Important Note.

The Melbourne Survey was in the field from 9th August until 31st December 1971. By the latter date 2,652 full interviews and 18 partial interviews had been completed. The former are reported on here. This represents the eligible respondents in approximately a 0.8% sample of the Melbourne Metropolitan area.

Editing began from the beginning of the survey and by the 1st June, 1972 a definitive data bank was being approached. This bank is reported on in this document. Two important points should be noted, (1) The very large question on the status of children, Question 96, will be the subject of a separate

supplementary report.

(2). An absolutely static data bank, where no further changes are allowed, will never be achieved. Any piece of research may indicate the need for slight adjustment. Very few numbers or percentages reported here are likely to be adjusted significantly, but anyone publishing material from this data should check the data bank before submission for publication and should not employ unchecked numbers from this report or cite the report as authority for data included in the paper. In the main volume the responses are shown as they were given by the respondents. In Supplement No. 1, responses have been coded as zero (not applicable) for women who were definitely infecund and for all women over 45 years of age who were probably infecund, unless their reply to the question was "none" in which case code 8 has been retained. In addition, other women who did not want another son (and who therefore should not have answered 82(d)) have been coded as zero for 82(d) and those who did not want another daughter as zero for 82(e).
