## MAIN FEATURES

The value of inward overseas cargo for the June quarter 1986 (\$8,239m) fell by \$170m, a decrease of 2.0% compared with the March quarter 1986 (\$8,409m) and the gross weight of this cargo fell from 5.0 m tonnes to 4.9m tonnes, a decrease of 2.7%. The major contributors to the decrease were in value terms: petroleum (\$140m), apparel etc. (\$87m) and special transactions etc. (\$149m), while machinery etc. increased by \$103m.

The value of outward overseas cargo for the June quarter 1986 (\$7,968m) increased by \$209m, an increase of 2.7% compared with the March quarter 1986 (\$7,759m) while the gross weight of this cargo fell from 61.1m tonnes to 58.7m tonnes, a decrease of 3.8%. The major contributors to the increase were in value terms: sugar (\$79m), metalliferous ores etc. (\$155m), special transactions, etc. (\$136m) and gold (\$181m) while decreases were recorded for cereals (\$254m), petroleum (\$217m) and coal (\$128m).

The majority of inward sea cargo in value terms came from the trade areas of Japan and North Asia (29%), Europe-Atlantic (22%), North America-West Coast (10%) and North America-East Coast (9%).

The majority of outward sea cargo in value terms went to the trade areas of Japan and North Asia (33%), East Asia (11%) and Europe-Atlantic (11%).

## EXPLANATORY NOTES

### Introduction

This publication contains quarterly statistics of inward and outward shipping and air cargo commodity movements at Australian ports.

### Sources of data

2. The statistics have been compiled by the Australian Bureau of Statistics (ABS) from information contained in import and export documents submitted by importers and exporters or their agents to the Australian Customs Service as required by the Customs Act 1901.

3. In some tables data from import and export documents have been linked with information from Lloyd's Register of Shipping to produce cargo statistics classified by selected shipping characteristics. Table 6, for example, shows inward cargo by ship type. In other tables the data have been linked to type of service (liner/conference) information received from the Department of Transport (e.g. Table 8).

### Scope of the statistics

4. Inward cargo statistics relate to cargo loaded overseas, discharged from ships and aircraft at Australian ports and in respect of which Customs import documents have been received by the ABS.

5. Similarly, outward cargo statistics relate to cargo loaded on ships and aircraft at Australian ports for discharge at overseas ports and in respect of which export documents have been received by the ABS.

6. The statistics include cargo shipped by sea and air on behalf of both the private and government sectors and include Australian produce and re-exports of foreign produce.

7. The following shipments are excluded from the statistics:

- (a) goods imported and exported by parcel post;
- (b) direct transit trade i.e. goods being trans-shipped or moved through Australia for purposes of transport only;
- (c) migrants' and passengers' effects, for which Customs documents are not required;
- (d) certain materials under inter-governmental agreements for defence and similar projects for which Customs documents are not required;
- (e) ships and aircraft entering and departing Australia under their own power;
- (f) to the extent that they can be identified, ships and aircraft purchased for use on overseas routes and any subsequent sales made of such ships and aircraft;
- (g) fish and other sea products landed in Australia and abroad directly from the high seas by Australian ships (such products landed in Australia directly from the high seas by foreign ships are included);
- (h) ships' and aircraft stores; and
- (i) export consignments where the value of the goods in each transaction is less than \$250, and import entries lodged on informal clearance documents for values not exceeding \$250.

### Statistical period

8. Although both foreign trade statistics and Shipping and Air cargo Commodity Statistics (SACCS) are compiled from the same source, imports and exports are recorded statistically in the month in which relevant documents are finalised by Customs and passed to the ABS for further processing, whereas SACCS are compiled according to the reported date of loading and discharge in Australia. For this reason SACCS and foreign trade statistics are not directly comparable.

### Coverage

9. Quarterly SACCS relate to cargo loaded/discharged in the quarter and are derived from Customs documents received by the ABS up to the time of compilation. Where late lodgement of Customs documents occurs, preliminary quarterly statistics will understate actual cargo movements.

