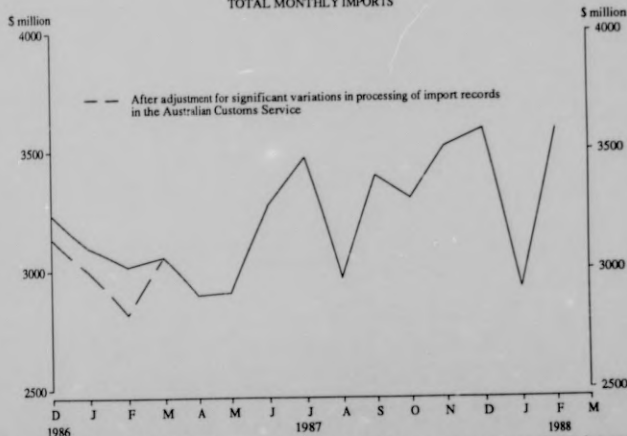

CHANGE IN CLASSIFICATION: The international implementation of the Harmonized Commodity Description and Coding System (HCDCS) on 1 January 1988 and the introduction of a third revision of the Standard International Trade Classification from the same date have resulted in changes to the collection, presentation and interpretation of Australia's foreign trade statistics. Details regarding these changes are outlined in paragraphs 2 to 6 of the Explanatory Notes. Users should be aware of these changes when comparing data in this issue with those relating to periods prior to January 1988. To assist users in analysing movements in imports, commodity statistics presented in the Main Features and graphs are based on the classification used prior to January 1988.

MAIN FEATURES

TOTAL MONTHLY IMPORTS



Imports for February 1988 rose by \$662m to \$3,589m, an increase of 23% compared with January 1988.

The major contributors to this increase were machinery, up \$178m (21%) to \$1,038m; petroleum and petroleum products, up \$115m (119%) to \$211m; miscellaneous manufactured articles, up \$109m (26%) to \$521m; and food and live animals, up \$61m (50%) to \$182m.

The major sources of Australian imports for February 1988, with the corresponding percentages for January in brackets, were: the EEC \$901m 25% (25%); the USA \$697m 19% (21%); and Japan \$678m 19% (20%).

Imports for the eight months ended February 1988 compared with the same period last year rose by \$1,876m to \$26,755m, an increase of 8%. Increases were recorded in chemicals, up \$486m (22%) to \$2,727m; machinery, up \$423m (6%) to \$7,987m; manufactures of metal, up \$248m (21%) to \$1,454m; and petroleum and petroleum products, up \$193m (17%) to \$1,330m. A decrease was recorded in transport equipment, down \$250m (9%) to \$2,653m.

EXPLANATORY NOTES

A brief outline of the major definitions used in compiling the statistics in this publication is contained in the following explanatory notes and in table footnotes. For a more detailed description refer to the information paper Foreign Trade Statistics: An Overview (5481.0).

2. Import statistics contained in monthly, quarterly and annual publications for periods up to and including December 1987 were presented according to the codes and descriptions of the Australian Import Commodity Classification (AICC). This classification was based on the second revision of the United Nations Standard International Trade Classification (SITC Rev2) with some modifications to take account of Australia's trade.

3. From January 1988 import statistics in this publication are presented according to a new international version of SITC (ie SITC Rev3). SITC Rev3 has been developed by the U.N. to coincide with the introduction of a new international classification for describing goods for customs and other purposes, the Harmonized Commodity Description and Coding System (the Harmonized System). The Harmonized System was adopted in January 1988 by most of the major trading nations of world.

4. The third revision of SITC incorporates significant changes to the numbering system and overall structure to align it more closely with the Harmonized System. The changes between the second and third revision of SITC, and the adoption by the ABS of the complete international version of the classification, have resulted in a break in the statistical series published by the ABS.

5. To overcome that break in series and to assist users in the interpretation of the data, import commodity statistics for the period January to June 1988 are being shown in two separate series:

. the first shows imports data from January 1988 on a SITC Rev3 basis, see Tables 2A and 4A. Data on this basis for previous periods are not available; and

. the second shows imports data according to the SITC Rev2-based AICC, see Tables 2B and 4B. This series, produced by recompiling data from SITC Rev3 back to the codes of the AICC, will be maintained up to and including June 1988. From July 1988, this publication will show imports data only according to the codes and descriptors of SITC Rev3.

6. Users should be aware that the changes from AICC to SITC Rev3 are extensive and for many items prevent direct comparison. Accordingly, caution should be exercised in using the re-compiled AICC data from January 1988 onwards and particular attention should be given to table footnotes. More information about the links between SITC Rev3 and AICC items may be obtained from the booklet "Linkages Between SITC Rev3 and AICC/AICC Items Used in ABS Foreign Trade Output", available from the ABS.

7. The recorded value of imports is the Customs value (formerly referred to as the value for duty).

8. In accordance with United Nations recommendations, total imports excludes transactions of non-merchandise trade. The monthly value of non-merchandise trade is shown in Table 1.

