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INTRODUCTION

Regional Statistics, New South Wales contains the most recent principal statistics for statistical areas of the State: divisions, subdivisions, districts, local areas or, in some cases, other combinations of these statistical areas.

The bulletin contains State regional data in four tables. Tables 1 to 3 contain demographic and economic statistics for statistical areas based on the Australian Standard Geographical Classification (ASGC): Table 1 contains data for the statistical divisions and subdivisions of the State; Table 2 contains data for statistical local areas (each statistical division being shown separately, with its component statistical local areas arranged alphabetically); and Table 3 contains data for the complete statistical districts located on the border of N.S.W. and the adjoining State or Territory. Table 4 shows the labour status of the population, classified into statistical regions of the State. These labour force estimates are derived from the labour force survey component of the monthly population survey, which is conducted on a sample basis throughout Australia.

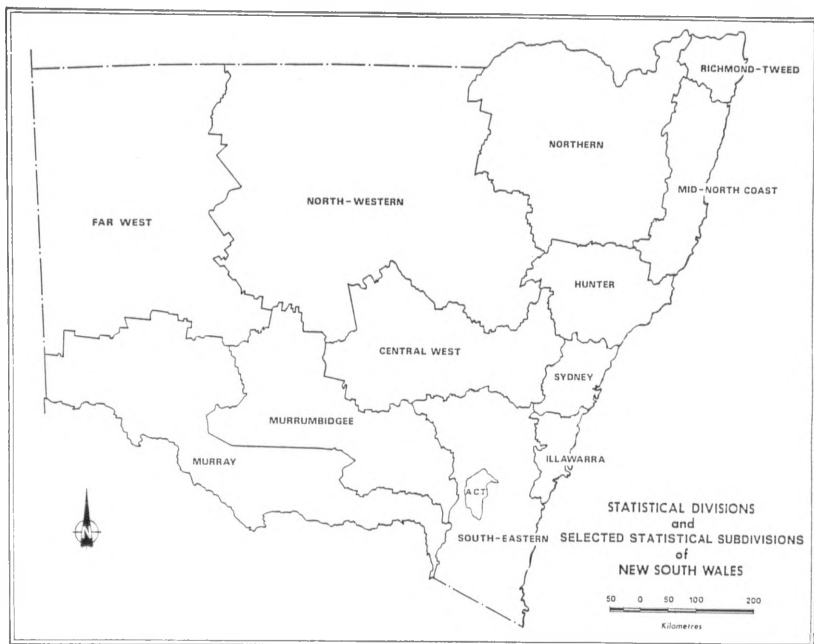

EXPLANATORY NOTES

I. STATISTICAL AREAS OF NEW SOUTH WALES

(a) Areas used for the publication of the principal series of official statistics in New South Wales consist of statistical divisions, statistical subdivisions, and (mainly for the presentation of population census data) statistical districts. This issue of *Regional Statistics, New South Wales* contains the area classification based on the Australian Standard Geographical Classification (ASGC) which was introduced in 1985 by the Australian Bureau of Statistics (ABS) for use in the collection, compilation and publication of its statistics by area. Appendix A shows the main structure of the ASGC. Definitions of these statistical areas are given below. Details of statistical areas prior to the introduction of the ASGC were described in earlier issues of this bulletin.

(b) *Statistical Divisions* (SD's) comprise the 12 primary divisions of the State and Off-shore and migratory. The primary divisions are intended to represent areas of the State which are characterised by discernible social and/or economic links between the inhabitants and economic units within them, under the unifying influence of one or more major cities or towns. The boundaries of the Divisions have accordingly been delineated on the basic criterion that the degree of economic and/or social contact and interaction within each Division should be maximised. It should be emphasised that the boundaries of the Divisions cannot be regarded as sharp lines of demarcation - they may, of necessity, be positioned within peripheral zones in which the influence of two or more 'focal' cities or towns overlap in varying degrees.

(c) In the case of Sydney and its environs, some additional factors were taken into account in drawing the divisional boundary. The *Sydney Statistical Division* is predominantly urban in character - and its present boundary was delineated in 1976 to embrace the area expected to contain the urban development of Sydney (and associated smaller urban centres) for a period of at least twenty years. This area is the same as that used by the Department of Environment and Planning in its 1988 publication *Sydney into its Third Century*, which describes the proposed planning and development strategy for the Sydney Region into the twenty first century.

