The University

The Australian National University is ranked high among the top universities in the world. It is both a teaching university and a centre for research in the natural, physical and social sciences.

The ANU was established in 1946 under Commonwealth legislation with the task of pursuing excellence in its research and in the training of graduate students.

In 1960 the ANU acquired responsibility also for undergraduate teaching through the amalgamation with the Canberra University College. In 1989 an affiliation agreement was signed with the Canberra Institute of the Arts, comprising the Schools of Art and Music, with a view to full amalgamation in 1991.

Distinguished names

The ANU has more members of distinguished Australian and overseas academic societies, including the Royal Society and the British Academy, than any other university in Australia and the names of present and past staff and fellows reads like a list of Who's Who in Science and Humanities.

Sir John Eccles is one of the only two Australian scientists to win a Nobel Prize for medical research. His work on the mammalian nervous system was largely carried out while he was at the John Curtin School of Medical Research during the 1950s.

Another Nobel laureate associated with the early history of the ANU was Howard Florey. He was adviser to the University on the establishment of the John Curtin School and later served a term as Chancellor of the ANU.

Research schools

The seven research schools, which today make up the Institute of Advanced Studies, span the biological, chemical, physical, medical and earth sciences as well as the social sciences and Pacific studies.

The University has observatories at Mt Stromlo, in Canberra, and at Siding Spring, near Coonabarabran, NSW. Its strengths in mathematics were brought together in 1988 in a School of Mathematical Sciences, which includes one of the Government sponsored Centres of Excellence — the ANU Centre for Mathematical Analysis.

Undergraduate faculties

Undergraduate teaching is concentrated in five faculties — Arts, Asian Studies, Economics and Commerce, Law and Science.

In recent years, there has been an increasing contribution by members of the Institute's academic staff to undergraduate teaching and course design. The most recent example has been in the creation of a new engineering degree course which integrates the disciplines of electrical, computing and mechanical engineering.

Research units and academic centres

The University also has a number of multi-disciplinary research units and academic centres. Among these are the Centre for Resource and Environmental Studies, the Contemporary China Centre, the Australia-Japan Research Centre, the Vision Research Centre, the Centre for Recombinant DNA Research, the NHMRC Social Psychiatry Research Unit, and the Peace Research Centre.

Community courses

Throughout the year the University offers a wide selection of extension courses for the Canberra community. These range from a Summer School, offering intensive language courses, to evening lectures on topics such as astronomy and bird watching.

The Library

The ANU Library, comprising three main libraries, a law library and six science libraries, contains over one and a half million volumes and receives over 11,000 serial titles. Its Asian Studies collection, in particular, is outstanding.

These holdings, together with those at the nearby National Library, provide one of the most comprehensive reference sources in Australia.

The Landscape

Ever since its foundation, the ANU has planted trees and paid great attention to the design of the campus. As the University has grown, so its landscape has grown to form a beautiful park-like setting for its many activities.

The Observatories at Mount Stromlo, 18 kms from the city of Canberra, and Siding Spring, near Coonabarabran, NSW, welcome visitors each day between 9.30am and 4.00pm. Siding Spring is closed on Thursday and Friday.

Retail, banking and eating facilities are located in the University Union (**20**), Concessions (**17**) and Arts Centre (**16**) buildings, University Avenue court.

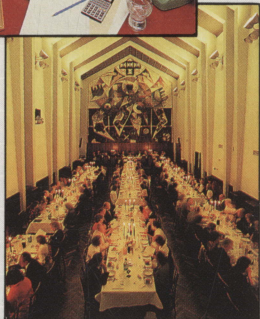
