#### ANNUAL REPORT, 1957

#### 1. STAFF

Professor D.P. Scales and Dr. K.V. Sinclair, assisted by Mesdames E. Grenot and H. Herzog, part-time tutors (French); Dr. E.K.T. Koch-Emmery and, from the beginning of Second Term, Mr. G. Hughes, assisted by Dr. R. Brunswick, Mr. T.H. Halsey, Dr. H.R.F. Kaulla and, until the 18th May, Mr. R.C. Wilson, part-time lecturers (German); Mr. J.J. Gapanovich, temporary lecturer, assisted by Mr. M. Freiberg, part-time lecturer, and Miss S. Koobakene, part-time tutor (Russian).

#### 2. COURSES

Courses were given in the following subjects: French IA, I, II and III, French I and II Honours; Preliminary German, German I, II and III, German I and II Honours; Russian I and II, Russian I and II Honours.

#### 3. ENROLMENTS

There were, in all, 45 students of French, of whom 28 were candidates for a degree. The latter figure included 11 full-time students, of whom 5 were reading for Honours.

The total enrolment for German was 34, 14 of these being candidates for a degree. Full-time students numbered 4, and there were 4 candidates for honours.

In Russian there were 12 students altogether, of whom 6 were reading for a degree (with honours).

### A.U.M.L.A. CONGRESS

Thanks to the generous financial assistance provided by the Council, all the full-time members of staff were able to attend the Fifth Biennial Congress of the Australasian Universities' Modern Language Association, held in the University of Tasmania from the 30th January to the 5th February. Professor Scales was Chairman of the French Section, and himself read a paper, "The Classicism of Jacques de Lacretelle." Dr. Emmery read a paper to the German Section, entitled "The Classical German Sentence from Goethe to Thomas Mann, " and Mr. Gapanovich contributed a paper on Russian Classicism. Synopses of these papers will appear in the proceedings of the Congress.

#### PUBLIC LECTURE - PROFESSOR SCALES 9.

In November, Professor Scales gave a public lecture at St. Mark's Memorial Library, on "French Literature in the 20th Century."