(d) *Statistical Subdivisions* (SSD's) provide a second tier of statistical areas:

- i. Statistical subdivisions within Sydney Statistical Division were delineated in 1985 (fourteen subdivisions were created) on the criteria that the social and economic homogeneity should be maximised within each subdivision and that the population of each subdivision should be of sufficient size to support sample survey estimates.
- ii. Statistical subdivisions outside Sydney Statistical

Division are component areas within statistical divisions which have been delineated either on the basis of topographical and/or climatic features which reflect, inter alia, some degree of homogeneity of agricultural activity, or because they are predominantly urban in character.

(e) *Statistical Local Areas* (SLA's) in New South Wales comprise all legal local government areas (or splits thereof) together with the unincorporated part of the Far West Division, Lord Howe Island and Off-shore areas and migratory. They serve as the smallest spatial unit for the coding, compilation and publication of economic, social and demographic statistics (other than those collected in Population Censuses, for which the smallest unit is the census collection district). Legal local government areas (LGA's) are constituted under the (State) Local Government Act 1919, and comprise municipalities (M) (usually centres of population) and shires (S) (for the most part country areas embracing tracts of rural land as well as towns and villages). Under the Local Government Act, a municipality may be proclaimed as a city (C) if it has a distinct character and entity as a centre of population and has a population of at least 150,000 persons, or if it is an independent centre of population and has a population of at least 25,000 persons. An amendment to the Act in 1986 empowers the Governor-in-Council to proclaim a municipality as a city where it is in the interests of the residents of the municipality and the circumstances of the case render it proper to do so. At 30 June 1989 there were 63 municipalities, of which 31 had been proclaimed as cities, and 113 shires.

(f) *Statistical Districts* (S Dist.'s) have been delineated mainly for the purpose of the publication of Population Census statistics. They are areas which are predominantly urban in character and encompass an urban centre with a population of 25,000 or more and whose outer boundary does not correspond with that of a single legal local government area. They comprise one or more complete statistical subdivisions and have been delineated using concepts and criteria similar to those for the Sydney Statistical Division. Statistical districts in New South Wales consist of Newcastle (Newcastle SSD), Wollongong (Wollongong SSD), Bathurst-Orange (Bathurst-Orange SSD), the N.S.W./Vic. Statistical District of Albury-Wodonga (Albury SSD being the N.S.W. part), the N.S.W./Qld. Statistical District of Gold Coast-Tweed (Tweed Heads SSD being the N.S.W. part), and the N.S.W./A.C.T. Statistical District of Canberra-Queanbeyan (Queanbeyan SSD being the N.S.W. part).

(g) *Statistical Regions* (SR's) and *Major Statistical Regions* (MSR's) shown in this bulletin are used for the presentation of statistics from labour force surveys. In N.S.W. this Statistical Region structure equates with, or consists of aggregations of, statistical subdivisions and statistical divisions. Appendix B lists the relationship

between this Statistical Region structure and the main structure of ASGC (shown in Appendix A).

(h) Further information concerning statistical areas is contained in the publication *Australian Standard Geographical Classification* (Catalogue 1216.0). This publication, first issued in June 1985, is the main Australia-wide classification and coding scheme for use in classifying statistics by geographical areas.

2. AMALGAMATIONS AND BOUNDARY CHANGES TO LEGAL LOCAL GOVERNMENT AREAS

(a) Where amalgamations of legal local government areas have occurred, figures shown in this bulletin relate to the new areas formed by the amalgamations.

(b) Where boundary changes between legal local government areas have occurred, the figures shown for each legal local government area (or statistical area) generally relate to its boundaries as at the end of the year shown (usually 30 June). However,

- i. estimated resident population for 1986 and later years (items 2 to 9) have been adjusted for boundary changes that have occurred between 30 June 1986 and 30 June 1988 - all figures shown relate to the boundaries as defined at 30 June 1988 except for those at 30 June 1988 (item 10) which relates to boundaries as at 30 June 1986;
- ii. building approvals (items 14 to 32A) are allocated to the legal local government area in which the building was situated at the time of approval;
- iii. agricultural statistics relate to boundaries at 31 March 1988.