9. Imports are recorded statistically in the calendar month in which the import entries are both finalised by the Australian Customs Service and passed to the ABS for further processing. Import entries may be lodged early using the Customs check-to-arrive system or the document may be delayed because of various validation checks carried out by customs prior to the entries being passed to the ABS.

10. Because of the way in which imports data are collected and processed approximately 70% of total import trade by value shown for a particular month reflects actual shipments in that month, while approximately 25% reflects actual shipments during the previous month with the remaining 5% by value being imported in earlier months. For individual commodities these percentages may vary considerably.

11. Restrictions are placed on the release of statistics for certain commodities for reasons of confidentiality. These restrictions do not affect total import figures, but they can affect statistics at all levels in country and commodity tables. Refer to table footnotes and the Appendix for specific details. The information paper Confidentiality and the Release of Foreign Trade and Shipping Statistics (5486.0) describes fully the confidentiality process.

12. Revisions to previously published data frequently occur due to continuing quality checks and statistics in this publication should be considered preliminary.

13. Country statistics shown in Tables 3 and 9 refer to the country of origin at the time of import.

14. Import statistics are also available on microfiche, special returns, and magnetic tape. A comprehensive series of information papers describe these services. For more information, please contact any ABS office.

DISTRIBUTION OF IMPORTS BY MAJOR COMMODITIES

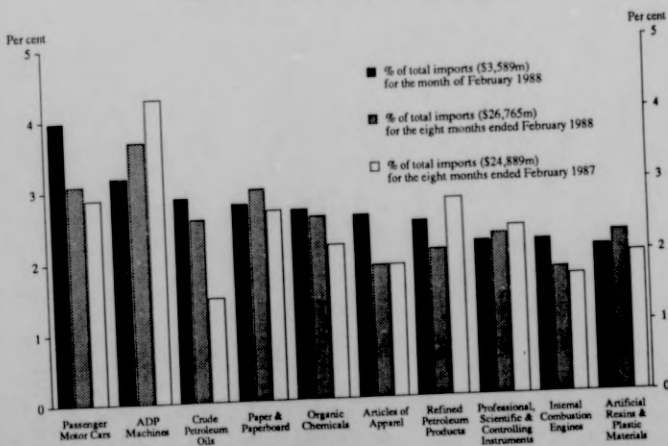

VALUE OF IMPORTS BY MAJOR SECTIONS OF THE AICC

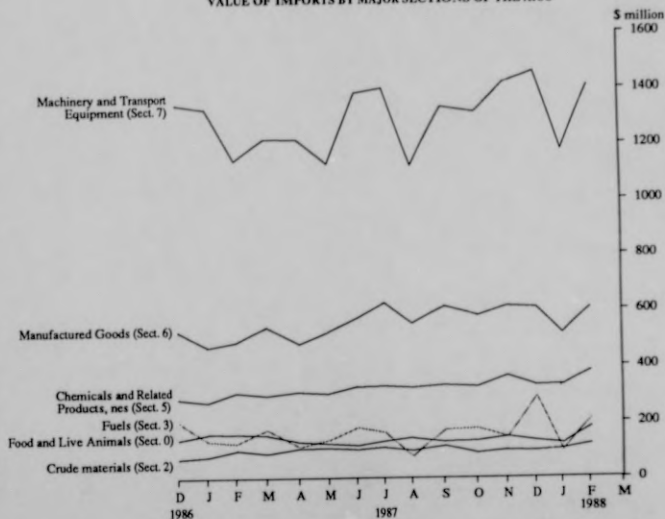

Appendix 1 Confidential Commodity Listings

Restrictions are placed on the release of statistics for certain commodities for reasons of confidentiality. Prior to the introduction of the Harmonized System on 1 January 1988 (see Explanatory Notes, paragraphs 1-4) import confidentiality restrictions were applied at the item level of the Australian Import Commodity Classification (AICC). Details of the commodities affected by those restrictions are contained in issues of this publication prior to January 1988.

From 1 January 1988, import restrictions have been applied at the item level of the Harmonized Tariff. The Tariff items affected by the restrictions, together with the code of the SITC Rev 3 item affected and the type of restriction are listed below. Confidentiality restrictions applying in 1987 were reviewed prior to January 1988, converted from the AICC codes to the Harmonized Tariff codes and shown as having started in January 1988.

In Table 3, commodities subject to a "No Country Details" or "Selected Country Details" restriction are EXCLUDED from the relevant country and are INCLUDED in the "No Country Details" item.

In Tables 2A and 4A (and 6), commodities subject to a "No Commodity Details" restriction are EXCLUDED from the relevant Sections and Divisions. In Table 4A they are INCLUDED in Division 38 and in Tables 2A and 4 they are INCLUDED in the total.

In Tables 2B and 4B, details of confidentiality restrictions applying to commodities classified according to the AICC are contained in issues of this publication prior to January 1988.
