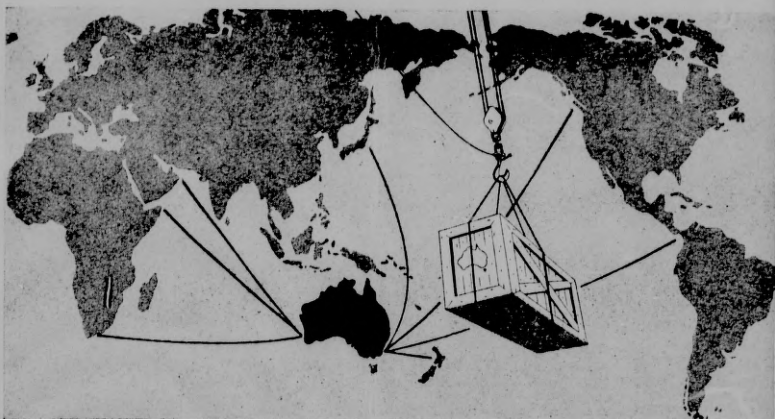

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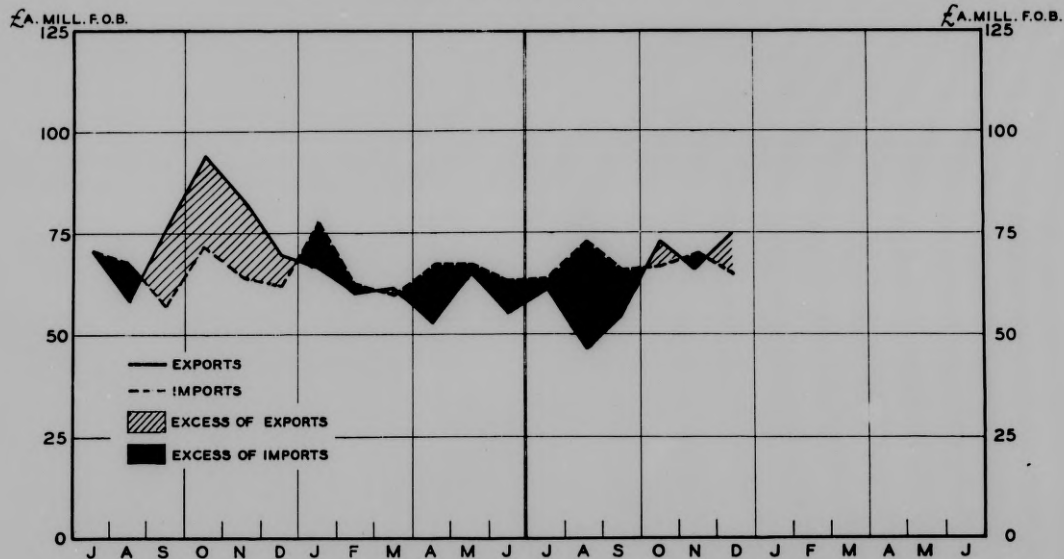

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NOTE(1) Basic Documents

The Oversea Trade Statistics published herein have been derived from documents obtained under the Customs Act by the Department of Customs and Excise and compiled by the Commonwealth Bureau of Census and Statistics. They do not include certain items for which customs entries are not recorded. See paragraph (v) of this note.

These documents are duplicate copies of export and import entries submitted by exporters and importers or their agents to the Department of Customs and Excise.

Export entries show date and port of shipment, country of consignment and the description, quantity (where required) and value of the goods. The statistical item number is inserted and verified by officers of the Department of Customs and Excise, Canberra.

Import entries show date and port of entry, country of origin, description of goods, quantity (where required), value of the goods and amount of duty paid thereon. The statistical item number is inserted by the importer or his agent, together with the tariff number under which the goods are admitted and these are verified by Statistical Officers of the Department of Customs and Excise in the local offices of the Collectors of Customs.

(ii) EXPORTS are recorded statistically in the month in which the export entries are passed by the Department of Customs and Excise. Normally this is within a few days of shipment, but shipment of some major items is at times delayed by abnormal factors affecting sales, deliveries for export and the loading of ships. When such delays occur, exports are diminished (pro tanto) and when such delays are overtaken shipments include substantial quantities of accumulated stock as well as current disposals.

In addition to the above, shipments of two major exports - wool and wheat - are affected by special factors. Wool shipments in any trade year are at times materially affected by the fact that wool auctions normally end in May or June, and there is a variable carry-over for shipment in the next trade year. New season's wheat normally becomes available for shipment from December onwards, and the quantity shipped in any trade year (ending June) depends on the size of the crop and the time spread of sales for export.

Exports are recorded with destination "For Orders" when the country of consignment had not been determined at the time of export. Where exports "For Orders" are not shown separately in the tables of Section 3(e) any such exports have been included with "Other Foreign Countries".

(iii) IMPORTS are recorded statistically in the month in which import entries are passed by the Department of Customs and Excise. Normally this is within a few days of discharge of cargoes.

(iv) Coverage. Statistics shown herein include merchandise and bullion and specie unless otherwise specified. The value of outside packages for both exports and imports is included in all tables, being recorded under each item concerned for exports and as a separate item in Class XI of imports. Export figures relate to both Australian and other produce, except in Section 3(c) and 3(e), where exports of Australian produce only are shown. Exports of ships' stores and aircraft stores are excluded from overseas trade statistics, but are shown separately on page 27.

(v) Balance of Payments

Statistics relating to overseas trade only do not measure Australia's total Balance of Payments during the periods shown. Particulars of other transactions entering into the balance of payments (in particular, freight and insurance charges payable overseas, current production of Australian gold, overseas payments of dividends, profits, interest and royalties, Government expenditure overseas, etc.) are shown in a printed bulletin published by the Commonwealth Statistician entitled "The Australian Balance of Payments 1928-29 to 1951-52". Current estimates for the years 1951-52 to 1957-58, have been published in mimeographed form. For items such as naval ships, merchant vessels trading overseas, aircraft for use on overseas routes and certain materials for inter-governmental defence projects, no customs entries are recorded but these transactions are taken into account in estimating Balance of Payments.

1. THE TRADE POSITION

This Bulletin relates to the recorded overseas trade of Australia (see notes on page 2) for the month of December, 1958 and the six months ended December, 1958. Figures for these periods are subject to revision.

Imports of Merchandise in December, 1958 were valued at £A64,812,000 compared with £A62,026,000 in December, 1957, an increase of £A2,786,000.

Exports of Merchandise in December, 1958 were valued at £A74,613,000 compared with £A70,234,000 in December, 1957, an increase of £A4,379,000.

Imports of Merchandise for the six months ended December, 1958 were valued at £A404,271,000 compared with £A393,461,000 for the six months ended December, 1957, an increase of £A10,810,000.

Exports of Merchandise for the six months ended December, 1958 were valued at £A377,171,000 compared with £A451,822,000 for the six months ended December, 1957, a decrease of £A74,651,000.

The table below shows the overseas trade in merchandise and in bullion and specie for the periods under review.