(c) All amalgamations and other boundary or name changes which have occurred since 30 June 1986 are shown in Appendix (C).

3. DEFINITIONS OF TERMS USED

Item
No.

Estimated Resident Population

Commencing with the 1981 Population Census, the Australian Bureau of Statistics introduced a new conceptual basis of population estimates - the *Estimated Resident Population*. Under this basis, population estimates are compiled according to the *place of usual residence* of the population. The previous system of estimating the number of persons at their *actual place of location* is no longer used as the basis of these estimates.

9,10 (a) The estimates for 30 June 1981 and 30 June 1986, representing the number of usual residents in the area, are based on census data (i.e. the census count at the actual location plus usual residents temporarily absent in other areas of Australia less visitors to the area from other areas in Australia or from overseas) and, in addition, include:

- i. an adjustment for census under-enumeration (see (b) below), and
- ii. an estimate of the number of usual residents who were temporarily overseas (i.e. for less than 12 months) at the time of the census (see (c) below).

(b) The Australian population census ranks high in world comparisons of accuracy, but some people are missed. In order to obtain a measure of the extent of this under-enumeration, a post-enumeration survey is undertaken as soon as possible after the census. This survey provides adjustment factors by sex and age, for both Sydney and the rest of State population, to allow for census under-enumeration.

(c) The Australian census does not attempt to enumerate residents temporarily overseas (i.e. for less than 12 months). Instead this component of the *estimated resident population* is estimated from the passenger cards which are filled in by all persons arriving in or departing from Australia. Information on these cards enables an estimate to be made of residents temporarily overseas at the time of the census according to the legal local government area of their usual residence.

2 (d) The preliminary estimates shown for 30 June 1988 are based on the estimated resident population at census date 1986 (see (a) above) and on available measures of population change since the census.

(e) *Average annual rate of change* in population during the intercensal period 1981 to 1986 has been calculated for *estimated resident population* on the basis of boundaries as defined at 30 June 1986; in some instances this has involved a measure of estimation where boundary changes have occurred.

Vital Statistics

12,13 *Births and Deaths* relate to all registrations of such events which occurred within Australia, irrespective of State of registration, where the usual residence was within New South Wales. Births are allocated to a statistical local area of the State according to the usual residence of the mother, and deaths are allocated according to the usual residence of the deceased (infant deaths are generally assigned to the usual residence of the mother).

Building Statistics

14-32 Statistics of *building work approved* are compiled from:

- (a) permits issued by local government authorities in areas subject to building control by those authorities;
- (b) contracts let or day labour work authorised by Commonwealth, State, and semi-government and local government authorities;
- (c) all approved new residential building jobs valued at \$5,000 or more (previously all new residential building jobs were included regardless of value);
- (d) approved alterations and additions to residential buildings valued at \$10,000 or more; and
- (c) all approved non-residential building jobs valued at \$30,000 or more (previously \$10,000 or more).

18-21 *Residential building*. A house is defined as a detached building predominantly used for long-term residential purposes and consisting of only one dwelling unit. *Other residential buildings* include flats (including home units) and semi-detached cottages, villa units, town houses and similar types of residential buildings. (Each flat in a group of flats and each home unit in a group of home units is counted as a separate dwelling unit.) Dwelling units that result from the conversion of existing building into flats are not included in the number of residential buildings but are included in the value of alterations and additions to residential buildings (item 21).

22-32 *Non-residential building* is classified according to its intended major function. Examples of the types of individual building jobs included under each main functional heading are shown in the following list:

- 23 *Hotels, etc.*: Includes motels, hostels, boarding house, guest houses, holiday apartment buildings.
- 24 *Shops*: Includes retail shops, restaurants, cafes, taverns, dry cleaners, laundromats, hair salons and shopping arcades.
- 25 *Factories*: Includes paper mills, oil refinery buildings, brickworks, foundries, power-houses, manufacturing laboratories, workshops as part of a manufacturing process.
- 26 *Offices*: Includes banks, post offices and council chambers, head and regional offices.
- 27 *Other business premises*: Includes warehouses,

storage depots, service stations, transport depots and terminals, electricity sub-station buildings, telephone exchanges, mail sorting centres, television stations and studios.

