MANUFACTURING STATISTICS FOR NSW

The ABS will shortly release detailed statistics for 1987-88 for the New South Wales manufacturing sector in the publication *Manufacturing in New South Wales*, Catalogue No. 8207.1 (\$16.00). Information available includes:

- Detailed industry and employment size group data at the State level
- Statistical Division data at the ASIC subdivision (2 digit) level
- Turnover, employment, and wages/salaries data at the local government area level
- Data on prices, labour force and foreign trade statistics for the manufacturing sector

Summary statistics for NSW for 1987-88 have already been released in the publication *Manufacturing Census: Summary Statistics, New South Wales, 1987-88*, Catalogue No. 8206.1 (\$4.50)

EXPLANATORY NOTES

This publication contains monthly production statistics of selected commodities manufactured in New South Wales.

2. Data contained in this publication are based mainly on monthly collections conducted by the Australian Bureau of Statistics (ABS).

3. Figures for the latest month shown are preliminary. Figures for periods later than June 1986 are subject to revision.

Scope and coverage

4. Manufacturing commodity statistics collected by the ABS exclude details relating to single establishment manufacturing enterprises with fewer than four persons employed; and production of establishments predominantly engaged in non-manufacturing activities but which may carry on, in a minor way, some manufacturing.

5. In conjunction with the introduction of a new commodity classification (see paragraph 6 below) certain coverage checks were undertaken and adjustments made to the population, as appropriate. Particular care should therefore be taken in interpreting movements in data between June and July 1989.

Classification

6. Data from July 1989 has been compiled using a new commodity classification which is called the Australian Manufacturing Production Commodity Classification (AMPCC). The AMPCC has been developed by the ABS to provide a more up-to-date list of commodity items for the collection and publication of manufacturing commodity statistics. It takes account of Australian production patterns and recent changes in technology. Greater comparability of manufacturing production statistics with imports and exports statistics is also achieved. In most instances the new AMPCC items correspond directly to items in the classification used previously.

Sydney Statistical Division

7. New South Wales is divided into a number of geographical areas. The primary division of the State is into 12 statistical divisions. The Sydney Statistical Division is predominantly urban in character and its boundary was re-delineated in 1976 to embrace the area expected to contain the urban development of Sydney (and associated smaller urban centres) for a period of at least twenty years.

Seasonal adjustment

8. This publication contains seasonally adjusted statistics of several items. Care should be exercised in interpreting the figures for those months in which Christmas/New Year and Easter holidays fall, as some manufacturers vary holiday shutdowns in the light of prevailing demand for their products. Details of the methods used in seasonally adjusting these and other series are available on request.
