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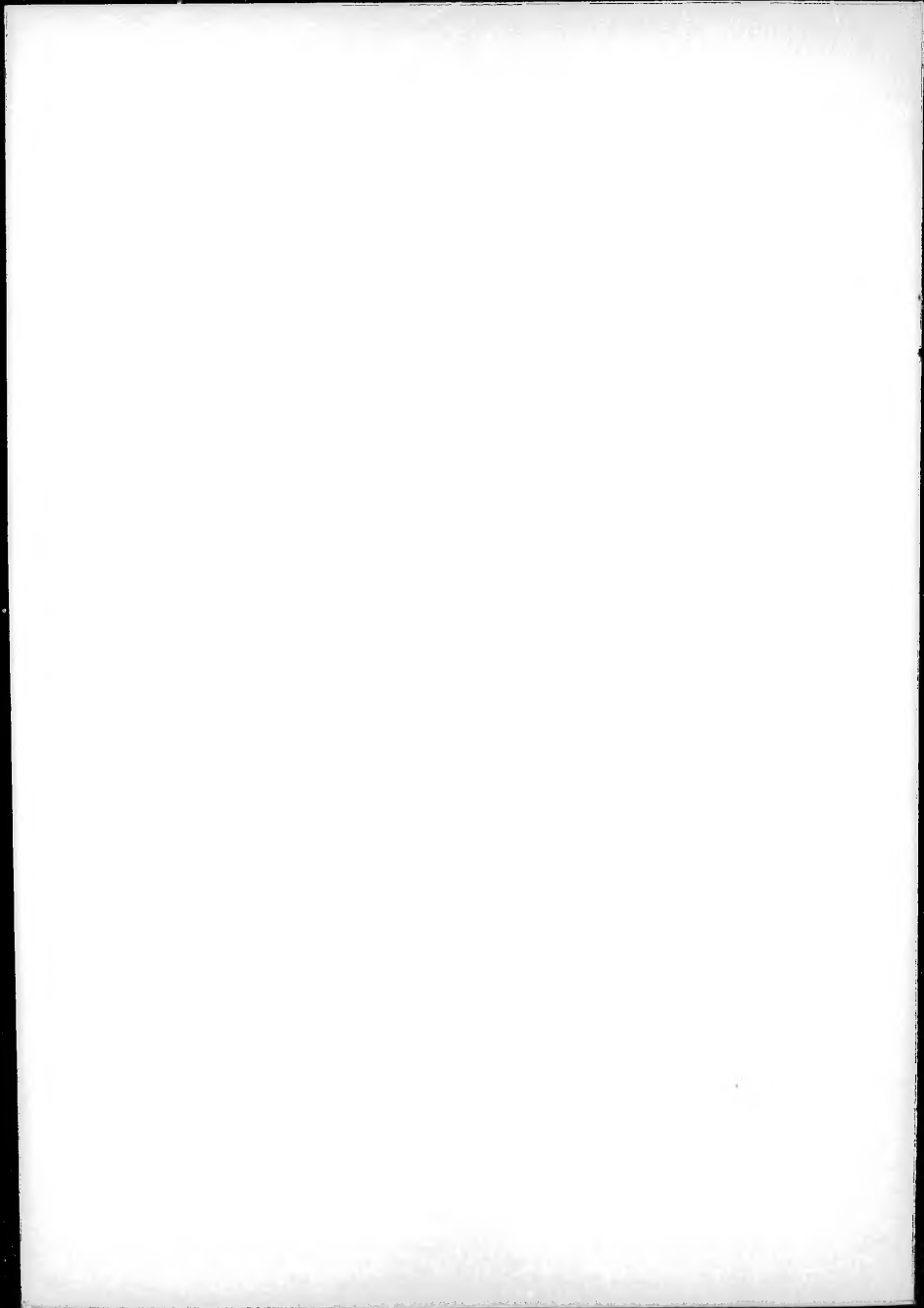

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## Main Features (a)

- The total number of people counted in Victoria on census night, 6 August 1991, was 4,243,719. This figure represents a 5.6% increase in the census count of the State since the 1986 Census.
- The sex ratio of the Victoria population in 1991 was 97.7 males to 100 females, compared with 98.2 males to 100 females in 1986.
- 3,022,157 people were counted in the Melbourne Statistical Division. This represents 71.2% of all the people counted in Victoria on census night.
- In the Melbourne Statistical Division, the statistical local area with the largest increase in absolute numbers from 1986 to 1991 was Cranbourne, increasing by 23,216 people. This is an increase of 48.8%.
- 6 other statistical local areas within the Melbourne Statistical Division recorded increases of more than 10,000 people from 1986 to 1991. They were Werribee, increasing by 19,731 people (37.6%), Knox increasing by 17,788 people (17.1%), Berwick increasing by 17,463 people (35.9%), Whittlesea increasing by 16,343 people (20.6%), Keilor increasing by 12,756 people (13.7%), and Bulla increasing by 10,952 people (38.6%).
- A number of statistical local areas within the Melbourne Statistical Division recorded decreases. They included Waverley, declining by 4,655 people, Preston declining by 3,058 people, Coburg declining by 2,270 people, Northcote declining by 2,010, and Nunawading declining by 2,003 people.
- In the remainder of the State, the largest increases were recorded in the statistical local areas of Bellarine - Pt B, with 4,373 more people, and Wodonga, with 3,698 more people.
- The total number of dwellings counted by the census in Victoria has increased by 9.3% since the 1986 Census, from 1,503,858 to 1,644,397 in 1991.

