MAIN FEATURES

**Victoria's population
growth**

The estimated resident population (preliminary) of Victoria at 30 June 1993 was 4,462,060, an increase of 13,240 (0.3 per cent) from 30 June 1992.

**MSD population
growth**

The Melbourne Statistical Division (MSD) had an estimated resident population at 30 June 1993 of 3,187,450, an increase of 9,550 (0.3 per cent) from 30 June 1992.

Slowing down of fast growing areas

The rates of growth of the five most rapidly growing municipalities in the MSD have slowed down in the two years 1991-93 compared to the growth rates experienced from 1986-91. Note that Pakenham (S) replaces Hastings (S) as the fifth ranked growth area. The growth rates in four of the five top growth areas have further slowed down in 1992-93 compared to 1991-92.

REST OF VICTORIA BY LOCAL GOVERNMENT AREA, 1991-1993**

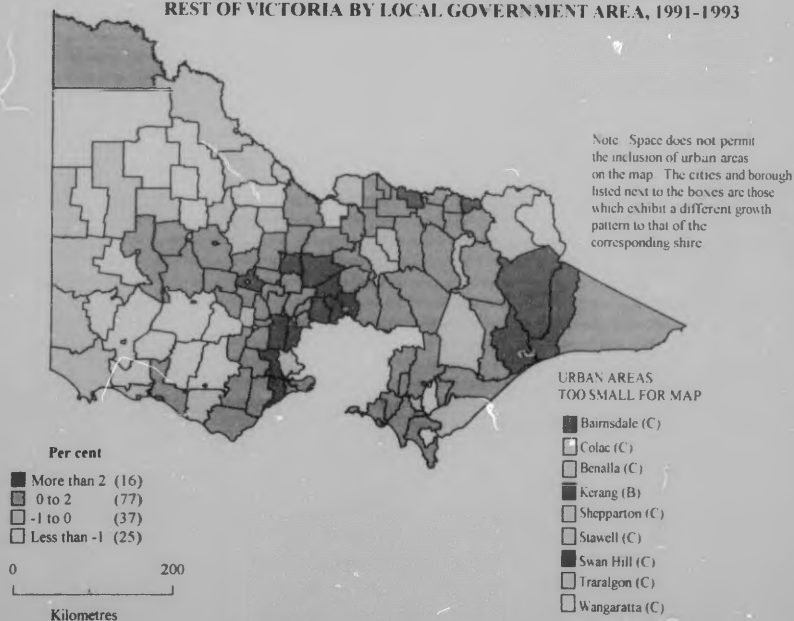

EXPLANATORY NOTES

Introduction

This publication contains, for each statistical local area (SLA), statistical district, statistical division, and statistical subdivision in Victoria, the estimated resident population at 30 June 1986, 1991, preliminary estimates for 30 June 1992 and preliminary estimates for 30 June 1993, average annual growth rates from 1986 to 1991 and from 1991 to 1993, and growth rates from 1992 to 1993.

2. The population estimates for 30 June 1992 are still preliminary as the state estimates have not yet been finalised.

Methodology

3. The estimated resident population is compiled according to the place of usual residence of the population. An explanation of the conceptual basis is given in the ABS Information Paper entitled *Population Estimates: An Outline of the New Conceptual Basis of ABS Population Estimates* (3216.0).

4. The estimated resident population as at 30 June for 1986 and 1991 for each SLA has been calculated by adjusting usual residence census counts for under-enumeration and adding the number of residents temporarily overseas at Census date.

5. For intercensal years, the estimated resident population for each SLA (at 30 June) is calculated using a linear regression model. The model establishes a mathematical relationship between changes in population and changes in other variables, known as predictor variables, over the period between the two most recent censuses for which the required data are available, i.e. 1986 to 1991. This relationship is then used to estimate the change in population of each statistical local area since the date of the last census, based on the change in the predictor variables since that date. The predictor variables used are occupied dwellings, births, deaths, medicare enrolments and school enrolments. A more detailed explanation of the methodology used is given in the ABS Information Paper: *Local Government Area Population Estimates, Victoria* (3205.2).

6. Other indicators of resident population movement have also been used to supplement the estimates from the regression model when preparing the published estimates. These include the numbers of persons resident in prison.

Australian Standard Geographical Classification

7. The geographic areas used in this publication are defined in the *Australian Standard Geographical Classification (ASGC) Edition 2.1* (1216.0). Readers are urged to familiarize themselves with this publication for a full description of the boundary changes.

Changes to Statistical Boundaries

8. The boundaries of SLAs used in determining the population are those in existence at 30 June 1993. The population estimate for previous years have been adjusted where appropriate so that they reflect the population changes for each area had the June 1993 boundaries existed then.

9. A list of boundary changes in SLAs which occurred between 1 July 1991 and 30 June 1993 are shown in Table 5 on page 14.

10. The Victorian Government proclaimed a City of Greater Geelong on 18 May 1993, which amalgamated Geelong (C), Geelong West (C), Corio (S), South Barwon (C), Newtown (C) and Bellarine (RC). It is understood that amalgamated councils will eventually be abolished, and a new Greater Geelong council established. This affected 8 LGAs and 11 SLAs. Pending final ASGC adaptation to the City of Greater Geelong boundary amalgamation, the following interim SLA changes were used to accommodate LGA splitting of Barrabool (S) and Bannockburn (S):

all of Bannockburn (S) Part A to Corio (S) Part A;
all of Barrabool (S) Part A to South Barwon (C) Part A;
part of Barrabool (S) Part B to South Barwon (C) Parts A and B.

