It is hoped that the remaining vacancy in the department will be filled by a lecturer in General Linquistics early in 1963.

Mrs. Svetlana Dyer, Senior Tutor, left for the United States in September to take up a teaching scholarship at the Graduate School, Georgetown University, Washington, D.C. During her absence Mrs. Dyer will engage in post-graduate work leading to a M.A. Degree in Linguistics.

The department gratefully acknowledges the valuable teaching assistance given by Mr. R. King of the Department of Oriental Studies at the University of Melbourne, who served in the department as Temporary Senior Tutor during the major part of the third term.

Visitors

Emeritus Professor Walter Simon served as Visiting Professor in the department during the period July 2nd to July 21st. Professor Simon gave seminars and lectures on Manchu and Tibetan texts and bibliography to members of staff and Honours students of the Faculty. In addition, Professor Simon gave invaluable assistance to individual members of staff engaged in research on topics within his wide range of competence. This visit of one of the most eminent European sinlogues was of extremely great value to the department and the Faculty as a whole.

Conferences

Associate Professor Wang Ling was invited to attend the Tenth International Congress of the History of Science at Cornell University, from August 26th to September 2nd. Dr. Wang visited and lectured at a number of universities in the United States. On his return Dr. Wang renewed his contacts at Cambridge and other British universities.

Members of the department participated in the Eighth A.U.L.A. Congress held in Canberra in August.

Professor N.G.D. Malmqvist delivered the 1962 Morrison Lecture entitled Problems and Methods in Chinese Linguistics.
