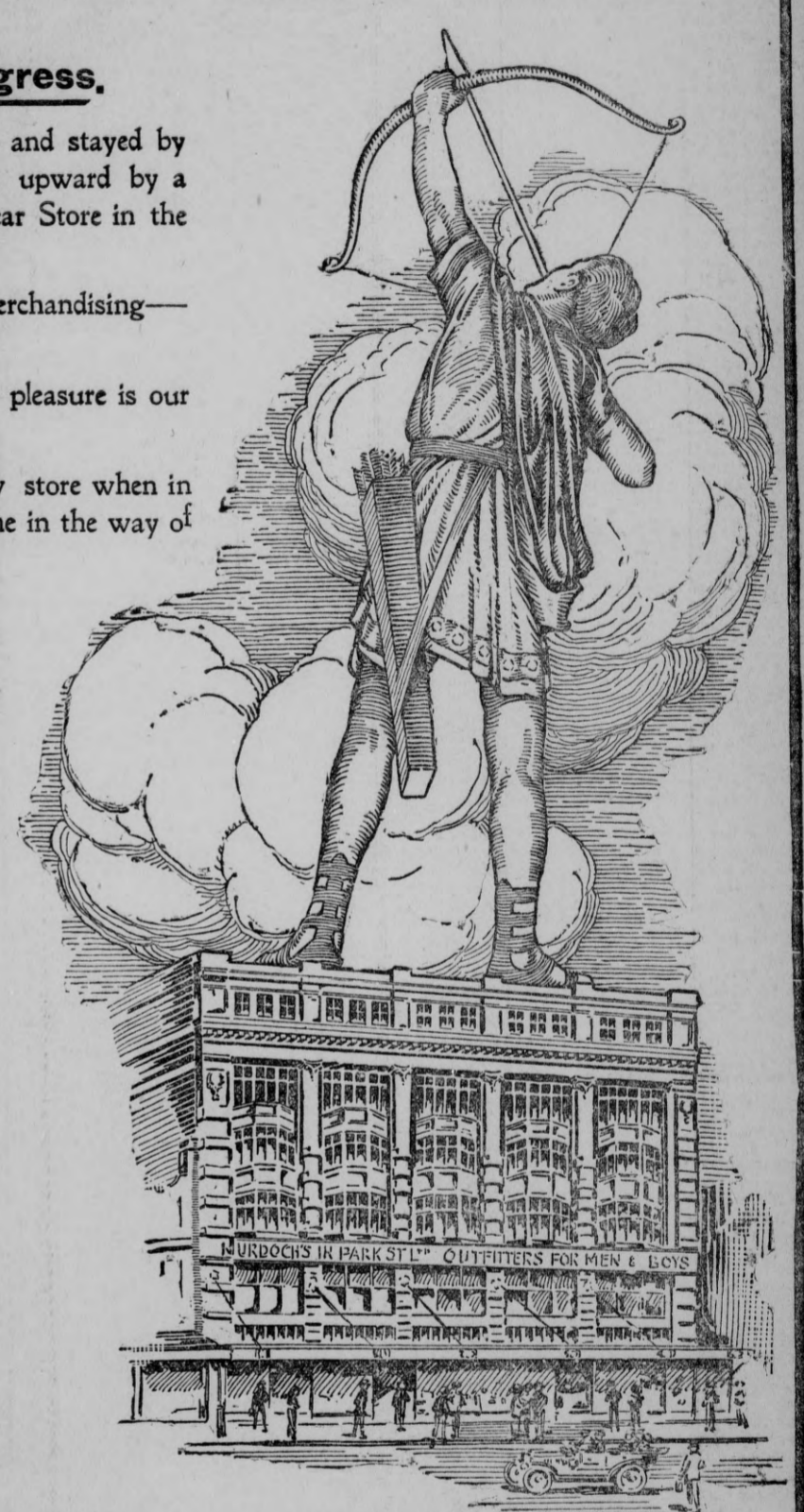

policy of obstruction to all change is their only policy. Just as it was the Labor Party which laid the basis of Australia's present effective defence scheme at a time when the mind of Liberalism was absolutely blank upon the subject, so to-day, on all these questions the minds of the Liberal leaders are apparently without a single helpful idea.

