PRODUCTION STATISTICS : JULY 1973

This bulletin contains statistics of production in Australia of mines and factory products. Production statistics for the Australian Capital Territory and the Northern Territory are included. An alphabetical index of these products is given on pages 2, 3, 4 and 5.

2 The following details are shown for each product :

- (a) Annual totals for the latest three complete financial years;
- (b) Monthly details for each of the latest fourteen months;
- (c) Cumulative totals from July 1973 to date;
- (d) Cumulative totals for the corresponding period twelve months earlier.



3 The monthly figures are based for the most part on returns collected by the Deputy Commonwealth Statisticians. Where another authority is the source, this is shown in a footnote. Monthly figures from July 1971 onwards may be revised when the results of the Annual Factory Census for 1971-72 become available.

4 The commodity production data contained in this bulletin were collected from those establishments classified to division C (Manufacturing) as defined in the Australian Standard Industrial Classification, Preliminary Edition 1969, Vol. 1. Commodity production data was also collected from those mining, retail and wholesale establishments with sales and transfers out of goods of own manufacture in excess of \$10,000.

5 Further details in respect of many of the items will be found on an annual basis in the bulletin *Manufacturing Commodities - Principal Articles Produced* (Reference No. 12.26) and on a monthly basis, in the *Monthly Production Summaries* (Reference No. 12.16), issued by this Bureau.

6 The bulletin contains seasonally adjusted statistics of several items. In the seasonal adjustment, account has been taken not only of normal seasonal factors but also of "trading-day" effects (arising from the varying numbers of Sundays, Mondays, Tuesdays, etc. in the month) and the influence of Easter and Australia Day which may, in successive years, affect figures for different months. Details of the methods used in seasonally adjusting these and other series are given in *Seasonally Adjusted Indicators 1973* (Reference No. 1.10) issued on 3 August 1973.

7 Most items are identified by Commodity Codes which are derived from the Commodity Classification used in the Australian Factory Statistics. In some cases where data is derived from sources other than Factory Collections, no Commodity Code is shown.

- r. Figures or series revised since previous issue.
- Nil or less than half of the final digit shown.
- Break in continuity of series (where drawn across a column).

- NOTE. 1. Any discrepancies between totals and sums of components in tables are due to rounding.
