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MAIN FEATURES

In July 1982 there were 2,312 non-government schools operating in Australia compared with 2,261 operating in 1981.

The number of students attending these schools totalled 711,682; comprising 547,007 from Roman Catholic schools, 61,102 from Anglican schools and 103,573 from all other non-government schools. This represented an overall increase of 3.4 per cent over the number of students attending in 1981 (687,996).

The number of teaching staff at these schools in July 1982 totalled 43,406. This includes 36,007 full-time teachers and 7,399 part-time teachers who contributed 3,288 full-time equivalent units of effort. The total staff of 39,295 (full-time equivalent units) constitutes a 5.6 per cent increase over the 37,225 full-time equivalent teaching staff in 1981.

EXPLANATORY NOTES

Introduction

This publication contains detailed statistics of teachers and students in primary and secondary non-government schools in Australia at July 1982. Statistics for both government and non-government schools were previously issued in the publication *Schools, Australia* (4202.0).

2. However, the concepts, classifications, definitions and coverage of the government collection have since been revised. The revised series is now available separately in the ABS publication *National Schools Collection: Government Schools, Australia* (4215.0).

3. Revision of the non-government collection is proceeding and in due course will be made comparable with the revised government series. The two series will then form a complete and comparable National Schools Collection. In the meantime however, the non-government series is being continued in its unrevised form and released separately in this publication.

Scope and coverage

4. The statistics in this publication relate to schools established to provide full-time instruction according to a primary and/or secondary curriculum and to schools catering for students with special needs who would be attending an ordinary school under other circumstances. Care should be taken in drawing comparisons between the data for the government and non-government sectors because of the unrevised nature of the non-government series.

5. Student statistics exclude all enrolments in pre-school activity undertaken on a seasonal basis. However, teacher statistics prior to 1979 include teachers involved in this pre-primary activity as data with this dissection is not readily available for those earlier years. The statistics also exclude students and staff involved in technical and further education activity such as Tertiary Orientation Programs in Victoria.

Definitions

6. *Schools* may provide primary, secondary and/or special education (special education being special instruction for physically and/or mentally handicapped or socially maladjusted students). The term school in this publication includes schools in institutions and hospitals, mission schools and similar establishments. The term excludes recognised pre-schools and kindergarten centres, pre-primary schools or classes in, or attached to ordinary schools, senior technical and agricultural colleges, evening schools, continuation classes, and institutions such as business or coaching colleges.

7. *Teacher* statistics include teaching staff, principals and head teachers (whether permanent or temporary), but exclude teachers-in-training, teachers on leave without pay, and other teachers engaged wholly in advisory, administrative or other non-teaching duties. Comparability between States is affected by different treatments of casual and special purpose teachers and different classifications of teachers who perform other duties as well as primary or secondary teaching.

8. All teachers are classified as either *full-time* or *part-time*. Part-time teaching effort is expressed in full-time equivalent units (FTE). Methods used for calculating FTE vary between and within States, however most schools base their calculations on hours worked, number of class periods, or proportion of full-time salary. Generally, total teaching effort is presented in FTE in this publication.

9. *Student* statistics refer to the number of full-time students enrolled at schools included in the Non-government Schools Census at the reference period. The reference period is July 1982.

10. There is no Australia-wide standard method of allocating students and classes to a certain year of education (grade). In particular there are differences in the organisation of both special schools and special classes at ordinary schools. Where possible, special students have been allocated to a year of education, otherwise they have been recorded as *ungraded special*.

11. A number of schools (other than special schools) do not maintain a formal grade structure. Students at these schools have been allocated to equivalent grades where possible but otherwise appear against the category *ungraded*.

12. The *Apparent retention rate* is the percentage of students commencing secondary school who remain at school until the third last, second last or last year of schooling (i.e. Years 10, 11 or 12). The rates are called *Apparent* as they do not take into account the effects of migration, the repeating of classes, or inter-system transfer on the school population.

13. In making comparisons between States, care must be taken as there may be differences in the organisation of grades, policy on student advancement and flows from secondary to vocational education.

STRUCTURE OF PRIMARY AND SECONDARY SCHOOLING

The structure of primary and secondary schooling in Australia varies between the different States and Territories. There are three basic patterns evident, as illustrated below.

The first pattern exists in South Australia and Northern Territory where the primary system comprises a Reception or Transition grade followed by Years 1 to 7. The secondary system comprises Years 8 to 12.

The second pattern exists in New South Wales, Victoria, Tasmania and the Australian Capital Territory where the primary system comprises a Kindergarten or Preparatory grade followed by Years 1 to 6. The secondary system comprises Years 7 to 12.

The third pattern exists in Queensland and Western Australia where the primary system comprises Years 1 to 7 and the secondary system Years 8 to 12.

Each State and Territory also has an expanding pre-school sector which is prior to, and separate from, primary and secondary schooling. Data on pre-school education within schools have been excluded from primary enrolments in this publication. (See paragraph 5 of the Explanatory notes.)