10. Normally, statistics of the current quarter will include relevant records received by the ABS up until at least a month after the end of the quarter. On average, the current quarter will include:

- (a) 98 per cent by value of actual inward cargo; and
- (b) 96 per cent by value of actual outward cargo.

Close to full coverage is achieved subsequently and final statistics for each quarter of the financial year are published in the September quarter issue of this publication, which also contains final annual data.

#### Valuation

11. The recorded value of inward cargo is the free on board (f.o.b.) equivalent of the price when the sale is conducted under open market conditions. The recorded value also includes the value of the outside package, other than international containers used for containerised cargo. As additional factors are also considered in arriving at the transaction value of goods for customs purposes, the f.o.b. value may not always be the same as the customs value.

12. For outward cargo, goods actually sold to overseas buyers prior to shipment are valued at the free on board (f.o.b.) equivalent of the actual price paid to the exporter. Goods shipped on consignment are valued at the f.o.b. equivalent of the price that would have been paid to the exporter had he actually sold the goods to an importer in their country of final destination.

#### Gross weight

13. Gross weight is the total weight of cargo, irrespective of the basis on which freight is charged. It includes the weight of moisture content, wrappings, crates, boxes and containers (other than standard international containers used for containerised cargo).

14. Gross weight is not available by commodity for inward cargo.

#### Ship type (for sea cargo)

15. Each ship is classified to one of 11 ship types from information available in the Lloyd's Register of Shipping. The 11 ship types take account of physical structure and design. For the purposes of tables in this publication, these ship types are amalgamated into 4 broad categories as follows:

- (a) General cargo ships—
  - Container ships
  - Conventional cargo ships
  - Roll on-Roll off ships
  - Other cargo ships
- (b) Tankers—
  - Gas carriers
  - Liquid tankers
- (c) Bulk carriers—
  - Dry bulk ships
  - Dry/wet bulk ships

- (d) Other ships—
  - Multi-purpose ships
  - Passenger ships
  - Other ships

16. It should be noted that this classification was implemented with the June quarter 1983 publication. Although the difference between the new and old classifications is not great, care should be taken when comparing statistics for earlier periods with those released in the June 1983 and subsequent quarterly publications. Annual figures reflect the classification in use at the time final statistics were produced.

#### Type of service (for sea cargo)

17. Ships are also classified according to the type of service they provide. The two types of service for which statistics are shown in this publication are:

- (a) Liner service, which relates specifically to a ship operated by a carrier providing services on a specified route on a relatively regular basis; and
- (b) Other service, which refers to all ships operating in other than a liner service.

18. Liner service is further broken down into Conference and Non-conference. A 'Conference' is an association of shipowners which regulates the freight rates and terms and conditions of carriage of goods in any particular trade. Conference agreements exist only in respect of liner services and normally include provisions for sharing the trade, rationalising sailing schedules, and pooling arrangements for resources and/or revenue.

19. The type of service classification of each ship is advised to the ABS by the Department of Transport.

#### Classification of commodities

20. Commodity statistics in this publication are classified according to the Australian Transport Freight Commodity Classification (ATFCC). The ATFCC is the Australian standard for classifying goods transported by any of the transport modes (sea, rail, road and air) to and from Australia and within Australia. Full details of the ATFCC are included in the publication *Australian Transport Freight Commodity Classification and Interim Australian Pack Classification* (1210.0).

21. In the ATFCC, commodities are defined in terms of one or more categories of the Standard International Trade Classification (SITC) or dissections of SITC categories embodied in the Australian Import Commodity Classification (AICC) or the Australian Export Commodity Classification (AECC).

22. The ATFCC lists 312 Commodity Items identified by four digit codes. These items are allocated to 136 Commodity Groups (three digit) which are in turn allocated to 55 Commodity Divisions (two digit) and 10 Sections (one digit). Commodity statistics in this publication are at the Commodity Division level in tables 3.4, 12 and 13, and at the Section level in tables 8 and 9.

23. Users of commodity statistics should note that the content of particular ATFCC commodity statistics may be affected by the treatment of commodity data regarded as confidential. A full explanation and details of affected commodities are provided in Appendix 1.

