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EXPLANATORY NOTES

Introduction

This publication contains statistics of government and non-government schools, students enrolled and active in a course of study at those schools, and staff employed as at July 1985.

The National Schools Statistics Collection (NSSC) series was established through the work of the Australian Education Council School Statistics Committee, of which the ABS is a member. This Committee was established in 1979 by the Australian Education Council to improve the quality of education statistics relating to government and non-government primary and secondary education and has developed a set of concepts, definitions, and

classifications for use in the National Schools Statistics Collection.

The statistics are compiled from collections conducted, in co-operation with the Australian Education Council School Statistics Committee, by the State/Territory Departments of Education (government series) and the Commonwealth Department of Education (non-government series).

Prior to the implementation of the NSSC in the non-government sector for 1984, the non-government collection was conducted by the ABS and made available in the publication "Primary and Secondary Education, Queensland" (Catalogue No. 4204.3). In some cases the

concepts, definitions, classifications, and coverage of the NSC may differ from that series. These cases have been noted in the relevant tables.

Scope and Coverage

The scope of the NSC series comprises government and non-government establishments which have as their major activity the administration and/or provision of full-time day primary, secondary and/or special education, or primary or secondary education by radio or correspondence.

As those establishments at which some other activity is the major one are excluded, the statistics presented do not include all establishments, students, or staff engaged in activities under the control of the Director-General of Education (or equivalent). For example, Colleges of Technical and Further Education are excluded.

Census Dates

The census dates for the collection of statistics published in this publication are as follows: 1 July 1980, 17 July 1981, 19 July 1982, and 18 July 1983. In 1984, the census dates were 16 July for government schools and 13 July for non-government schools, and in 1985 the census date for both collections was 15 July. The reference date for age of students is 1 July.

Definitions

An educational establishment is one which engages in the provision or administration of in-scope educational services. Three types of establishments are recognised as within the scope of this collection: schools, ancillary educational establishments, and other educational establishments.

Schools are establishments which have as their major activity the provision of full-time day primary, secondary and/or special education, or primary or secondary education by radio or correspondence. A school may have two or more campuses at separate physical locations, and for purposes of this publication, each campus is counted as a separate school.

Schools previously administered by the Queensland Department of Community Services are, from January 1985, within the jurisdiction of the Director-General of Education.

An ancillary educational establishment (AEE) has as its major activity the provision of aspects of full-time day primary, secondary, or special education to students supplementary to that provided by schools. AEEs include educational establishments in institutions and hospitals where students cannot enrol for a period exceeding four continuous weeks, certain holiday excursion centres, etc. Students attending AEEs on the census date are included with the schools they usually attend.

NOTE: There were 28 AEEs in 1985 and these have been excluded from the number of schools in this publication.

Other educational establishments within the scope of these statistics and not defined as schools or ancillary educational establishments include administrative offices which have as their major activity the administration of primary, secondary, or special education and teacher resource centres operated by the Director-General of Education.

Primary education is defined as that full-time education which typically commences at around age 5 and lasts for seven years. It does not include sessional education such as pre-school education.

Secondary education is defined as that education which typically commences at around age 12 after completion of primary education and lasts for five years.

Special education is defined as that education provided at special schools.

A special school is one which requires one or more of the following characteristics to be exhibited by students before enrolment is allowed:

- (a) mental or physical handicap, slow learning ability;
- (b) social or emotional problems; or
- (c) in custody, on remand, in hospital.

Special classes are conducted at non-special schools and cater for students having intellectual, sensory, physical, or social/emotional disabilities. This category excludes students in classes taken by remedial/resource teachers on a withdrawal basis.

A student is defined as a person who is enrolled in a school and active in a course of study other than pre-school or technical and further education courses. Persons absent at the reference date are included if they were expected to be absent for less than four continuous weeks (excluding school vacations) and are excluded if they had left the school or had been absent without explanation for four continuous weeks (excluding school vacations) prior to the reference week.

A full-time student is a person who satisfies the definition of a student and undertakes a work-load equivalent to or greater than that usually undertaken by a student of that year.

A part-time student is a person who satisfies the definition of a student but who undertakes a work-load less than that usually undertaken by a full-time student (as determined by that system) of that year. The full-time equivalent of a part-time student is expressed as a proportion, dependent on the number of hours attended (e.g. 0.5 of a full-time student).

Correspondence students are those who are prevented from attending ordinary schools because of distance or illness. Students in receipt of primary education by radio through the Schools of the Air are included in this category. Part-time correspondence students are excluded from the tables in this publication but are included in footnotes where appropriate.

