EXPLANATORY NOTES

This bulletin is one of a series of eight publications containing monthly and quarterly production statistics. The titles of the other publications of this series are shown in paragraph 7 below. These publications replace the *Production Summaries* series (Ref. No. 12.16) and the publication *Production Statistics* (Ref. No. 12.14) issued previously.

2. Data contained in this bulletin are mostly based on monthly or quarterly collections conducted by the Australian Bureau of Statistics (ABS). Where another authority is the source this is indicated in a footnote.

3. Most items are identified by Commodity Codes of the Commodity Classification used in Australian manufacturing statistics. However in cases where data are derived from sources other than ABS collections no commodity code is shown.

4. As from July 1975 production statistics collected by ABS exclude production of single establishment manufacturing enterprises employing less than four persons and production of establishments predominantly engaged in non-manufacturing activities but which may carry on, in a minor way, some manufacturing. However, except for a few commodities the effect on production levels and movements is marginal. An indication of the approximate magnitude of the break in comparability may be obtained by comparing annual data for 1974-75 which are shown in this publication on both the old and the new basis.

5. Annual figures shown in this publication are derived by aggregating monthly/quarterly production and relate to production during the year ended 30 June. They may differ from annual manufacturing census data which relate to the census year, and in the case of businesses unable to report on a June year basis include details in respect of substitute accounting periods.

6. This bulletin contains seasonally adjusted statistics of several items. In the seasonal adjustment, account has been taken not only of normal seasonal factors but also of "trading-day" effects (arising from the varying numbers of Sundays, Mondays, Tuesdays

etc. in the month) and the influence of Easter and Australia Day which may, in successive years, affect figures for different months. Details of the methods used in seasonally adjusting this and other series are given in *Seasonally Adjusted Indicators 1977* (1308.0).