#### Port of discharge/port of loading/state of origin

##### *Inward cargo*

24. The port of discharge is the Australian port at which the cargo is unloaded from the ship or aircraft.

25. The port of loading is the overseas port at which the cargo is loaded onto the ship or aircraft. This port is not necessarily in the country of origin of the goods.

##### *Outward cargo*

26. The port of discharge is the overseas port at which the cargo is unloaded from the ship or aircraft. This port of discharge is not necessarily in the country of final destination of the cargo as subsequent trans-shipments are not taken into account. For example, cargo with a final destination of Germany may be unloaded at Rotterdam.

27. The port of loading is the Australian port at which the cargo is loaded onto the ship or aircraft. This port of loading is not necessarily in the State of origin. The State of origin is defined as the State in which the final stage of production or manufacture occurred.

##### *Trade area*

28. Ports at which ships load or discharge cargo are allocated to their respective countries, which are in turn allocated to trade areas in accordance with the Classification of Trade Areas for Cargo Statistics included as Appendix 2. For example, Santiago is allocated to Chile which is included in the trade area 'South America-West Coast' for the purpose of this publication.

29. It should be noted that the trade area classification was revised in the December quarter 1984 publication. Care should therefore be taken when comparing trade area information published in earlier issues with that published using the revised classification.

#### Treatment of confidential data

30. If a person or organisation considers that the publication of SACCS data would be likely to enable identification of their operations, then written notification should be supplied to the ABS by that person or a responsible officer of the organisation, detailing the data in question, the manner in which publication would be likely to enable identification and the type of data restriction required. Particular attention should be paid to the different treatment of confidentiality restrictions in respect of 1984-85 data. More information and details of restrictions to date are shown in Appendix 1.

31. In order to maintain the confidentiality of shipping movements between certain ports, restrictions are also applied to the release of statistics relating to certain Australian port to overseas port routes. In such circumstances, statistics are released only as aggregates for combined port groups. (More details are shown in Appendix 1c).

32. Further information regarding the treatment of confidential data is contained in the ABS information paper *Confidentiality and the Release of Foreign Trade and Shipping Statistics* (5486.0).

#### More detailed statistics

33. More detailed shipping and air cargo commodity statistics are available from tabulations on microfiche. These tabulations are described in the ABS information paper *Foreign Trade and Shipping Statistics: Microfiche Service* (5483.0).

34. Shipping and air cargo commodity aggregates are also available on magnetic tape for users wishing to undertake their own analyses. Details of that service are contained in the ABS information paper *Foreign Trade and Shipping Statistics: Magnetic Tape Service* (5484.0).

35. Import and export statistics are also available from the ABS with mode of transport dissections for users who require transport oriented commodity information in finer detail than provided under the Australian Transport Freight Commodity Classification.

#### Other related data

36. The ABS also collects shipping and cargo information direct from shipping companies. This collection does not include any commodity data but does provide comprehensive details on ship and cargo movements in terms of ship type, ship usage, ship flag, overseas and Australian ports and cargo pack type (container/other). These statistics are released in a quarterly publication *Shipping and Cargo, Australia* (9211.0). Further information regarding statistics from this collection and SACCs data is contained in the ABS information paper *Overseas Shipping and Air Cargo: An Overview* (9252.0).

37. Current publications produced by the ABS are listed in the *Catalogue of Publications, Australia* (1101.0). The ABS also issues, on Tuesdays and Fridays, a *Publications Advice* (1105.0) which lists publications to be released in the next few days. The Catalogue and Publications Advice are available from any ABS office.

