CORRIGENDUM

BIRTH EXPECTATIONS OF MARRIED WOMEN - NOVEMBER 1976 (Catalogue No. 3215.0, issued on 8 June 1979)

In tables 1, 2, 3 and 13, figures are presented of women classified according to 'labour force status' (i.e. self-employed, employee, unemployed, and not in labour force). These figures are derived from a question seeking information about the main activity of the respondent in the week preceding the interview, and differ from the estimates of employment, unemployment and the labour force regularly compiled by the ABS, which also take into account activities in the preceding month, part-time work and other factors.

Footnote (c) of Table 13, page 19 implies that the bases of the classifications are the same. This is not so.

Estimates using the standard definition of the labour force classification are being prepared and will be available from the contacts indicated on the top of page 1 of the publication.

BIRTH EXPECTATIONS OF MARRIED WOMEN, NOVEMBER 1976

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MAIN FEATURES

In November 1976, 20.8 per cent of married women, aged under 40 and without children, expected to have no children, 6.4 per cent expected one child, 50.7 per cent expected 2 children, and 22.1 per cent expected 3 or more. The proportions for married women under 40 who had already had one or more children, were 76.0 per cent expected no more children, 17.1 per cent expected one additional child, 5.5 per cent expected 2 additional children and 1.4 per cent expected three or more additional children.

There was a clear preference for two-child families; of married women under 40 with no children 50.7 per cent expected two children, of those with one child already born 49.6 per cent expected one more, and of those who already had two children 84.6 per cent expected no more.

Expectation of additional children is dependent on the number of children already born to a woman and, to a lesser extent, the sex-composition of these children. Among married women who had had two children, 19.9 per cent of those with children of the same sex expected an additional child. This compares with 13.9 per cent among those with one child of each sex.

By adding together the number of children the women in the survey had had and the number of children they expected to have, an indication can be given of the total number of children (already born and expected to be born) of these women. The average number of actual and expected children of married women near the end of their child-bearing period, i.e. aged 35 to 39 years, was estimated at 2.9 compared with 2.3 at ages 15-19 and 20-24, 2.4 at ages 25-29 and 2.6 at ages 30-34. The average for all married women under 40 was 2.5.

EXPLANATORY NOTES

Introduction

This publication contains results of a survey in November 1976 of the child-bearing histories and birth expectations of ever-married women in Australia. The survey was conducted as a supplement to the regular quarterly Population Survey. Questions were directed to women under the age of 40 who were married, widowed or divorced. Information was obtained about the birth date and sex of each child and the number of children still living. Women married at the time of the survey were asked how many more children they expected to have altogether and in the next five years, and when they expected the next child to be born. Information on number of children expected in the next five years is not presented in this bulletin, but is available on request.

The survey was the first to be undertaken on this topic by the Australian Bureau of Statistics. A preliminary bulletin (Catalogue No. 3213.0), issued in December 1977, contained summary results. This

bulletin provides greater detail using an improved estimation base and imputation for certain items. A second survey is planned for June 1979. The results will allow comparisons to be made with the November 1976 survey.

Scope

The Population Survey is based on a multi-stage area sample of dwellings covering about two-thirds of one per cent of the population of Australia. The information was obtained by carefully chosen and specially trained interviewers, the interviews being carried out over four weeks. Members of the permanent defence forces and diplomatic personnel were excluded. Also excluded from the November 1976 survey were women in hospital and women living in institutions. Birth expectations questions were not asked of widowed and divorced women.

Estimation

To obtain the preliminary estimates which were published in December 1977, ratio estimation procedures were used based on benchmarks of the female population in the required age, State or Territory and regional categories, derived from 1971 Census figures updated in accordance with subsequent deaths and net migration. For the final estimates, revised benchmarks were used based on the preliminary results of the 1976 Population Census adjusted for under-enumeration and classified by marital status. The procedure ensures that the final survey estimates conform to an independent estimate of ever-married women classified by age and sex and thus compensates for any inherent under-enumeration or over-enumeration in the sample.

Reliability of the estimates

The technical note shown as Attachment I to this bulletin gives a brief explanation of the measures of the likely difference of the estimates from the figures that would have been produced from a full count.