Staff are defined as persons who are involved in the administration or provision of primary, secondary, or special education.

Teaching staff are those paid under a teacher's salary award (or equivalent) and who are in contact with students, i.e. support students either by direct class contact or on an individual basis. They include classroom and general teachers, librarians, teacher librarians, guidance/counselling/careers advisors, and relieving teachers but exclude staff who provide professional support to teachers.

Public service awards are not considered to be equivalent to teacher's salary awards. Teachers in administrative positions, such as principals and deputy principals, are considered to be teaching staff.

Non-teaching staff are defined as those who are not in contact with students, or who are not paid under a teacher's salary award (or equivalent).

Full-time staff are defined as those who perform the full allocation of duties specified as full-time in the relevant award, contract, or administrative arrangement. However, persons who are employed full-time by the Department of Education but part of whose duties are out of scope of the collection (e.g. pre-school) have been regarded as part-time.

Part-time staff are staff who are not employed full-time or who are employed full-time but part of whose duties are out of scope of this collection (e.g. pre-school). The full-time equivalent of part-time staff is calculated on the basis of the proportion of time spent on in-scope activities compared to that spent by full-time staff with similar duties.

Staff are categorised as school staff if they usually spend more than half of their time actively engaged in duties at one or more AEP.

The area of activity of staff is classified to the following:

- (a) active in "primary education" also includes "special" primary education at non-special schools;
- (b) active in "secondary education" also includes "special" secondary education at non-special schools; and
- (c) active in "special education" excludes persons active in administration or provision of special classes at non-special schools;

Staff who worked in more than one area of activity have been apportioned as full-time equivalent units across

areas of activity on the basis of the number of enrolments in that sector.

Apparent grade retention rates are measures of the tendencies of students to remain in secondary education from Year 8 to Year 10, Year 11, and Year 12. To calculate the apparent grade retention rate of students in Year 12 in 1995, the number of those students in 1995 is expressed as a proportion of the number of students in Year 8 in 1981 (1981 being the year in which the 1995 Year 12 students would have normally enrolled in Year 8). The retention rate thus derived is called an apparent grade retention rate because the method of calculation does not explicitly take account of net changes to the school population due to migration, deaths, transfers between government and non-government schools, or of those students who spend more than one year in the same grade.

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Summary of Findings

At July 1985, there were 489,695 students (excluding part-time secondary correspondence students) enrolled at 1,669 schools in Queensland. These figures represent increases of 3,310 students and 17 schools since July 1984. Diagram 1 shows the distribution of enrolments by controlling authority. Government schools account for the majority of enrolments with 374,533 students (76.5 per cent) attending 1,282 schools (75.9 per cent). Catholic schools (16.4 per cent) cater for 85,199 students (17.4 per cent) while Anglican schools (0.8 per cent) cater for 7,854 students (1.6 per cent) and other non-government schools (6.9 per cent) cater for the remaining 22,099 students (4.5 per cent).

Diagram 1 - All Schools: Enrolments by Controlling Authority, Queensland, July 1985

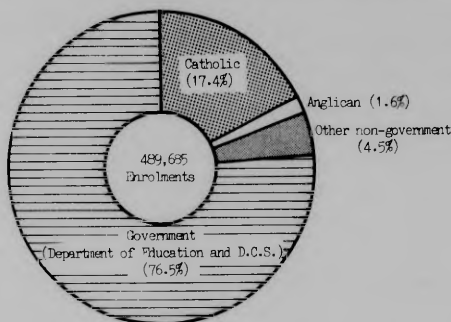
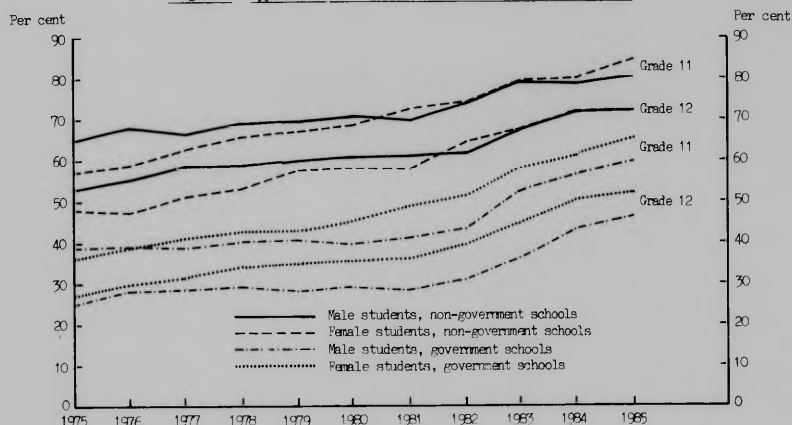


Diagram 2 shows the apparent grade retention rates between 1975 and 1985. These are measures of the tendencies of students to remain in school from their first secondary year (Grade 8) to the second last and last year of secondary schooling (Grades 11 and 12). This apparent retention rate does not take into account net changes to the school population due to migration, deaths, transfers between sectors, or repeating students.