## About this publication...

This publication contains **preliminary** data, the first counts from the 1991 Census of Population and Housing. Final data will be available from the March quarter 1993.

The publication contains preliminary counts for statistical local areas (SLAs) and statistical divisions (SDs). The counts are on a place of enumeration basis, which provides a count of people where they were located on census night, 6 August 1991, which may not be where they usually live.

*First Counts for Statistical Local Areas* is produced for each State and Territory.

## Scope and coverage...

The 1991 Census of Population and Housing was held on 6 August 1991. The purpose of the census was to count every person who spent census night in Australia. This included people in private dwellings, occupied non-private dwellings, camping out, on vessels in or between Australian ports and on board overnight transport.

People were counted where they were located on census night, which may not have been where they usually lived.

Visitors to Australia were counted regardless of how long ago they arrived, or how long they planned to stay. Australian residents out of the country on census night were excluded.

All private dwellings were counted, whether occupied or unoccupied. Occupied non-private dwellings, such as hospitals, gaols, etc. were also counted.

Diplomatic personnel and their families were excluded from the census, as were diplomatic residences.

## Preliminary data limitations...

Statistical collections such as the census are subject to a number of sources of error. The effect of such errors on overall census results is generally insignificant. However, preliminary data are subject to number of additional errors which may affect the quality of the data.

The counts presented in this publication have been captured using Optical Mark Recognition (OMR). With OMR, a mark is placed in a pre-defined box on the census form and read by machine.

This process may result in a number of errors. For example, marks may not be recognised by the OMR machines, or more than one mark may have been made in response to a single question.

Errors such as these are corrected for final data and therefore preliminary data may differ from final data. Any differences are expected to be small.

### 1986 Census data...

Preliminary counts were not available from the 1986 Census. Final 1986 Census data have been provided in this publication. Where a statistical boundary has changed, 1986 Census data have been adjusted. The 1986 data was originally published in *Census 86 - Persons and Dwellings in Legal Local Government Areas, Statistical Local Areas and Urban Centres/(Rural) Localities, Victoria (2463.0)*.

### Introduced random adjustments...

Adjustments are randomly made to table cells to protect the confidentiality of information about individuals. As a result, component cells may not add to their totals. These differences are statistically insignificant and do not impair the usefulness of the tables.

### Census variables in this publication...

#### **Sex**

Question 3 on the census forms asks the sex of each person.

#### **Persons**

Visitors are included.

#### **Dwellings**

The census collector recorded each dwelling as either private or non-private. Private dwellings are either occupied or unoccupied, and are further defined by structure (for example, separate house, townhouse, flat or apartment, caravan etc in caravan park). For non-private dwellings, only those which were occupied were included in the census. Non-private dwellings include motels, gaols, welfare institutions, hospitals, retirement villages, boarding schools etc.

### Geographic areas...

The codes and names of geographic areas used in this publication are defined by the Australian Standard Geographical Classification (ASGC).

The ASGC codes are included to enable users to cross-reference geographic areas in this publication with areas in other census products which use codes only, such as maps and some electronic products.

Statistical local areas (SLAs) consist of one or more collection districts (CDs), and can be based on legal local government areas (LGAs), or parts thereof, and any unincorporated area.

Statistical subdivisions (SSDs) consist of one or more whole SLAs.

Statistical divisions (SDs) consist of one or more SSDs. SDs are designed to be relatively homogeneous regions, characterised by identifiable social and economic links between the inhabitants and the economic units within the region, under the unifying influence of one or more of the major towns or cities.

SLAs, SSDs and SDs each cover, in aggregate, the whole of Australia without gaps or overlaps.

Off-shore oil rigs, drilling platforms and the like are treated collectively within each State and the Northern Territory as an off-shore area.

People classified as migratory are those enumerated on board vessels in and between Australian ports or on board overnight transport.

The codes and names of the geographic areas used in this publication are detailed in the publications *1991 Census Geographic Areas (2905.0)* and *Australian Standard Geographical Classification (ASGC) (1216.0)*, edition 2.1.

#### Other 1991 Census products and services...

Final data from the 1991 Census will be published in a range of publications including *Census Counts for Small Areas (2730.1-8)*, *Census Characteristics for (State/Australia) (2710.0-8)*, thematic reports and social atlases. Products will also be available on floppy disk, microfiche, and CD-ROM.

A number of 1991 Census products are already available from the ABS. They include the *1991 Census Dictionary (2901.0)* and *1991 Census Directory of Classifications (2904.0)*. For detailed explanations of data, census concepts, terminology, variables and classifications, refer to these publications. *Collection District Maps (2920.0)* in hardcopy and on microfiche, and the *Collection District Comparability List (2919.0)* are also available.

*1991 Census - A Guide to Products and Services (2910.0)* provides details on national products and services. *Census Update*, a quarterly newsletter, will keep you up to date with developments in all census products and services. #### ABS population estimates...

Official ABS population estimates (estimated resident population) based on 1991 Census results are expected to be released in June 1992 for States and Territories, and in 1993 for SLAs.

These estimates will be derived from 1991 Census counts based on respondents' stated place of usual residence, and will include adjustments:

- to include people who were in Australia on census night but were missed in the census;
- to include Australian residents who were temporarily overseas on census night (these people were not within the scope of the census).

ABS population estimates are published quarterly.