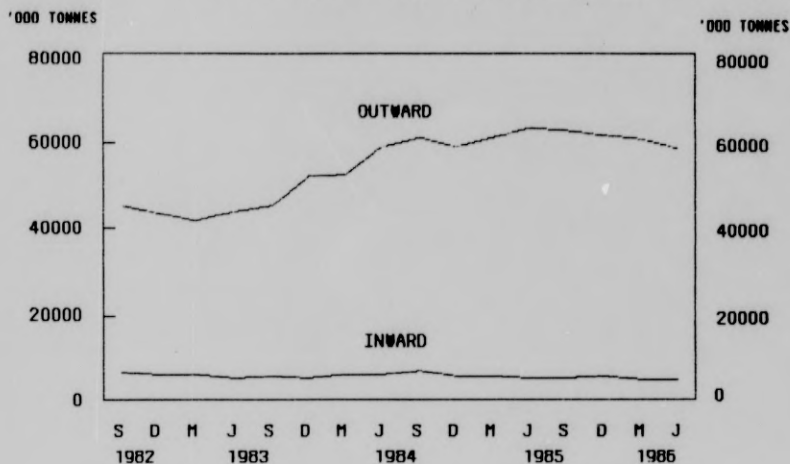

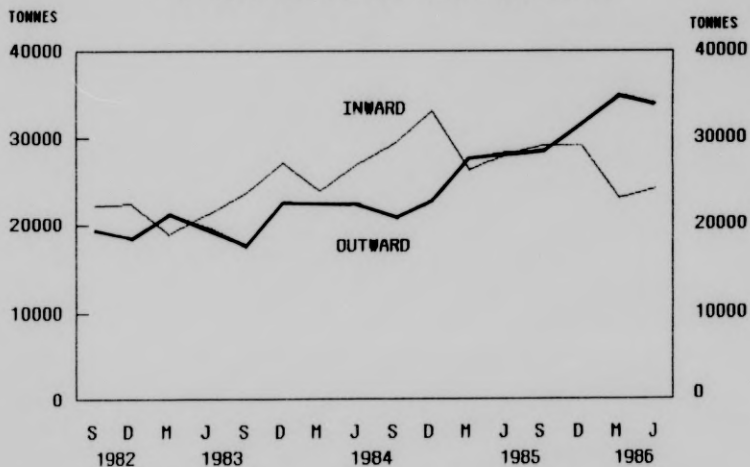

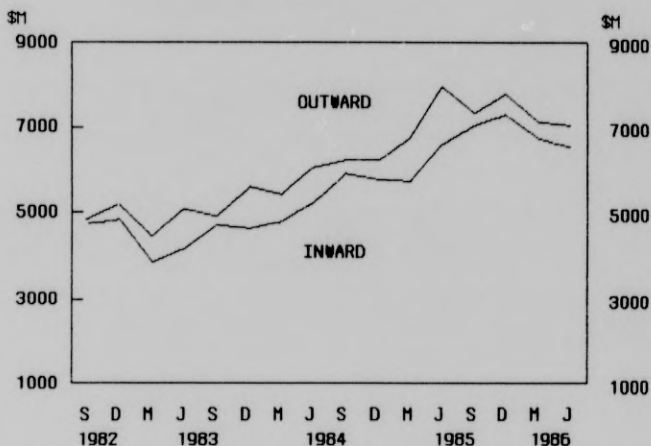
GRAPH 1. INWARD AND OUTWARD OVERSEAS SEA CARGO - GROSS WEIGHT  
SEPTEMBER QUARTER 1982 TO JUNE QUARTER 1986



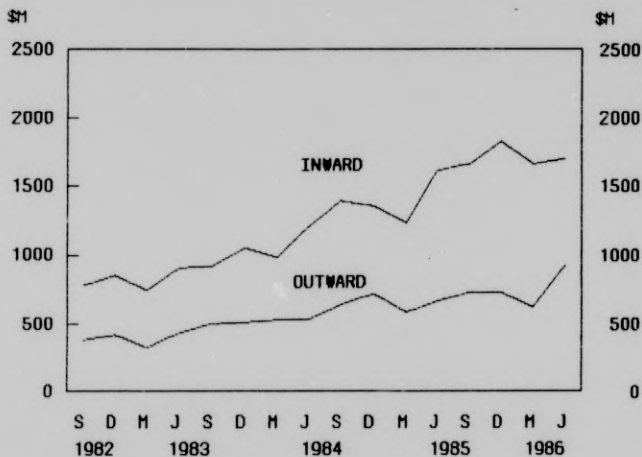
GRAPH 2. INWARD AND OUTWARD OVERSEAS AIR CARGO - GROSS WEIGHT  
SEPTEMBER QUARTER 1982 TO JUNE QUARTER 1986



