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COMMERCIAL FINANCE, AUSTRALIA AUGUST 1990

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MAIN FEATURES

Commercial finance commitments made by significant lenders in August 1990 totalled \$7,768.2 million, an increase of \$718.3 million (10.2%) on July 1990 but a decrease of \$954.6 million (10.9%) on August 1989.

It should be noted that July 1990 was a four week reporting period for some banks whereas August 1990 and August 1989 were five week reporting periods.

Commitments under fixed loan facilities were down \$169.9 million (5.5%) on July 1990 although lending commitments for the purchase of plant and equipment were up \$142.2 million (55.7%) on July 1990.

Commitment under revolving credit facilities were up \$888.2 million (22.4%) on July 1990. The increase was general across all types of lender, with most market corporations accounting for the major component of the increase, up \$521.0 million to \$872.5 million.

EXPLANATORY NOTES

Introduction

This publication presents statistics of commercial finance commitments made by significant lenders to government, private and public enterprises, and non-profit organisations as well as to individuals (for investment and business purposes). Please note that lease finance commitments are excluded (refer *Lease Finance, Australia*, 5644.0). For detailed information on scope and coverage of these statistics and definitions of data items, refer to the January 1990 issue of this publication.

Statistical period

2. While the statistics are described as being for calendar months, it should be noted that:

- in the case of some of the larger banks, the data relate to a month ending on the last Wednesday;
- in the case of other lenders, some have accounting periods which do not correspond exactly to a calendar month and their figures are used without adjustment.

Unpublished data

3. More detailed classifications of the data in this publication may be made available on request. Generally a

Revisions

4. Revisions to previously published statistics are included in issues of this publication as they occur.

Total credit limits at end of period

5. In principle, total credit limits at the end of period for revolving credit presented in Table 4 are derivable by adding new and increased lending commitments during the period less cancellations and reductions of credit limits during the period to the balance of credit limits at the end of the previous period. In practice, however, revisions and other adjustments such as the transfer of an existing fixed credit facility to a revolving credit facility will mean that such a derivation is inexact.
