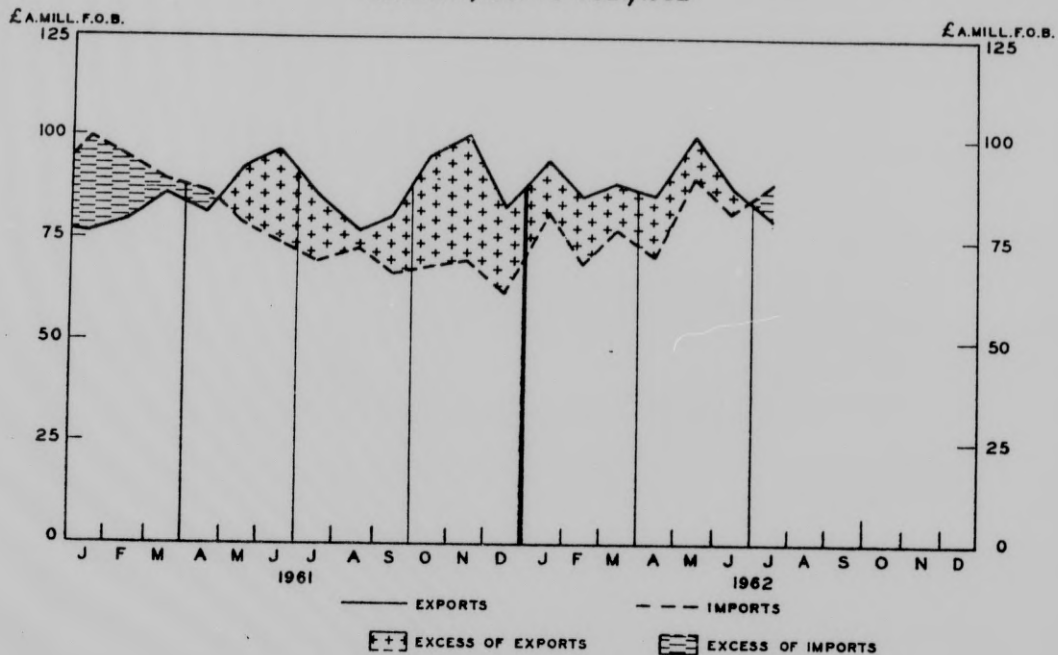

NOTE: - In this issue of the Monthly Bulletin of Oversea Trade Statistics a new table (Table No. 13, p.28) showing details of the quantities of principal items on which excise was paid has been included.

Other tables in the publication have been re-arranged to provide a better presentation of oversea trade statistics.

EXPLANATORY NOTES

(i) Basic Documents. (a) The Oversea Trade Statistics published herein have been derived from documents obtained under the Customs Act by the Department of Customs and Excise and compiled by the Commonwealth Bureau of Census and Statistics. They do not include certain items for which customs entries are not recorded. (See paragraph (v) of this note.) These documents are duplicate copies of export and import entries submitted by exporters and importers or their agents to the Department of Customs and Excise.

(b) Export entries show date and port of shipment, country of consignment and the description, quantity (where required) and value of the goods. The statistical item number is inserted and verified by officers of the Department of Customs and Excise, Canberra.

(c) Import entries show date and port of entry, country of origin, description of goods, quantity (where required), value of the goods and amount of duty paid thereon. The statistical item number is inserted by the importer or his agent, together with the tariff number under which the goods are admitted and these are verified by Statistical Officers of the Department of Customs and Excise in the local offices of the Collectors of Customs. The value of imports as recorded is that laid down in the Customs Act, viz. the actual price paid by the importer, plus any special deduction, or the current domestic value in the exporting country, whichever is the higher, f.o.b. port of shipment. (See paragraph (v) of this note.)

(ii) Exports. (a) These are recorded statistically in the month in which the export entries are passed by the Department of Customs and Excise. Normally this is within a few days of shipment, but in the case of bullion and specie some entries may be delayed several months. Shipment of some major items is at times delayed by abnormal factors affecting sales, deliveries for export and the loading of ships. When such delays occur, exports are diminished (pro tanto) and when such delays are overtaken shipments include substantial quantities of accumulated stock as well as current disposals.

(b) Wool shipments in any trade year may be materially affected by the time spread of wool auctions which normally end in July. The carry-over for shipments varies from year to year. New season's wheat normally becomes available for shipment from December onwards, and the quantity shipped in any trade year (ending June) depends on the size of the crop and the time spread of sales for export.

(c) Exports are recorded with destination "For Orders" when the country of consignment has not been determined at the time of export. Where exports "For Orders" are not shown separately in the tables of Section 3 Table 11 any such exports have been included with "Other Foreign Countries".

(iii) Imports are recorded statistically in the month in which import entries are passed by the Department of Customs and Excise. Normally this is within a few days of discharge of cargoes.

(iv) Coverage. Statistics shown herein include merchandise and bullion and specie unless otherwise specified. The value of outside packages for both exports and imports is included in all tables, being included under each item concerned for exports and as a separate item in Class XX of imports. Export figures relate to both Australian produce and re-exports, except in Section 3 Table 11, where exports of Australian produce are shown. Exports of ships' stores and aircraft stores are excluded from oversea trade statistics, but are shown separately on page 21. For other excluded items see next paragraph.

(v) Balance of Payments. Statistics relating to Oversea Trade only do not measure Australia's total balance of payments during the periods shown. Particulars of other transactions entering into the balance of payments, for example, freight charges and oversea travel, payments of dividends, profits and interest and Government expenditure overseas, are provided in the Statistical Bulletin "Balance of Payments: Quarterly Summary" issued by the Commonwealth Statistician. For items such as naval ships, merchant vessels trading overseas, aircraft for use on oversea routes, uranium, and certain materials for inter-governmental defence projects, no customs entries are recorded, but these transactions are taken into account in estimating balance of payments.

I. SUMMARY OF OVERSEA TRADE

This Bulletin relates to the recorded overseas trade of Australia (see notes on page 2) for the month of July, 1961 and 1962 and the years ended June, 1961 and 1962.

Figures for 1962-63 are preliminary and are subject to revision.

Imports of Merchandise in July, 1962 were valued at £A.89,036,000 compared with £A.69,763,000 in July, 1961, an increase of £A.19,273,000.

Exports of merchandise in July, 1962 were valued at £A.80,209,000 compared with £A.85,870,000 in July, 1961, a decrease of £A.5,661,000.

Imports of Merchandise for the year ended June, 1962 were valued at £A.882,603,000 compared with £A.1,085,331 for the year ended June, 1961, a decrease of £A.202,728,000.

Exports of Merchandise for the year ended June, 1962 were valued at £A.1,068,673,000 compared with £A.928,041,000 for the year ended June, 1961, an increase of £A.140,632,000.

The table below shows the value of overseas trade in merchandise and in bullion and specie for the periods under review.