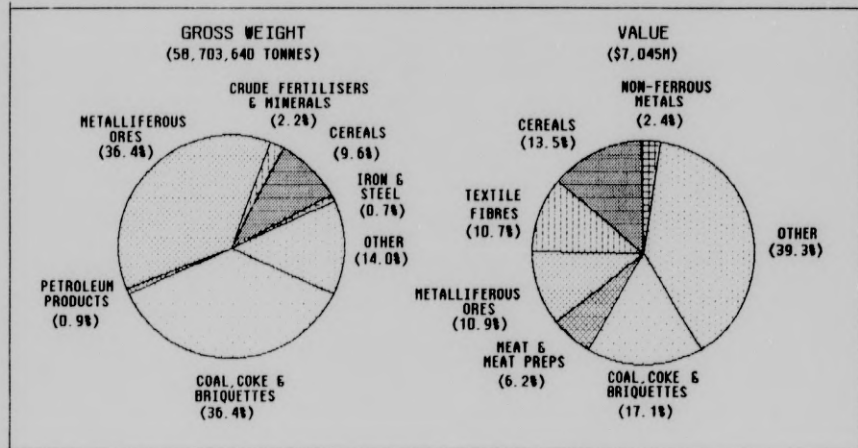
GRAPH 3. INWARD AND OUTWARD OVERSEAS SEA CARGO - VALUE  
SEPTEMBER QUARTER 1982 TO JUNE QUARTER 1986



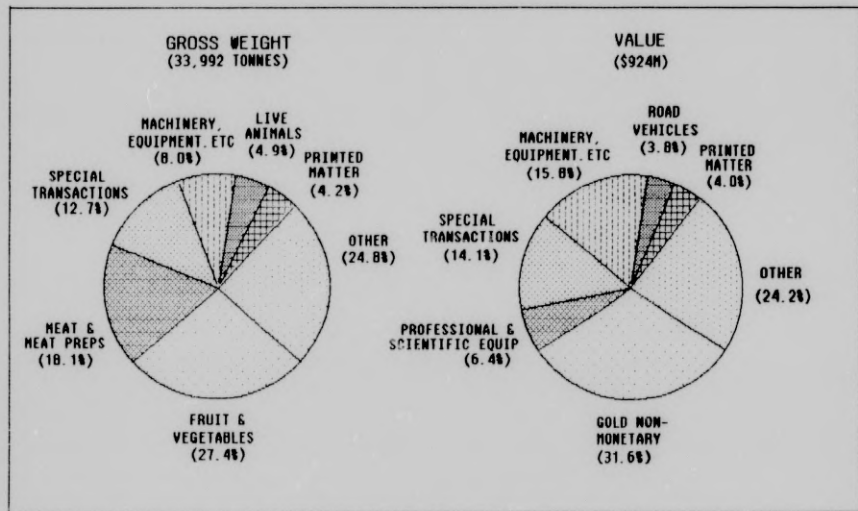
GRAPH 4. INWARD AND OUTWARD OVERSEAS AIR CARGO - VALUE  
SEPTEMBER QUARTER 1982 TO JUNE QUARTER 1986



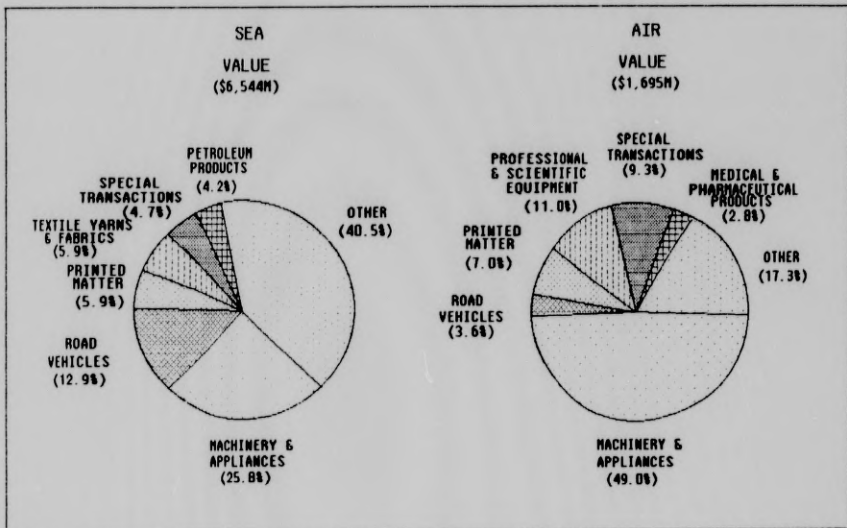
GRAPH 5. OUTWARD OVERSEAS SEA CARGO BY COMMODITY (ATFCC DIV)

