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EXPLANATORY NOTES

(i) Basic Documents. (a) The Oversea Trade Statistics published herein have been derived from documents obtained under the Customs Act by the Department of Customs and Excise and compiled by the Commonwealth Bureau of Census and Statistics. They do not include certain items for which customs entries are not recorded. (See paragraph (v) of this note.) These documents are duplicate copies of export and import entries submitted by exporters and importers or their agents to the Department of Customs and Excise.

(b) Export entries show date and port of shipment, country of consignment and the description, quantity (where required) and value of the goods. The statistical item number is inserted and verified by officers of the Department of Customs and Excise, Canberra.

(c) Import entries show date and port of entry, country of origin, description of goods, quantity (where required), value of the goods and amount of duty paid thereon. The tariff number under which the goods are admitted and the statistical item number are inserted by the importer or his agent, and these are verified by Statistical Officers of the Department of Customs and Excise in the local offices of the Collectors of Customs. The value of imports as recorded is that laid down in the Customs Act, viz. the actual price paid by the importer, plus any special deduction, or the current domestic value in the exporting country, whichever is the higher, f.o.b. port of shipment. (See paragraph (v) of this note.)

(ii) Exports. (a) These are recorded statistically in the month in which the export entries are passed by the Department of Customs and Excise. Normally this is within a few days of shipment, but in the case of bullion and specie some entries may be delayed several months. Shipment of some major items is at times delayed by abnormal factors affecting sales, deliveries for export and the loading of ships. When such delays occur, exports are diminished (pro tanto) and when such delays are overtaken shipments include substantial quantities of accumulated stocks as well as current disposals.

(b) Wool shipments in any trade year may be materially affected by the time spread of wool auctions which normally end in July. The carry-over for shipments varies from year to year. New season's wheat normally becomes available for shipment from December onwards, and the quantity shipped in any trade year (ending June) depends on the size of the crop and the time spread of sales for export.

(c) Exports are recorded with destination "For Orders" when the country of consignment has not been determined at the time of export. Where exports "For Orders" are not shown separately in the tables of Section 3 Table 12 any such exports have been included with "Other Foreign Countries".

(iii) Imports are recorded statistically in the month in which import entries are passed by the Department of Customs and Excise. Normally this is within a few days of discharge of cargoes.

(iv) Coverage. Statistics shown herein include merchandise and bullion and specie unless otherwise specified. The value of outside packages for both exports and imports is included in all tables, being included under each item concerned for exports and as a separate item in Class XX of imports. Export figures relate to both Australian produce and re-exports, except in Section 3 Table 12, where exports of Australian produce only are shown. Exports of ships' stores and aircraft stores are excluded from overseas trade statistics, but are shown separately on page 22. For other excluded items see next paragraph.

(v) Balance of Trade. Oversea trade statistics are compiled from information recorded in customs documents. The excess of exports or imports in the recorded figures has to be adjusted for both valuation and coverage to provide estimates of the balance of trade which will be found in Statistical Bulletins on the "Balance of Payments". Imports are adjusted for the excess of recorded value for duty over the actual selling price to the importer. Recorded exports and imports of gold, government exports for armed forces and overseas projects, and certain other items are excluded; imports and exports of ships and aircraft for use on overseas routes, certain imports of defence equipment, exports of uranium and other trade items for which customs entries are not required are added.

(vi) Balance of Payments. Statistics relating to overseas trade only do not measure Australia's total balance of payments during the periods shown. Particulars of other transactions entering into the balance of payments, for example, transportation charges and investment income, are provided in the Statistical Bulletin "Balance of Payments : Quarterly Summary" issued by the Commonwealth Statistician.

I. SUMMARY OF OVERSEA TRADE

This Bulletin relates to the recorded overseas trade of Australia (see notes on page 2) for the month of September, 1963 and 1964 and three months ended September, 1963 and 1964.

Figures for 1964-65 are preliminary and are subject to revision

Imports of Merchandise in September, 1964 were valued at £A112,214,000 compared with £A89,030,000 in September, 1963, an increase of £A23,184,000.

Exports of Merchandise in September, 1964 were valued at £A99,400,000 compared with £A102,668,000 in September, 1963, a decrease of £A3,268,000.

