

STATES: SOCIAL SERVICES RECEIPTS AND EXPENDITURE - 1959-60

1. The attached statements which are prepared for the Commonwealth Grants Commission show particulars of the receipts and expenditure of certain funds of the State Governments on (1) Education, (2) Health, Hospitals and Charities, and (3) Law, Order and Public Safety during the year 1959-60. They include, the receipts and expenditure of the Consolidated Revenue Funds, and, in addition, expenditure from the following Trust or Special Funds - Hospital Fund, Opera House Account, Maintenance and Repair to Schools and Police Buildings Account and Joint Coal Board Welfare Fund, (New South Wales); Hospitals and Charities Fund, Mental Hospitals Fund, Youth Organisations Assistance Fund and Municipalities Assistance Fund, and Forestry Fund, (Victoria); Hospital, Motherhood and Child Welfare Fund, and Prisons Department Special Standing Fund, (Queensland); Lotteries Commission and Hospital Fund, (Western Australia).
2. The statements exclude (i) Loan Fund expenditure; and, in so far as it is possible to detect these items from examination of the public accounts - (ii) expenditure on debt charges, payroll tax and superannuation payments, (iii) expenditure on unemployment, bush fire, flood etc. relief, and restoration of flood damage, (iv) expenditure on aborigines, and (v) expenditure on certain items which have been excluded because information cannot be obtained from the accounts of all States or because they do not come within the present classifications. Expenditure on housing, workers' compensation (except as an item in departmental expenditure), and inspection of machinery, for instance, is not included.
3. Commonwealth payments (e.g. Hospital and Tuberculosis Benefits, Assistance to Universities, etc.) have been excluded from receipts and where these have been paid to funds included in the statement, the amount received has been deducted from expenditure.
4. The detailed statements have been examined by the several State Statisticians who are in general agreement as to the items included.
5. Because of differences in organisation and accounting methods, the information shown for some classes is not on exactly the same basis for all States and comparisons of States' expenditure are therefore approximate only. For example, in some cases it has not been possible to dissect education expenditure into (i) Administration and General, (iii) Training of Teachers, (iv) Primary and (v) Secondary, and it has been necessary to estimate the dissection. A further point in this respect is that the meaning of "Primary" and "Secondary" varies from State to State. In addition, the information shown for the above sub-classes includes expenditure which, if details were available, would be included in the item "Deaf, Dumb and Blind", and thus the information shown for this item is in itself incomplete. The same applies, but to a lesser degree, with Class 2: Health, Hospitals and Charities, and Class 3: Law, Order and Public Safety.
6. Generally, receipts cannot be dissected in the same detail as the items of expenditure and, in some cases, they have been included in one class, although relating to several classes. Further, owing to different organisation and accounting methods in the States, they are not directly comparable. Even within a State the receipts in one class are often not comparable with the receipts in another class. In Victoria, for example, receipts to revenue have been deducted from Gross Expenditure in classes 1 (a)-Education Department and Schools, and 1 (c) - Technical Education, whereas in the other classes this item is included with receipts.
7. A proportion of the expenditure included in the statement is in the form of grants to public authority and other bodies (e.g. Universities, Hospitals, etc.). In cases where these grants include specific amounts to meet expenditure on any of the items listed in paragraph 2 (debt charges, etc.) such amounts are excluded. In other cases, although the bodies concerned may use the grants for expenditure of a similar nature, the grants are included in their entirety, insufficient information being available in the public accounts to make adjustments on this account.

The following notes have particular reference to the respective States:-

New South Wales

The subsidy to the Commissioner of Government Transport in respect of travelling concessions to children, students and pensioners has been allocated to classes 1 (a) (ii) Transportation of Schoolchildren and Students, 2 (a) (i) Relief of Aged etc. and 2 (d) (ii) Child Welfare.

Expenditure from the Hospital Fund during 1959-60 out of moneys received from Consolidated Revenue Fund and under the Gaming and Betting (Poker Machines) Act 1956, amounted to £17,695,323 (after deducting receipts from the Commonwealth and payments on debt charges net out of these moneys by the Hospitals Commission). The amount paid from Consolidated Revenue Fund (excluding Commonwealth moneys and debt charges) was £17,203,728 and the amount received under the Gaming and Betting (Poker Machines) Act 1956 was £1,139,427. The balance of moneys from these two sources in the fund at 30th June, 1960 was £1,102,818 compared with £622,000 at 30th June, 1959.

