Explanatory Notes

Introduction

This publication contains annual statistics of Queensland's exports and imports, both interstate and foreign.

Source of Data

Interstate trade statistics are compiled from data provided by a selected group of exporters and importers who are known to trade directly with other Australian States and Territories.

There are approximately 500 exporters and 1,250 importers from whom quarterly returns are received. A number of larger companies and organisations submit both export and import returns. Some smaller businesses are excluded from the collection as their contribution to the total figures is small.

Foreign trade statistics are compiled by the Australian Bureau of Statistics (ABS) from documentation submitted by exporters and importers or their agents to the Australian Customs Service as required by the Customs Act.

Statistical Concepts

The statistics presented in this publication are recorded on a general trade basis, i.e. exports include both Queensland produce and re-exports whilst imports

comprise goods entered directly for home consumption together with goods imported into bonded warehouses.

Unpublished Statistics

The ABS can also make available certain interstate and foreign trade statistics which are not published. Where it is not practicable to provide the required statistics by telephone, they may be available in other forms, such as microfiche, photocopy, computer printout, or clerically extracted tabulation. A charge may be made for providing unpublished statistics in these forms.