Imports of Merchandise for the three months ended September, 1964 were valued at £A347,463,000 compared with £A284,944,000 for the three months ended September, 1963, an increase of £A62,519,000.

Exports of Merchandise for the three months ended September, 1964, were valued at £A306,587,000 compared with £A314,606,000 for the three months ended September, 1963, a decrease of £A8,019,000.

The table below shows the value of overseas trade in merchandise and in bullion and specie for the periods under review.

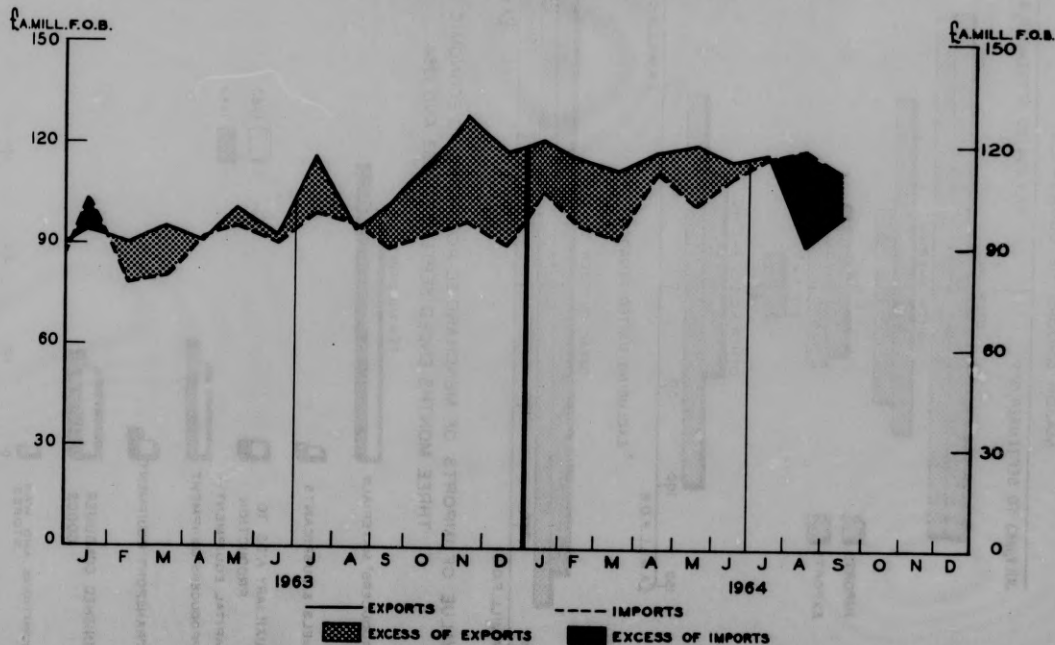

OVERSEA TRADE - MERCHANDISE: AUSTRALIA

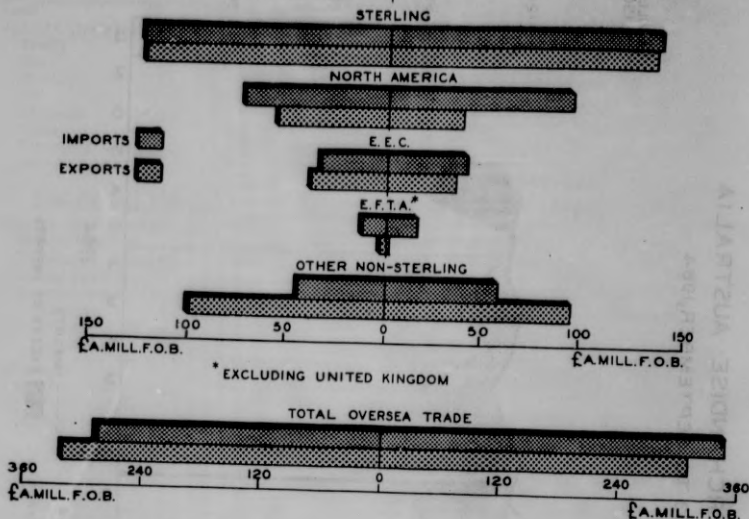
JANUARY, 1963 TO SEPTEMBER, 1964
