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EXPLANATORY NOTES

Introduction

This publication presents, for the Australian Capital Territory detailed statistics compiled from the Census of Retail Establishments and Selected Service Establishments conducted in respect of the year ended 30 June 1980 (subsequently referred to as the 1979-80 retail census). It is one of a series of publications presenting 1979-80 retail census results for Australia and each of its component States and Territories.

2. The 1979-80 retail census was the eighth retail census since 1948 and the third conducted throughout Australia as part of the ABS program of integrated economic data collections. For a detailed description of the objectives of integrated economic data collections reference should be made to Chapter 31 of *Official Year Book of the Commonwealth of Australia No.56, 1970*. In general, national retail censuses, are held every five years. Additional collections have been undertaken for the Australian Capital Territory and Northern Territory.

3. The period covered by the census was, in general, the twelve months ended 30 June 1980. Where businesses were unable to supply information on this basis a substitute accounting period was accepted.

Scope

4. The scope of the 1979-80 retail census included all establishments classified to the Australian Standard Industrial Classification (ASIC — 1978 Edition) Sub-division 48 (Retail Trade) and selected service classes from ASIC Division L (Recreation, Personal and Other Services). The ASIC classes from Division L are 9133 — Motion picture theatres, 9231 — Cafes and restaurants, 9232 — Hotels, etc. (mainly drinking places), 9233 — Accommodation, 9241 — Licensed bowling clubs, 9242 — Licensed golf clubs, 9243 — Licensed clubs n.e.c., 9340 — Laundries and dry cleaners, 9351 — Men's hairdressers and 9352 — Women's hairdressing and beauty salons.

5. In accordance with the ASIC the basic unit in respect of which statistics are collected in integrated economic censuses is, in general, a unit covering all the operations carried on under the ownership of one enterprise (business) at a single physical location (e.g. an individual retail store). This unit is referred to as an establishment. A retail establishment is thus one predominantly engaged in retailing activities (see paragraphs 9 and 10), but the data collected for it cover all activities carried out by the enterprise at the location.

6. Tables providing details of operations statistics (i.e. Tables 1 to 6, 8, 20 to 23, 31 and 32) contain data relating to both establishments and separately located administrative offices and ancillary units serving those establishments. Examples of these units which are owned by and form part of the enterprise are head offices, repair and maintenance workshops, storage units and transport depots. Other tables contain establishment data only.

7. Information collected from single establishment retail and selected service enterprises with turnover of less than \$50,000 (except those in ASIC classes 9232 and 9233) was restricted to details of employment, wages and salaries, turnover, and floor space (retail enterprises only). These small enterprises contributed only marginally to statistical aggregates other than number of establishments and floor space.

Classification

8. The classification of census units to industry for the 1979-80 retail census is based on the 1978 edition of the ASIC. This edition replaces the 1969 preliminary edition which had been in use since the 1968-69 census. A publication — *Key Between the 1978 and 1969 Editions of ASIC* (1209.0) — fully describing the differences between the two ASIC editions is available on request from the ABS. In general, the impact of the change in industrial classification for the retail and selected service industries included in the census is minimal.

9. Each ASIC class is defined in terms of a specified range of economic activities designated as primary to it. Similarly each ASIC group is defined in terms of the economic activities designated as primary to the classes within that group, and so on. An establishment which is engaged mainly in economic activities which have been designated as primary to a particular class has been classified to that class whether or not that establishment is also engaged in other 'secondary' activities. (For example an establishment engaged mainly in retailing petrol but also engaged in a secondary activity of panel beating is classified to ASIC class 4864 service stations and not ASIC class 4865 smash repairers).

10. Retail Trade, as specified in the ASIC, generally includes the resale of new or used goods to final consumers for personal or household consumption. However, to conform with the concepts and definitions used in the Australian National Accounts, the sales of certain commodity items are treated as wholesale rather than retail sales. These commodity items are building materials; builders' hardware and supplies such as tools of trade, paint, etc; commercial refrigerators; business machines; tractors, farm machinery and implements; earth moving equipment; and grain, feed, fertilisers and agricultural supplies. Consequently, where sales of these items constitute the predominant activity of an establishment, the establishment has been classified as a wholesale establishment and not included in the retail census. Where sales of these items are made by an establishment predominantly engaged in retail activities, then the sales of these commodities are shown in retail census tabulations as wholesale sales and are included in turnover figures. It should be noted that establishments mainly engaged in both baking and retailing cakes are treated as retailers, but establishments mainly engaged in both baking and retailing bread are treated as manufacturers and are included in the Manufacturing Census. In addition, the following industry classes—

