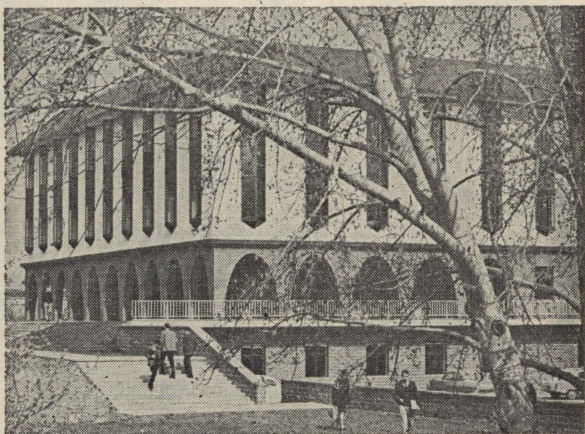

INFORMATION AND TOURS

General information about the University is available from the Information Office, Room 101, Chancelry, which is open on weekdays (Monday to Friday) from 9 a.m. to 5 p.m., telephone 49-2229.

The University grounds are open to the public, but University buildings are not open for inspection unless visitors are taking part in a conducted tour.

A conducted tour of the University leaves the main entrance hall of University House at 3 p.m. each weekday (Monday to Friday) with the exception of public holidays and the period from 25 December to 1 January inclusive. Visitors are requested to provide their own transport.

Conducted tours of Mount Stromlo Observatory take place at 11 a.m. and 3 p.m. on weekdays and between 2 p.m. and 4.30 p.m. on Saturdays, Sundays and public holidays. For information on evening visits to the Observatory, please telephone 706-511.

THE UNIVERSITY

The Australian National University, which occupies a site of 315 acres* to the west of Canberra City, differs from most universities in that it consists of two distinct academic parts — the Institute of Advanced Studies and the School of General Studies.

The Institute, unique in Australia, is devoted entirely to research and postgraduate training. It comprises the John Curtin School of Medical Research, the Research Schools of Physical Sciences, Social Sciences and Pacific Studies and the recently established Research School of Chemistry. These fields of research were chosen largely because of their importance to Australia or because of the special advantages that Australia offered for their study. Research students in the Institute of Advanced Studies number more than 300, of whom about half are from overseas, representing some 30 nationalities.

The School of General Studies undertakes the usual teaching and research functions of a university. Its Faculties of Arts, Economics, Law, Oriental Studies and Science are organised on traditional university lines and provide undergraduate and postgraduate teaching, with good facilities for research. The School attracts students from all States of the Commonwealth and from overseas. There are more than 2,500 undergraduate and postgraduate students in the School of General Studies this year.

With increasing numbers of its students coming from interstate and from overseas, the University makes special provision for residential accommodation. University House is a collegiate residence for research students, staff and visitors. Bruce Hall, Burton Hall, Garran Hall and Lennox House provide residence primarily for undergraduates and for some research students.

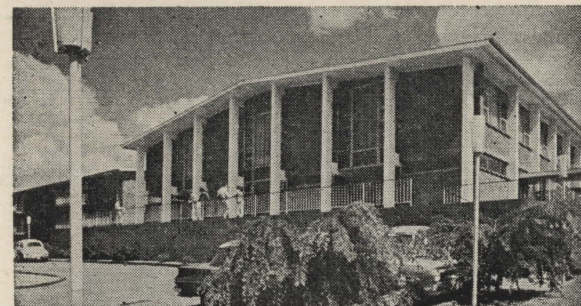

THE LIBRARY

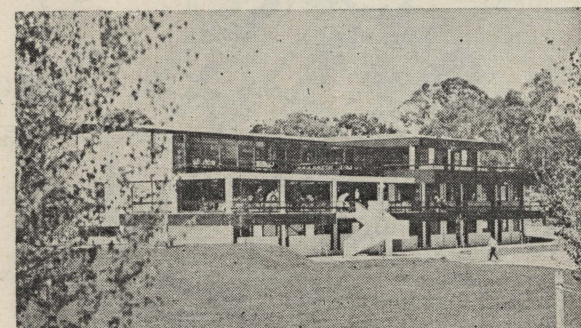
The University Library at present has some 400,000 volumes in three main sections — the Advanced Studies collection (204,000 volumes), the General Studies collection (123,000 volumes) and the Oriental Studies collection (73,000 volumes). The main collections are housed in the R. G. Menzies Building and the General Studies Building of the Library.