- 28 *Educational*: Includes schools, colleges, kindergartens, libraries, museums, art galleries, research and teaching laboratories, theological colleges.
- 29 *Religious*: Includes churches, chapels and temples.
- 30 *Health*: Includes hospitals, nursing homes, surgeries, clinics and medical centres.
- 31 *Entertainment and recreational*: Includes clubs, theatres, cinemas, public halls, gymnasiums, grandstands, squash courts and recreation centres.
- 32 *Miscellaneous*: Includes homes for the aged, law courts, orphanages, gaols, barracks, mine buildings, glass houses, livestock sheds, shearing sheds, fruit and skin drying sheds public toilets, and ambulance, fire and police stations.
- 32A *Other classes*: In addition to Miscellaneous (item 32), includes Hotels etc. (item 23), Other business premises (item 27), Religious (item 29), Health (item 30), and Entertainment and recreational (item 31).

Agricultural Activity

Agricultural statistics shown relate either to the 1987-88 season or are at 31 March 1988.

- 33, 34 An *establishment with agricultural activity* is a single physical location which is used for the production of crops (including fruit and vegetables) and/or for the raising of livestock and the production of livestock products. Where two or more locations are within the same statistical local area and are worked as one, they are regarded (for statistical purposes) as forming a single establishment. From 1987-88, an establishment with an estimated value of agricultural operations less than \$20,000 are excluded. Previously, those establishments with a value of operations less than \$2,500 were excluded.
- 36 The figures shown for *gross value of agricultural commodities* produced are estimates derived in the following manner:
 - (a) For each agricultural commodity produced in New South Wales, a value of production is estimated, for the State as a whole, by valuing the total recorded production at the average annual wholesale prices realised in the market place (in general, the market place is the metropolitan market). This value is then apportioned to the statistical local areas in the State according to the quantity of that commodity produced in the area (obtained in most cases from the Agricultural Census

and special supplementary collections). The gross value of agricultural commodities produced for an area is therefore the total of all commodity values which have been apportioned to that area.

(b) Except for certain crops grown in irrigation areas (grapes, most citrus fruits, or peaches), this method of estimation does not take account of differences in unit prices between regions. The estimation method also assumes that the whole of each commodity is sold in the market place. Bookkeeping activities are included in the estimates but the values are apportioned to a particular local government area purely on the basis of the postal address of the operator. Other agricultural activities may be undervalued because some specialist activities are not identified in the Agricultural Census (e.g. studs). For these reasons, the figures shown should be treated as providing only an indication rather than a precise measure of the value of agricultural commodities produced in an area.

- 48 *Cattle for meat production* comprise beef-breed bulls and bull calves used (or intended) for service; other cattle (cows, heifers, calves, steers, etc.) mainly for meat production; and house cows and heifers (one year and over).
- 49 *Cattle for milk production* comprise dairy-breed bulls and bull calves used (or intended) for service and cows, heifers, and heifer calves used (or intended) for the production of milk or cream for sale.

MANUFACTURING

A new collection strategy has been introduced for the Manufacturing Census involving a less detailed census in two years out of three with the first of these being conducted in 1987-88. A detailed census including expanded revenue and expense items, details of articles produced and materials used is now conducted triennially, the next being the 1989-90 reference year.

Manufacturing as specified in Division C of the *Australian Standard Industrial Classification (ASIC) 1983 Edition*, (Catalogue No. 1201.0) broadly relates to the physical or chemical transformation of materials or components into new products, whether the work is performed by power-driven machines or by hand.

The period covered by the Census is usually the twelve months ended 30 June. Where businesses find it impossible to supply information on this basis, a substitute accounting period is used.

- 55 *Establishments at end of June.* The number of establishments in operation at end of June relates to manufacturing establishments as such and does not

include separately located administrative offices and ancillary units.