include all establishments predominantly engaged in either wholesaling or retailing new or used motor vehicles, motor cycles, boats, caravans, trailers, etc. Sales of motor vehicles (other than sales to motor vehicle dealers) whether for industrial, commercial or private use are treated as retail sales in the census (despite the inclusion of some wholesale sales). Establishments whose predominant activity is wholesaling new tyres, tubes, batteries or new motor vehicle parts or accessories have been classified as wholesale establishments.

11. In recent years, structural changes in the petroleum distribution industry have caused commission petrol sales to become a larger component of petrol sales than previously. In these cases the commission earned is included in other operating revenue and turnover and the retail sales themselves are not included.

Coverage

12. Because of difficulties in ensuring adequate coverage, some types of retailing were excluded from the census even though they would be classified to industries covered by the census. These are door to door salesmen, occasional stall holders and independent van salesmen except independent bread and milk vendors — ASIC classes 4878 and 4879. Details of retailing by bread and milk vendors were collected but are not included in 1979-80 retail census publications. Some statistics have been compiled and are available on request. In addition, details were not collected from establishments operating vending machines on the premises of other businesses. Accommodation establishments not holding liquor licences, e.g. guest houses and hostels, have been excluded from previous economic censuses and coverage may be deficient for these types of establishments.

13. The aim of the census was, in general, to include all retail and selected service establishments that operated at any time during the year ended 30 June 1980. Seasonal businesses which normally operate during certain periods of the year were included as far as possible even if they were not operating at 30 June 1980. However, establishments which ceased operations during the year or commenced operations during the last two months of the year were included in census results only if their contribution to statistical aggregates was significant.

Area statistics

14. Table 8 lists individual suburban areas within the ACT and provides details of numbers of establishments, persons employed, wages and salaries, turnover and floor space for retail establishments in each area. Similar details are not available by suburban area for the selected service establishments because of confidentiality constraints. Tables 2 and 21 provide details for A.C.T. North which consists of Canberra North, Belconnen, Hall and Jervis Bay. Tables 3 and 22 provide details for A.C.T. South which consists of Canberra South, Woden Valley, Weston Creek and Tuggeranong. Further specification of these areas is contained in Table 8.

15. Separate details are shown for 'Manuka' which comprises the area contained by Furneaux Street, Canberra Avenue, Captain Cook Crescent, Franklin Street, Flinders Way and Bougainville Street. 'City' comprises the whole of the area contained by Cooyong Street, Barry Drive, Childers Street, University Avenue, Ellery Circuit, McCoy Circuit, Lawson Crescent, Parkes Way, Coranderrk Street and Ballumbir Street.

Commodity statistics

16. Details for commodity and other income items are shown in Tables 13 to 19, 26 to 30 and 33. Detailed descriptions of these items are contained in Table 35. Where businesses were unable to provide actual sales data for individual commodities, careful estimates were sought.

17. Subject to the qualifications contained in paragraphs 13 and 18 of these Explanatory notes, values shown for commodity sales and other income items relate to establishments which operated at any time during the year ended 30 June 1980.

Establishment size statistics

18. Several tables contain data classified according to various measures of establishment size (employment, turnover, retail sales). These tables contain data for only those establishments (exclusive of any separately located administrative offices or ancillary units serving them) which operated for the whole of the year ended 30 June 1980. In Tables 18 and 19, commodity details are classified according to retail sales size group. These groups are based on total retail sales value and not on the values of individual commodities.

The census forms

19. To facilitate reporting, a number of form types were designed for use by establishments classified to various ASIC classes in the 1979-80 retail census. A sample of the form sent to Department Stores, General Stores, etc., is appended.

Definitions

Establishment Types

20. The classification of establishments into the various types set out in Tables 31 to 34 of this publication was based on the following:

Establishments providing tourist accommodation. — Comprises hotels, motels, etc. and caravan parks which provide predominantly short term accommodation (i.e. for periods of less than 2 months) available to the general public. Hotels, motels, etc. must have breakfast available in some form for guests, and caravan parks must provide powered sites for caravans (or on-site vans), and toilet, shower and laundry facilities for guests.