Expenditure from the Opera House Account has been included to the extent of £403,000. In arriving at this figure it has been assumed that expenditure from the account has been met successively from (1) Private subscriptions (2) Interest (3) Contributions from C.R.F. and (4) Proceeds of Opera House Lotteries.

The New South Wales Government, under an agreement with the Commonwealth, meets half the expenditure, (up to £70,000 per annum) of the Welfare Fund of the Joint Coal Board. In 1959-60 expenditure from this Fund amounted to £111,000. This included £72,000 spent directly on Social Services, and £39,000 other expenditure. New South Wales contributed £60,000 towards this expenditure and one half of the expenditure from this Fund on Social Services (£36,000) has been included in the appropriate classes.

As in 1958-59 the amount paid by the Road Transport and Traffic and State Transport Co-ordination Funds for police supervision and control of traffic has been included in the receipts of class 3(b) - Police.

Expenditure of £170,000 from Maintenance and Repairs to Schools and Police Buildings Account has been included under Class 1(a) (iv) Primary Education (£53,000), Class 1 (a) (v) Secondary Education (£40,000) and Class 3(b) Police (£77,000). The balance in the fund at 30th June, 1960 was £605,000 compared with £400,000 at 30th June, 1959.

Victoria

Expenditure of £51,000 from the Youth Organisations Assistance Fund has been included in Class 2(d) (ii) Child Welfare. The balance of C.R.F. contributions remaining in the Fund at 30th June, 1960 was nil compared with £1,000 at 30th June, 1959.

Grants to hospitals and charities from the Hospitals and Charities Fund amounted to £12,799,000. To provide these grants the Hospitals and Charities Fund received from the Consolidated Revenue Fund £9,662,000, totalinater receipts £284,000, and Tattersall Consultations receipts £2,539,000. The balance remaining in the Fund at 30th June, 1960 was £287,081 compared with £1,024 at 30th June, 1959.

Grants from the Mental Hospitals Fund amounted to £200,000 during 1959-60. The Fund received £427,000 during the year from duty paid by Tattersall Consultations. The balance in the Fund at 30th June, 1960 was £263,000 compared with £37,000 at the same date in 1959.

An amount of £182,000 contributed to the Country Fire Authority from the Municipalities Assistance Fund during 1959-60 has been included in class 3(d) Public Safety.

A grant of £3,750 from the Forestry Fund to the University Chair of Forestry has been included in Class 1(b) - University.

Queensland

The excess of receipts over expenditure (excluding transfers to or from Consolidated Revenue Fund) of the Prisons Department Special Standing Fund has been included in the statement.

Net expenditure from the Hospital, Motherhood and Child Welfare Fund (mainly provided from the profits of the Golden Casket Art Unions) amounted to £1,583,000. Revenue of this Fund included £1,582,000 profits from the Golden Casket Art Unions. The balance of the Fund at 30th June, 1960 was nil.

In order to calculate pay roll tax payments, it has been necessary to reduce expenditure in most sections by the estimated amount of pay roll tax (i.e. $\frac{1}{2}$ per cent. of salaries and wages).

South Australia

Expenditure on salaries and expenses of Agricultural and Horticultural Cadets has been omitted from the statement.

Western Australia

The net expenditure of the Hospital Fund in 1959-60 amounted to £4,265,077 and the balance in the Fund at the 30th June, 1960 was nil. Donations from the Lotteries Commission to hospitals, charitable institutions etc. totalling £298,000 have been included in the appropriate sub-divisions.

Tasmania

From the information in the Treasurer's Statement it is not possible to dissect expenditure on Education Department and Schools (Class (a)), to the headings (i) Administrative and General, (iii) Training of Teachers, (iv) Primary, and (v) Secondary. The total expenditure relating to these sub-classes has been subdivided in the same proportions as the expenditure by the Education Department in 1959-60.