Industrial Undertakings.

The unhappy electors of this State must now be pretty tired of hearing about the enormous sums of money which have been "wasted" in "socialistic" schemes by the present Government.

The annual report of the Auditor-General, supplemented by the balance sheet furnished by Mr. Albert Borchard (one of the leading public accountants of Sydney), with regard to the industrial undertakings, i.e., brickworks, joinery works, metal nurseries, etc., established by the present Government, show that, after paying interest on the capital invested, working expenses, renewals, and all proper charges incidental to carrying on the businesses, have, up to the end of the financial year, resulted in a direct net saving to the country of £19,680.

Why the State Makes Bricks.

In 1906 it became generally known that the brick masters of Sydney had combined to control the brick supply, by fixing a common price for bricks, varied only by the cost of carriage to the more distant suburbs. Small firms were either bought out or squeezed out, and, by the year 1910, the market was controlled absolutely.

The Government, being a very large user of bricks, and feeling the increased prices keenly, established brickworks of its own. This stemmed the ever-rising tide of prices, and saved a huge sum of money to the taxpayers.

The Barren Liberals.

Negative in Office, Obstructive in Opposition.

The canvassers of the Liberal party are very ardently engaged telling the people that the reason they should vote against the Labor Government is because of the increased cost of living.

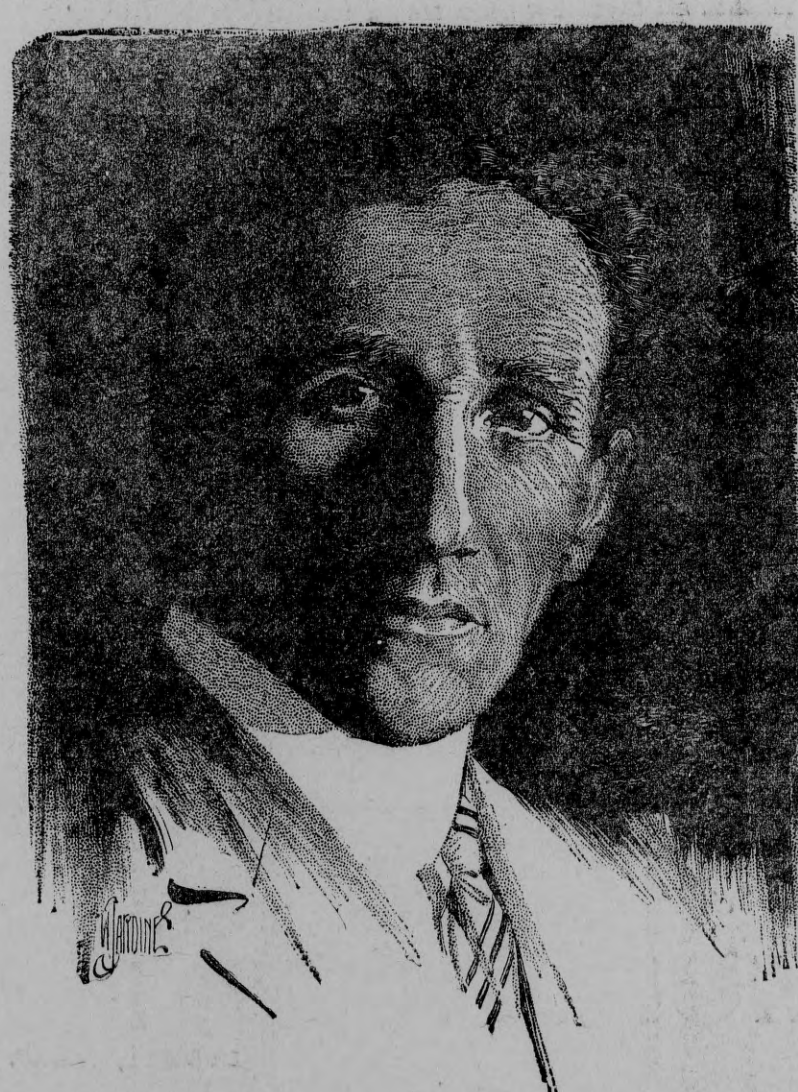
One would think that only in New South Wales had the cost of living increased. The fact is that all over the civilized world the same phenomena is apparent.