Establishments providing other accommodation. — Comprises establishments mainly engaged in providing long term accommodation (i.e. for continuous periods of two months or more) or in providing short term accommodation except tourist accommodation as defined above.

Licensed hotels.—Includes all establishments which are licensed to operate a public bar, and also provide accommodation.

Motels, etc.—Includes all motels, private hotels, guest houses and boarding houses except those licensed to operate a public bar.

Establishments not providing accommodation.—Includes those establishments in ASIC class 9232-Hotels, etc., (mainly drinking places) which do not provide accommodation.

With facilities.—Indicates a bath or shower and toilet in most guest rooms.

Data Items

21. The information shown in the tables (except where classified by establishment size) for the various items defined below relates to establishments which operated at any time during the year unless otherwise stated. Information which is classified by establishment size relates to establishments which operated for the whole of the year only.

Establishments at 30 June.—The number of establishments in operation at 30 June relates to retail and selected service establishments as such and does not include the number of separately located administrative offices and ancillary units.

Persons Employed (except where classified by establishment size).—Working proprietors and employees (including both full time and part time) on the payroll at the end of June 1980 including those working at separately located administrative offices and ancillary units. Unpaid helpers are excluded. Persons employed data classified by establishment size excludes those working at establishments which did not operate for the whole of 1979-80 and those working at separately located administrative offices and ancillary units.

Wages and Salaries (except for Tables 10 and 25).—The wages and salaries of all employees of the establishment, including those working at separately located administrative offices and ancillary units. Drawings of working proprietors are excluded. Wages and salaries shown in Tables 10 and 25 excludes the wages and salaries of persons working at separately located administrative offices and ancillary units.

Retail Sales.—Total value of retail sales of goods, subject to the qualifications as set out in paragraphs 10 to 13 above. Retail sales data are net of allowances for goods returned, amounts allowed as trade-ins (except motor vehicle trade-in values), separately invoiced delivery charges and all discounts. Where goods are sold on a commission basis for other enterprises, the value of these goods is not included in retail sales but commissions received on such sales are included in other income under the item 'Other Revenue'. For a list of individual commodity items see Table 35.

Wholesale Sales.—Total value of wholesale sales of goods, subject to the qualifications as set out in paragraphs 10 to 13 above. Sales Tax paid on wholesale sales is excluded.

Other Income.—Selected items of income other than retail or wholesale sales. For a list of these items see Table 35.

Turnover.—Sales of goods (retail and wholesale) and all other operating revenue except interest, royalties, dividends and receipts from sales of fixed tangible assets.

Stocks — Opening and Closing.—Stocks of goods for sale, materials, fuels and work in progress, owned by the establishment, whether located at the establishment or elsewhere, valued on a balance sheet basis.

Purchases, Transfers In and Selected Expenses.—Purchases of goods for resale and materials for manufacturing; transfers in from establishments of the enterprise other than retail or selected service establishments; charges for commission and subcontract work; purchases of wrapping and packaging materials, electricity and fuel, repair and maintenance expenses; outward freight and cartage; motor vehicle running expenses; sales commission payments; aid rent, leasing and hiring expenses.

Value Added.—Turnover plus increase (or less decrease) in the value of stocks, less purchases, transfers in and selected expenses.

NOTE: While value added is the basic measure of an industry's contribution to economic activity, it cannot be inferred that when wages and salaries are deducted from value added, the whole of the surplus is available for profit. There are many miscellaneous expenses (such as depreciation, workers' compensation insurance, other insurance, payroll tax, income tax, rates, advertising, interest on borrowed funds, bad debts and other sundry charges) which are not taken into account in arriving at value added.

Fixed Capital Expenditure Less Disposals.—Outlay on new and second hand fixed tangible assets less disposals.

Total Floor Space.—Total floor area occupied by establishments (whether rented, leased or owner occupied) including basements and upper floors.

NOTE: The 1979-80 retail census was the first census in which details of total floor space were collected for all States and the Northern Territory. This item was not collected for bread and milk vendors, motor vehicle dealers, petrol and tyre retailers and all selected service establishments. Details of total floor space have been collected for the Australian Capital Territory in the censuses since 1969-70.
