AUSTRALIAN OVERSEA TRADE : SEPTEMBER 1945.

Particulars of the Oversea Trade of Australia for the month of September 1945, have been made available by the Acting Commonwealth Statistician (Mr. S. R. Carver).

Trade Position:

Total Imports of Merchandise in September 1945 amounted to £stg.13,966,000 as compared with £stg.13,411,000 in September 1944, an increase of £stg.555,000.

Total Exports of Merchandise were valued at £stg.9,233,000 in September 1945, as compared with £stg.10,970,000 in September 1944, a decrease of £stg.1,737,000.

Items of import and export are recorded in the month in which the entry is passed. Equipment, etc. imported by allied troops for their own use are excluded from total imports.

Under contractual arrangements, Australia receives payment for some exportable commodities, notably wool and gold, irrespective of when the goods are shipped. Current payments for these items may differ from the recorded values of exports, which relate only to actual shipments.

Civil Trade:

The next ensuing table shows "Civil Trade" and "Total Trade" separately for each month since July 1944.

"Civil" imports exclude all goods admitted free for the use of the Commonwealth Government under Tariff Item 370. Thus, goods admitted under all other Tariff Items, whether for direct or indirect Government use or not, and Lend-Lease goods intended for sale to private persons, are included in civil imports.

"Civil" exports exclude all goods shipped overseas on behalf of the Commonwealth Government but include goods shipped under commodity contracts with the British Government. Exports to Australian and Allied Forces in the Pacific Area are included in total exports but not in civil exports.

(d) Declared Unit Values: A comparison of the average prices computed from the declared export values of the principal commodities shows that the average prices were higher in September, 1945, than in September, 1944, for:- Flour, lamb, mutton, pig lead, raisins, sugar, wheat, wool greasy, and zinc bars, etc. Average prices were lower for:- Beef, butter, sheepskins, tallow, wine and wool scoured.

(e) Total Exports, Quantities: The principal commodities exported in larger quantities during the three months ended September, 1945, as compared with the corresponding period of the previous year were:- Butter, bacon and hams, beef, mutton, rabbits and hares, meats preserved in tins, milk and cream, fresh apples, fruits preserved in liquid, jams and jellies, sugar, wine, hides and skins (except opossum skins), wool, zinc concentrates and tin ingots.

For the years 1941-42 to 1944-45 inclusive, there was unaccustomed delay in passing some entries for imports and exports and they were recorded in month of entry. The figures for total trade in foodstuffs and "civil" trade in all Statistical Classes of exports are virtually complete. Items of Government exports (other than food) are not completely recorded in monthly totals but an estimate is made of the value each year and included in the annual totals. Some imports of war material and some goods imported for civil consumption under United States Lend Lease and Canadian Mutual Aid have not yet been included in statistics of total trade.