- 56 *Employment* consists of working proprietors and employees on the payroll, including those at separately located administrative offices and ancillary units.
- 57 *Wages and salaries* of all employees of the establishment, including those working at separately located administrative offices and ancillary units. Drawings of working proprietors are excluded.
- 58 *Turnover* refers to sales (exclusive of excise and sales tax) of goods whether produced by the establishment or not, plus transfers out of goods to other establishments of the same enterprise, plus bounties and subsidies on production, plus all other operating revenue from outside the enterprise (such as commission revenue, repair and service revenue, rent, leasing and hiring revenue), plus capital work done for own use, or for rental or lease. Receipts from interest, royalties, dividends and the sale of fixed tangible assets are excluded.

Hotels, Motels, etc., With Facilities

- 59 *Tourist accommodation establishments* are defined as establishments which provide predominantly short-term accommodation (i.e. for periods of less than two months) available to the general public. The tourist accommodation establishments for which statistics are included in this publication are licensed hotels, motels, and guest houses which provide bath or shower and toilet in most guest rooms and have breakfast available for guests. The number of establishments and their capacity in June Quarter 1988 relate to establishments which operated at any time during the quarter or which were temporarily closed for that quarter for seasonal reasons. The room and bed occupancy rates and takings from accommodation relate to establishments which operated at any time during 1987-88.
- 60 *Guest rooms* refers to the maximum number of rooms, units, suites, etc. available for accommodating paying-guests at the establishments during the June Quarter 1988.
- 61 *Bed spaces* refers to the maximum number of beds available (excluding cots) to accommodate guests during the June Quarter 1988. Three-quarter beds are classified as single beds, and double beds are counted as two bed spaces.
- 62 *Room occupancy rate* refers to the proportion of guest rooms occupied to the number of guest rooms available during the year ended 30 June 1988, expressed as a percentage.
- 63 *Bed occupancy rate* refers to the proportion of bed

spaces occupied by guests to the number of bed spaces available during the year ended 30 June 1988, expressed as a percentage.

- 64 *Takings from accommodation* refers to revenue received from the provision of both short-term and long-term accommodation. Where meals and accommodation are a combined charge, an estimate of takings from meals has been excluded.

Municipalities and Shires - Ordinary Services

- 65-77 The figures shown in this publication provide a very brief summary of the financing of ordinary services on goods, services and land provided by municipalities and shires in the State. They have been prepared from council's annual statements of account for the year ended 31 December 1987. These data are compiled by means of a fully standardised and integrated system of legal local government finance statistics for Australia - the *Standardised Local Government Finance Statistics (SLGFS)* system. This system facilitates comparison between legal local government areas within States and also between States. Fully detailed SLGFS data for all legal local government areas in Australia are available from the Bureau on microfiche and on magnetic tape. A user's manual, *Standardised Local Government Finance Statistics* (Catalogue No. 1212.0), provides information regarding the availability of data, the definition of items used in SLGFS, and a detailed description of the purpose classification used in compiling SLGFS data. In addition, an annual bulletin, *Local Government Finance, New South Wales* (Catalogue No. 5502.1) is issued and presents the more important SLGFS data for each local government council in the State as well as giving time-series SLGFS data for the main State aggregates.

4. LABOUR FORCE STATUS OF THE CIVILIAN POPULATION

(a) Labour force estimates are derived from the *labour force survey* component of the monthly population survey, which is conducted on a sample basis throughout Australia. The survey is designed to produce reliable estimates on the labour force status of the civilian population aged 15 and over for Australia, the States and Territories, and for regions within States. The information is obtained from the occupants of selected dwellings by carefully chosen and specially trained interviewers. The interviews are generally conducted during the two weeks beginning on the Monday between the 6th and 12th of each month. The information obtained relates to the week before the interview (i.e. the reference week).

(b) *Survey sample*. The monthly population survey is based on a multi-stage area sample of private dwellings (houses, flats, etc.) and non-private dwellings (hotels, motels, etc.),

and covers slightly less than one-half of one per cent of the population of New South Wales.

