



LIVESTOCK PRODUCTS, AUSTRALIA AUGUST 1986

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MAIN FEATURES

In seasonally adjusted terms, red meat production for August 1986 (198,882 tonnes) has increased 7.3 per cent (13,561 tonnes) over last month and 14.7 per cent (25,562 tonnes) on August 1985. Actual red meat production of 187,181 tonnes, however, is 6.8 per cent (13,736 tonnes) lower than last month and 9.0 per cent (15,417 tonnes) higher than the level recorded in August 1985. Total red meat production decreased in all States except South Australia and Western Australia which recorded increases of 10.7 per cent and 5.6 per cent respectively over the production levels for July 1986. For August 1986, all meat categories except veal and lamb have increased over August 1985, but only veal and mutton have shown increases over the previous month.

Whole milk intake by factories for July 1986, in seasonally adjusted terms, decreased by 4.2 per cent (21 million litres) on last month to 484 million litres and fell 2.6 per cent (13 million litres) on July 1985. In actual terms this represents an increase of 18.9 per cent (53 million litres) to 334 million litres over June 1986 and a decrease of 2.3 per cent (8 million litres) on the level recorded for July 1985.

Brokers and dealers receive of taxable wool for July 1986 decreased by 15.7 per cent (11,999 tonnes) on last months receipts to 64,395 tonnes in seasonally adjusted terms. In actual terms receipts for July 1986 increased by 59.8 per cent (19,397 tonnes) over the previous month to 51,846 tonnes with increases in all States. Major contributors were Victoria, South Australia and Western Australia.

EXPLANATORY NOTES

Introduction

This publication contains information (preliminary where indicated) on livestock slaughterings, meat production, exports of fresh, frozen and processed meat and stocks of frozen meat, whole milk intake by factories, market milk sales by factories and receipts of taxable wool by wool brokers and dealers.

Livestock slaughterings and meat production

2. The statistics on slaughterings and meat production are based on a monthly collection from abattoirs and other major slaughtering establishments and include estimates of animals slaughtered on farms and by country butchers and other small slaughtering establishments.

3. Care should be taken when using this information as the figures only relate to slaughterings for human consumption and do not include animals condemned or those killed for boiling down. Also, definitions of livestock categories may differ between States and within States, particularly with regard to calves.

4. Poultry slaughtering statistics have been compiled from returns supplied by commercial poultry slaughtering establishments. Producers in the Northern Territory and the Australian Capital Territory and the many very small producers are excluded from the collection; however, the statistics

represent a high level of coverage. The Queensland statistics are based on data collected by the Queensland Department of Primary Industries.

Milk

5. Tables 8 and 9 contain statistics collected by the Australian Dairy Corporation (ADC) on the intake of whole milk and the sales of market milk by factories.

Wool receipts

6. The statistics in Table 10 show the amount of taxable wool received by brokers and dealers from wool producers. It excludes wool received by brokers on which tax has already been paid by other dealers (private buyers) or brokers.

7. The information shown is on the basis of the State in which the wool has actually been received and does not necessarily reflect the production of wool in that State.

Seasonal adjustment

8. Details of seasonally adjusted figures for meat, milk and wool are shown in Tables 4, 8 and 10 respectively. Information on the methods used in seasonally adjusting these series is contained in *Seasonally Adjusted Indicators, Australia* (1308.0).

RED MEAT PRODUCTION, AUSTRALIA ('000 TONNES)

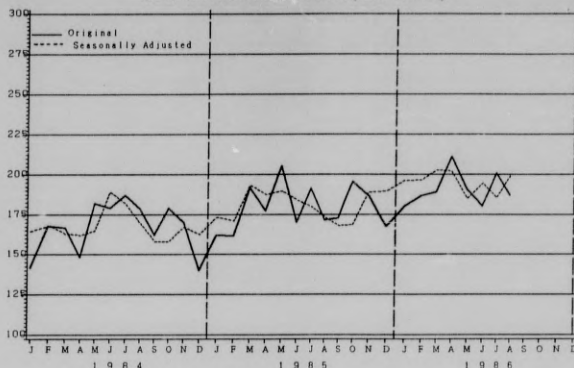

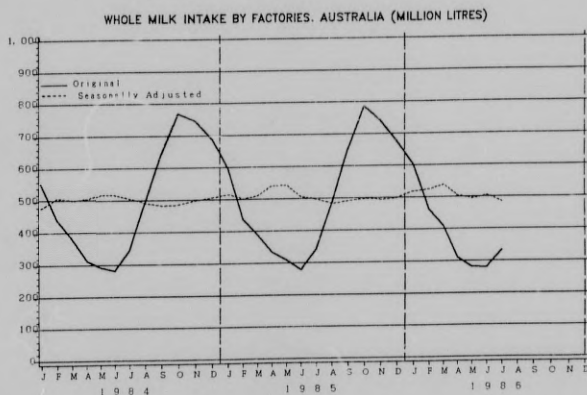
