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EXPLANATORY NOTES

Introduction

1. The Digest contains the latest available figures at the time of issue for a selection of monthly and quarterly economic series. Where possible, statistics are shown both in their original and seasonally adjusted form.

Adjustments to series

2. Besides being adjusted for normal seasonal factors, some of the statistical series included in the Digest have been adjusted for the effects of calendar variations, namely, 'trading-day' effects (arising from the varying numbers of Sundays, Mondays, Tuesdays, etc. in a month) and the influence of movable holidays, such as Easter and Australia Day.

3. Most of the original and seasonally adjusted series are preliminary and subject to revision.