(c) *Scope*. The labour force survey includes all persons aged 15 and over, except:

- i. members of the permanent defence forces;
- ii. certain diplomatic personnel of overseas governments, customarily excluded from census and estimated populations;
- iii. overseas residents in Australia; and
- iv. members of non-Australian defence forces (and their dependants) stationed in Australia.

(d) *Reference week*. The reference week is the seven day period preceeding the week in which interviews take place.

(e) *The Labour Force*. The labour force comprises all persons in scope of the survey who, during the reference week, were employed or unemployed as defined below.

(f) *Employed persons*.

- i. These comprise all civilians aged 15 and over who, during the reference week:
 - (i) worked for one hour or more for pay, profit, commission or payment in kind (including employees, employers and self-employed persons) in a job or business, or on a farm; or
 - (ii) worked for one hour or more without pay in a family business or on a farm (i.e. unpaid family helpers); or
 - (iii) were employees who had a job but were not at work and were: on paid leave; on leave without pay for less than four weeks up to the end of the reference week; stood down without pay because of bad weather or plant breakdown at their place of employment for less than four weeks up to the end of the reference week; on strike or locked out; on workers' compensation and expected to be returning to their job; or receiving wages or salary while undertaking full-time study; or
 - (iv) were employers, self-employed persons or unpaid family helpers who had a job, business or farm, but were not at work.
- ii. These employed persons can be classified into:
 - (i) *full-time workers* (i.e. those who usually worked 35 hours or more a week (in all jobs) and others who, although usually part-time workers, worked 35 hours or more during the reference week); and

- (ii) *part-time workers* (i.e. those who usually worked less than 35 hours a week and who did so during the reference week).
- (g) *Unemployed persons* are all those aged 15 and over who were not employed during the reference week, and:

- i. had actively looked for full-time or part-time work at any time in the four weeks up to the end of the reference week, and:
 - (i) were available for work in the reference week, or would have been available except for temporary illness (i.e. lasting for less than four weeks to the end of the reference week); or
 - (ii) were waiting to start a new job within four weeks from the end of the reference week and would have started in the reference week if the job had been available then; or
- ii. were waiting to be called back to a full-time or part-time job from which they had been stood down without pay for less than four weeks up to the end of the reference week (including the whole of the reference week) for reasons other than bad weather or plant breakdown.

(h) *Actively looking for work* includes writing, telephoning or applying in person to an employer for work; answering a newspaper advertisement for a job; checking factory or Commonwealth Employment Service notice-boards; being registered with the Commonwealth Employment Service; checking or registering with any other employment agency; advertising or tendering for work; and contacting friends or relatives.

(i) *Persons not in the labour force* are those who, during the reference week, were not in the categories "employed" or "unemployed", as defined above. They include persons who were keeping house (unpaid), retired, voluntarily inactive, permanently unable to work, persons in institutions (hospitals, gaols, sanatoria, etc.), boarding school pupils, trainee teachers, members of contemplative religious orders, and persons whose only activity during the reference week was jury service or unpaid voluntary work for a charitable organisation.

(j) *Reliability of the estimates.* Since the estimates presented in Table 4 are based on information obtained from occupants of a sample of dwellings, they and the movements derived from them may differ from the figures that would have been obtained if the information had been collected from occupants of all dwellings (using the same questionnaire and interviewing procedures). One measure of the likely difference is given by the *standard error*, which indicates the extent to which an estimate might have varied by chance because only a sample of dwellings was included in the survey. There are about two chances in three that a survey estimate is within one standard error of

the figure that would have been obtained if all dwellings had been included and about nineteen chances in twenty that it is within two standard errors. The standard error can also be expressed as a percentage of the estimate, and this is known as the *relative standard error*. For information about the standard errors which apply to these estimates, reference should be made to the Technical Note on Data Reliability appearing in *The Labour Force, New South Wales* (6201.1).

5. RELATED PUBLICATIONS

(a) Other ABS publications issued by the N.S.W. Office which contain data for regions of the State are listed in the *Catalogue of Small Area Statistics Australia 1987* (Catalogue 1108.0) which is available at \$17.50 from any ABS Office.

(b) All publications produced by the ABS are listed in the *Catalogue of Publications* (1101.0) which is available free of charge from any ABS Office.

