AUSTRALIAN OVERSEA TRADE - DECEMBER, 1934.

The monthly summary of Oversea Imports and Exports for December, 1934, has been made available by the Commonwealth Statistician (Mr. E. T. McPhee).

THE TRADE POSITION. Imports of Merchandise (in British currency) were £stg.5,673,000 in December, 1934, as compared with £stg.6,346,000 in November. Exports of Merchandise (in British currency) were £stg.8,515,000, compared with £stg.7,903,000 in the previous month.

Compared with the corresponding month (December) of 1933, Imports of Merchandise in December, 1934, were 27 per cent. higher. The imports for the two months were respectively £stg.4,462,000 and £stg.5,673,000. Exports of Merchandise in December, 1933, were £stg.10,335,000, compared with £stg.8,515,000, a reduction of 18 per cent.

Total Imports including bullion and specie were £stg.5,855,000 in December, 1934, £stg.6,401,000 in November, 1934, and £stg.4,547,000 in December, 1933.

Total Exports (values in British currency) were £stg.9,392,000 in December, 1934, £stg.8,666,000 in November, 1934, and £stg.11,038,000 in December, 1933.

Imports of Bullion and Specie for the three months stated were respectively £stg.182,000, £stg.55,000, and £stg.85,000, while Exports of Bullion and Specie were £stg.877,000, £stg.763,000, and £stg.703,000.

BALANCE OF TRADE. In the following table the balance of Oversea Trade is estimated in British currency for December, 1934, and for the six months of the Trade year 1934-35. The figures for the corresponding periods of the previous year are included also for the purpose of comparison.

For the month of December, 1934, a favourable commodity balance of £stg.2,842,000 resulted, compared with a favourable balance of £stg.5,873,000 in December, 1933. Including bullion and specie, the favourable balance for December, 1934, amounted to £stg.3,537,000 compared with a favourable balance of £stg.6,491,000 for the previous December.

For the six months ended December, 1934, the commodity balance was favourable to the extent of £stg.1,164,000, compared with a favourable balance of £stg.20,178,000 for the corresponding period of 1933. Taking bullion and specie into account, the total favourable balance for the six months of 1934-35 was £stg.4,780,000 as against a favourable balance of £stg.23,727,000 for the six months of 1933-34.

(a) December, 1934, and December, 1933. Valued in Australian currency Exports of Merchandise in December, 1934, were £A.10,665,000, and in December, 1933 £A.12,945,000. Exports of Bullion and specie in the same months were respectively £A.1,097,000 and £A.878,000. The total exports amounted to £A.11,762,000 in December, 1934, compared with £A.13,823,000 in the previous December, a decrease of 15 per cent.

Bullion and specie shipped abroad in the two periods amounted to £A.4,489,000 and £A.4,166,000.

(c) Quantities. The principal commodities that were exported in greater quantities in the six months ended December, 1934, as compared with the corresponding period of 1933 were:- Butter, cheese, beef, lamb, mutton, rabbits and hares, citrus fruit, fruit preserved in liquid, wheat, flour sugar, wine, cattle hides, opossum skins, tallow, coal, silver and silver lead ore. The principal commodities shipped overseas in smaller quantities were:- Sausage casings, milk and cream, currants, raisins, fresh apples, kangaroo and wallaby skins, rabbit and hare skins, sheepskins, wool, greasy, scoured and tops, zinc ore, pig lead, tin ingots, zinc bars, blocks, etc.

(d) Declared Unit Value. Compared with December, 1933, the average prices computed from the declared export values of the principal commodities were higher in December, 1934, for the following:- Wheat, flour, butter, beef, lamb, mutton, lead (pig), and gold. Lower average prices ruled in December, 1934, compared with December, 1933, for - Wool, greasy and scoured, sheepskins, sugar, raisins, wine, tallow, and zinc (bars, etc.)

(e) Principal Exports of Australian Origin to Various Countries. Attention is directed to the additional information set out in tabular form relating to the Exports of the following principal Agricultural, Pastoral and Dairy Produce, during the six months July to December of the years 1933-34 and 1934-35, according to countries of destination:- Butter, frozen beef, mutton and lamb, wheat, flour, wool, greasy and scoured.