Consequently, Barrabool (S) Part B and Bannockburn (S) Part B have been renamed Barrabool (S) and Bannockburn (S) respectively while awaiting ASGC review of the new City of Greater Geelong boundaries.

Usual residence not stated

11. In the 1991 Population Census the SLA of usual residence was not stated for 70,000 persons in Victoria. For purposes of the estimated resident population for 1991, these were distributed proportionately to all SLAs in the state.

In the 1986 and previous censuses, they had been allocated to the SLA in which they spent census night.

The effect on SLAs of the new allocation method was significant in the Cities of Melbourne, St Kilda and Prahran, but was negligible or minor elsewhere.

In order to preserve comparability with 1986 data, estimates for that year have been re-worked according to the new allocation method.

Rounding of figures

12. Population estimates in this publication have been rounded to the nearest fifty persons in the Melbourne Statistical Division. For the remainder of Victoria, individual statistical local areas and subdivision totals have been rounded to the nearest

ten persons. This level of rounding has been chosen because more severe rounding could result in substantial year to year fluctuations in the estimates for some SLAs, due to the rounding process rather than an actual population change. It should not be implied that the estimates are accurate to the degree shown.

13 Where figures have been rounded, discrepancies may occur between sums of component items and totals.

Average annual growth rate

14. The average annual rates of population growth from 1986 to 1991 in this publication have been calculated by the following formula and then expressed as a percentage:

$$r = (P_{91} / P_{86})^{1/5} - 1$$

where "P₉₁" and "P₈₆" are the estimated resident population for 1991 and 1986 respectively and "r" represents a compound interest annual rate of growth throughout the period. This reflects an average rate between 1986 and 1991 and not between the individual intercedes years. A similar formula was used for calculating the annual average growth rate between 1991 and 1993.

Area Data

15. The area data given in tables 1 and 2 emanates from the ABS Digital Collection District (CD) Master File which is referenced to Census 91.

Data on floppy disk

17. Estimated resident population classified by age and sex by statistical area for 30 June 1986, 1987, 1988, 1989, 1990 and 1991 are available on floppy disk. 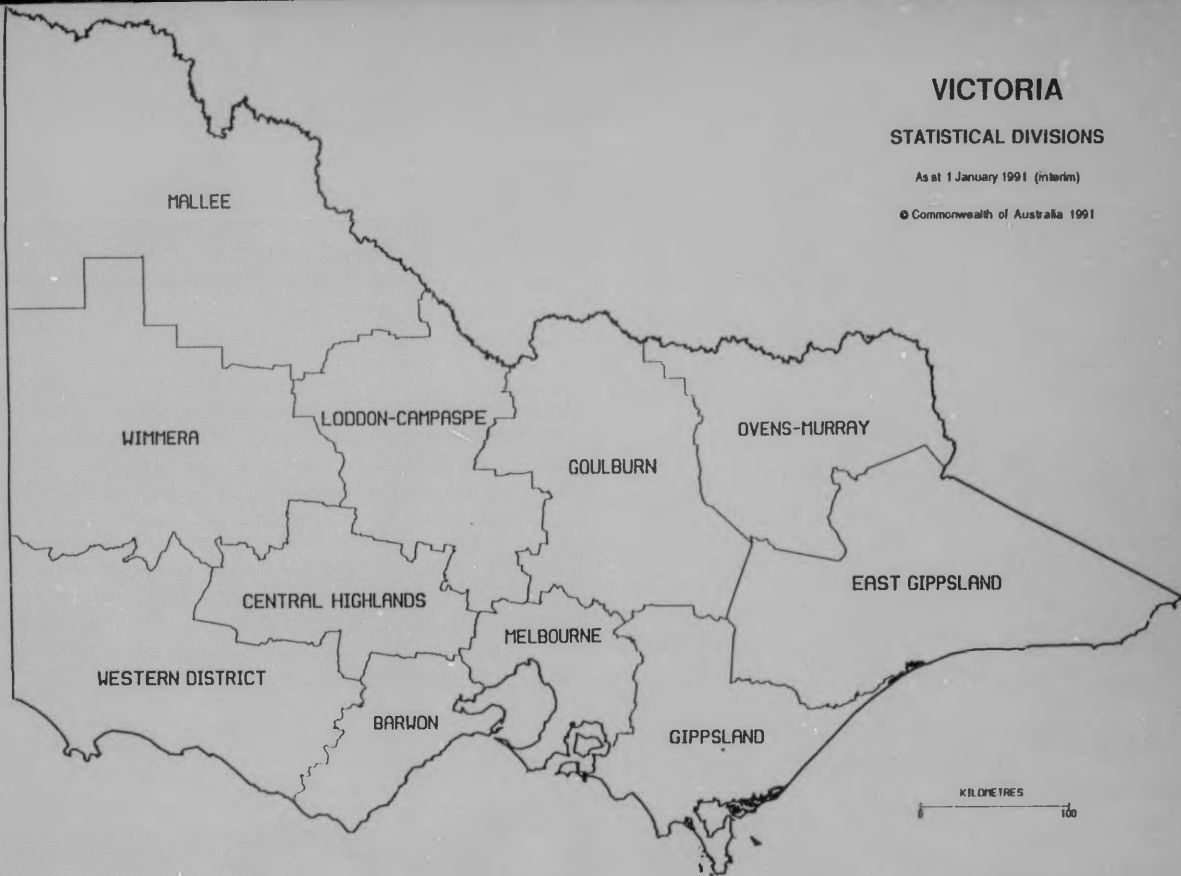

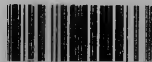