The retention rates in non-government schools are higher than those of government schools. These differences have remained fairly constant over the last 10 years. In non-government schools the retention rate to Year 12 has risen since 1975 from 53.0 per cent for males and 48.0 per cent for females to 72.2 per cent for both in 1985. Over the same period in government schools, the retention rate to Year 12 for males has risen from 24.9 per cent to 46.3 per cent and for females from 27.2 per cent to 52.1 per cent.

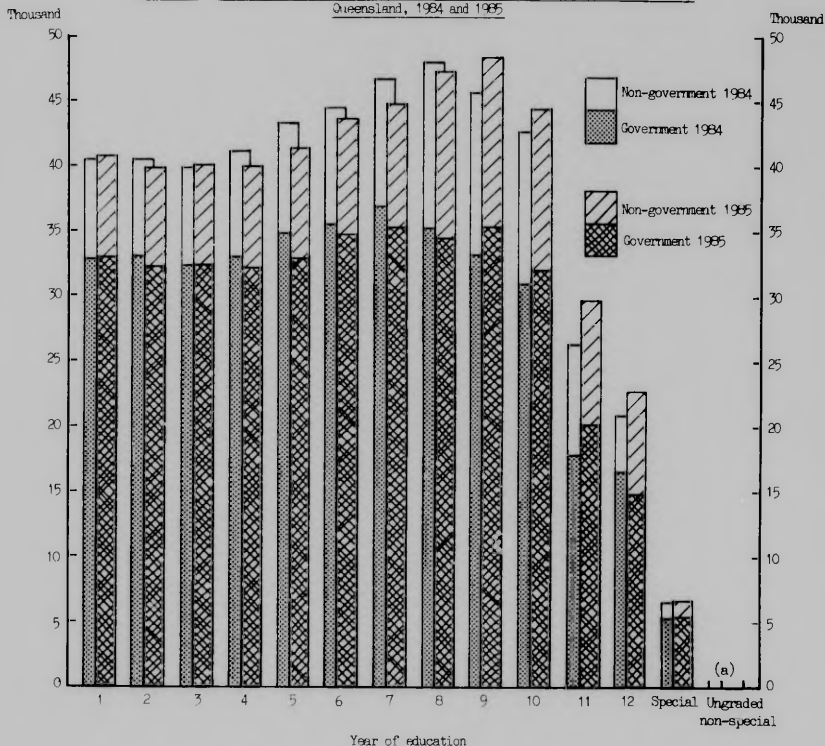
Summary of Findings (continued)

Between 1984 and 1985 the retention rate of females remaining to Year 11 in non-government schools rose by 4.6 per cent while that of males rose minimally by 1.7 per cent. Minimal increases were recorded for males and females remaining to Year 12 in non-government schools. Retention rate increases between 1984 and 1985 were more significant in the government sector.

Diagram 3 shows the comparative enrolments for 1984 and 1985 for government and non-government schools by year of education. Special students are ungraded students at special schools or in special classes at non-special schools. Ungraded non-special students are students at non-government schools who cannot be allocated to a particular year of education. These students totalled 293 students in 1984 and 248 students in 1985.

The fact that 1984 figures exceed the corresponding 1985 figures in the majority of primary grades reflects the decline in birth rates between 1973 and 1978.

The fact that school attendance is no longer compulsory after the age of 15 years is reflected in the decline in enrolments from Year 10 onwards. However, the diagram shows an increase in the number of students in Years 10 to 12 between 1984 and 1985. This reflects the high percentage of students remaining at school to Year 12 in order to enter tertiary education or get a better job. This was reflected in the "Participation in Secondary Education" survey conducted in 1984, when parents of students in Year 11 indicated the most important reason for their children staying at school to Year 12 as "Need Year 12 for University or College" (35.3 per cent) and "Will help get better job" (29.7 per cent).