JUNE QUARTER 1986



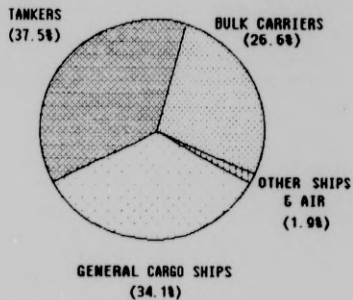
GRAPH 7. INWARD OVERSEAS CARGO BY COMMODITY (ATFCC DIV) BY MODE OF TRANSPORT  
JUNE QUARTER 1986



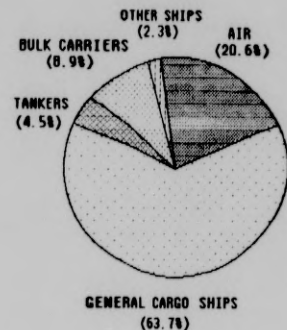
GRAPH 8. INWARD AND OUTWARD OVERSEAS CARGO BY MODE OF TRANSPORT

(4,888,861 TONNES)

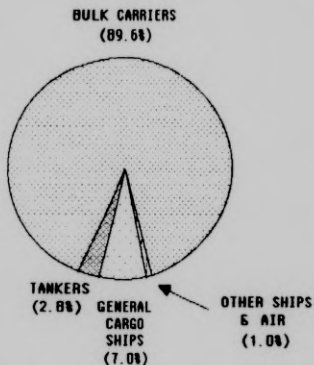


VALUE

(\$7,968M)

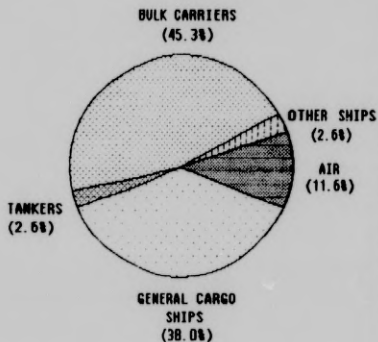

## APPENDIX 1

### Confidential commodity items

Imports and exports of commodities classified according to the Australian Import Commodity Classification (AICC) and Australian Export Commodity Classification (AECC) are recoded to the Australian Transport Freight Commodity Classification (ATFCC) for the purpose of producing SACCS.

Some AICC and AECC items are classed as confidential in trade publications (see paragraph 31 of the Explanatory Notes at the front of this publication) and to ensure that such information is not disclosed in SACCS these commodities have been included in the special item 9999 — 'Commodity not available for publication'. Lists of relevant AICC and AECC items and affected ATFCC items are provided in Appendix 1A and 1B.

When an AICC or AECC item becomes confidential it is recoded from its normal ATFCC item to the special item

9999. Prior to 1984-85 data, where a confidentiality restriction was placed on a SACCS item, both the current and previous quarters' statistics were adjusted. This was the case even though the previous quarter's data were not affected by the restriction when data for that quarter were first released (as preliminary statistics). However, for 1984-85, statistics for each quarter have been recompiled in order to reflect amendments made subsequently to quarters previously published. As a result, confidentiality restrictions have been applied to the data for each quarter of 1984-85, even though a particular restriction may have only been applicable to data for any one or more of the component quarters.

Those aspects should be considered when interpreting the date of effect listed in the following pages and when interpreting data for the same quarter in different publications (or other output).
