Teaching and other academic associations

At the ANU: Teaching of archaeology; major responsibility for teaching and supervision in the field of Aboriginal history, often with reference to the Northern Territory; first year unit, 'Approaching History', introduced students to a wider range of sources than normally considered by historians; taught and supervised in the history of island Southeast Asia.

At the University of Tasmania: Designed and taught units in Australian history and an innovative course in 'History and Heritage' which focused on issues of historical archaeology, interpretation and conservation. Outside the university, associated with The Royal Society of Tasmania, several local historical societies, some excavations on nineteenth century historical sites; set up and continue to run a publishing and research enterprise, the Historical Survey of Northern Tasmania.

Since returning to Canberra in 2000: Involved with the editing and production of the *Review of Indonesian and Malaysian Affairs* and have acted as adviser to various Indonesian doctoral students.
