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VALUE OF AGRICULTURAL COMMODITIES PRODUCED AUSTRALIA, 1978-79 (SECOND ESTIMATES)

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EXPLANATORY NOTES

This publication contains preliminary information on the value of agricultural commodities produced by States for the year 1978-79 together with a summary of Australian totals for each of the years back to 1973-74. Summary tables 1 and 2 also show gross and local values of production for forestry, fishing and hunting commodities. Final estimates for 1978-79 will be published in the publication *Value of Agricultural Commodities Produced, Australia, 1978-79* (7503.0), which is expected to be released later this year. Preliminary estimates for the year 1979-80 are expected to be available by July of this year, and will be published in the publication *Value of Agricultural Commodities Produced, Australia*, (First Estimates) (7501.0).

Period covered

The period covered in this publication for crops refers, in general, to the season ended 31 March, and for the remaining commodities refers to the year ended 30 June. For all commodities, values are in respect of production during the year (or season) irrespective of whether or when that production is actually marketed or when payments are made. For that portion of production not marketed (e.g. hay grown on farm for own use, milk used in farm household, etc.) estimates are made from the best available information and valued on a local value basis.

Definition of terms used

The following are brief definitions of the terms used.

- (i) *Gross value of commodities produced* is the value placed on recorded production at the wholesale prices realised in the principal markets. In general, the "principal markets" are the metropolitan markets in each State. In cases where commodities are consumed locally, or where they become raw material for a secondary industry, these points are presumed to be the principal markets.
- (ii) *Local value of commodities produced* is the value placed on commodities at the place of production and is ascertained by deducting marketing costs from the gross value of commodities produced. Marketing costs include freight, cost of containers, commission and other charges incurred in marketing.

Gross and local values of agricultural commodities produced involve some duplication, as they include certain agricultural commodities

which are consumed as raw materials to produce other agricultural commodities (e.g. hay consumed by livestock).

- (iii) Values include any relevant subsidy and bounty payments.
- (iv) Transactions of the Wheat Industry Stabilisation Fund have not been taken into account in the valuation of wheat.