(c) In some cases, the ABS can also make available information which is not published. This information may be made available in one or more of the following forms: microfiche, photocopy, data tape, floppy disk, computer printout, clerically-extracted tabulation. Generally, a charge is made for providing unpublished information. Inquiries should be made as shown in the Inquiries section at the front this publication.

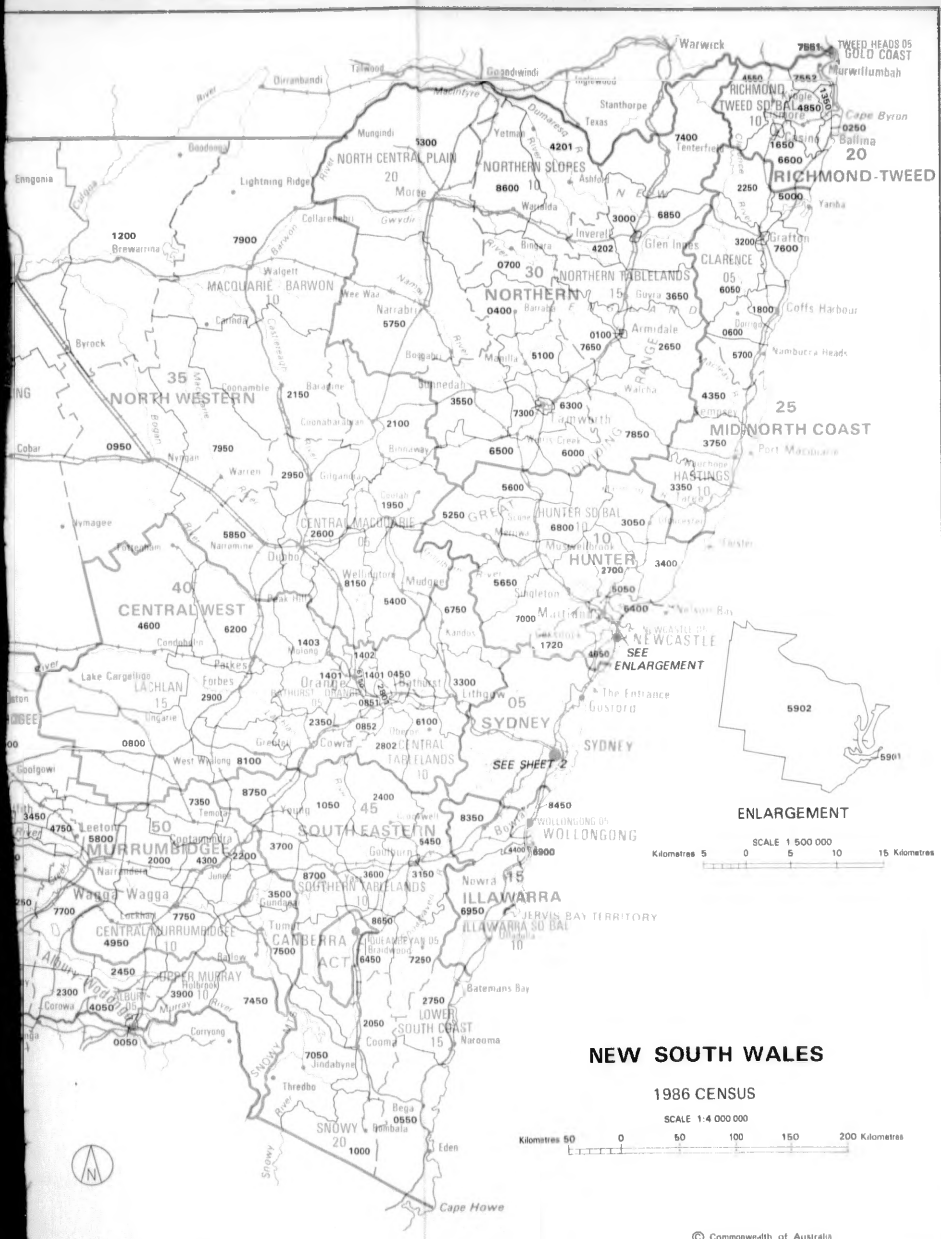
