EXPLANATORY NOTES

This bulletin contains statistics of production in Australia of mine and factory products for which monthly figures are available. An alphabetical index of these products is given on pages 2 and 3.

2. The following details are shown for each product:

- (a) Annual totals for the last three complete financial years;
- (b) Totals for the most recent six-monthly and three-monthly periods;
- (c) Totals for the corresponding periods, twelve months earlier; and
- (d) Monthly details for each of the latest thirteen months, where available.

3. The annual totals for the years 1963-64 and 1964-65 are mostly derived from the Annual Factory Census returns collected by the Deputy Commonwealth Statistician in each State. In a small number of cases returns are accepted from factories for a year other than the normal financial year ending on 30 June.

4. The monthly figures are also based for the most part on returns collected by the Deputy Commonwealth Statisticians. Where another authority is the source, this is shown in a footnote. Monthly figures from July 1965 onwards may be revised when the results of the Annual Factory Census for 1965-66 become available.

5. For the purpose of factory statistics collections, a factory is taken to be a manufacturing establishment in which four or more persons are employed or in which power other than manual is used. Any production in small establishments not classified as factories is not included in the figures shown herein.

6. Further detail in respect of many of the items will be found on an annual basis in Principal Factory Products and in the series of Manufacturing Industries Bulletins published by this Bureau, and on a monthly basis, in the Monthly Production Summaries, also issued by this Bureau.

7. This bulletin contains data of monthly output of over 350 products. The items for which quantity of output is published herein are not, however, selected as representative of all factory output, and the tables should be read only as showing monthly trends in output of the individual items or groups of items listed.

8. This issue contains, for the first time, seasonally adjusted statistics of several items, see page 29. Details of the methods used in seasonally adjusting these and other series are given in "Seasonally Adjusted Indicators 1967" issued on 18 July 1967. In the seasonal adjustment, account has been taken not only of normal seasonal factors but additionally of "trading-day" effects (arising from the varying numbers of Sundays, Mondays, Tuesdays, etc. in the month) and the influence of Easter which may, in successive years, affect figures for different months.

9. Work is continuing, as resources permit, in connection with the development of current monthly or quarterly indexes of factory production.

10. Most items are identified by Commodity Codes which are derived from the Commodity Classification used in Australian Factory Statistics. In some cases where data is derived from sources other than Factory Collections, no Commodity Code is shown.

11. Any discrepancies between totals and sums of components in tables are due to rounding.