The imprecision due to sampling variability, which is measured by the standard error, should be distinguished from inaccuracies that may occur because of imperfections in reporting by interviewers, and respondents, and in office coding and processing. Inaccuracies of this kind are referred to as the non-sampling error, and they may occur in any enumeration, whether it be a full count or only a sample. Every effort is made to reduce the non-sampling error to a minimum by careful design of questionnaires, intensive training and supervision of interviewers and efficient operating procedures.

The results of the survey may also be affected by a number of other factors and the following points should be specially noted:

- (a) If, as is likely, child-bearing histories and birth expectations of women in hospital differ from those of other married women of the same age and living in the same area, the exclusion of women in institutions can bias the survey

results. For instance, the average hospital stay for childbirth may be between seven and eight days. This would account for an average of about 4,000 married women in hospital – away from home – for childbirth at any time. The omission of these women, equivalent to about 30 survey respondents, may not have a significant effect on the survey results overall; but it should be kept in mind that this could affect certain results, such as the number of women who had a child in the preceding 12 months, and who expected a child in the following 12 months.

- (b) The limiting of the survey to married women affects the survey results in other ways. For instance, the estimated numbers of married women who expected to have a child within twelve months of the survey date (180,000) is well below the estimated number of nuptial confinements in 1977 (201,135). While expectations may or may not be actually realised, a significant reason for the difference is that many women with nuptial births in 1977 were not yet married in November 1976. Others may have been overseas, including women subsequently migrating to Australia. For these reasons, the difference between the figures cannot be taken as a measure of error or bias in the survey.
- (c) Out of about 10,800 married women aged 15 to 39 selected for interview, 610, or 5.6 per cent, failed to provide any usable answers, mainly because a personal interview could not be arranged. In addition, there were women who failed to answer one or more questions. The women who could not be interviewed in private dwellings, as well as any women in institutions, were dropped from the survey and the expansion factors were adjusted accordingly. The women who provided no answers or unsatisfactory answers in response to individual questions remained in the survey.
- (d) There is some evidence that inaccurate information provided by respondents has affected data relating to duration of marriage, particularly where the marriage date was close to the date of the birth of the first child. Statistics derived from birth registration indicate that first nuptial births within twelve months of marriage have for many years now exceeded first nuptial births in the second year of marriage. The reverse is shown by the survey results. A precise comparison cannot be made since the first nuptial births to women covered by the survey cannot be identified in the annual births statistics. It is also likely that additional inaccuracies are introduced through imputation of date of marriage referred to below. Because of these two sources of inaccuracies, figures on duration of marriage contained in Tables 14, 15 and 16 need to be used with caution.

Imputation

In a small number of cases, missing information about the respondent's age, number of children, etc. was imputed from related details of the respondent. Where imputation was not possible, 'not stated' categories were carried into the tabulation.

All questions regarding the number of expected children were expressed to allow the answers 'one or two', 'two or three' etc. The statistics shown in this bulletin have these cases evenly allocated to the two numbers involved in each case.

The date of birth (month and year) of each woman was imputed from given age (in years). Details of the month and year of birth are required for the calculation of age at marriage and at the birth of a child. Similarly, date of marriage (month and year) was imputed from the duration of marriage which was supplied in completed years.

Imputed date of birth and date of marriage (month and year) were necessary for the estimation of:

- (a) age of woman at time of first marriage
- (b) number of children of the current marriage
- (c) interval between marriage and first child.

In these estimations account was taken of relevant information available from birth registration statistics. This information includes the seasonal patterns of births and marriages, the recorded intervals between marriages and nuptial births, and the occurrence of ex-nuptial births. Further information on the methods of imputation and estimation is available from the Australian Bureau of Statistics.

In all these cases, although the adjusted values have been shown in this bulletin, the original values remain in the record and tabulations can be made on either basis.

Interpretation of results

When referring to the scope of the survey, attention was drawn to the effects of confining the survey to women aged 15 to 39 and married at the time of the survey. More generally, the interpretation of results, particularly of the more complex classifications by age and duration of marriage, should be made with care, keeping in mind the need for imputation and the correlation existing between the age of the mother, the duration of marriage and the number of children.

Items of information

Items tabulated in this statement include age, birthplace, marital status, duration of marriage, number of children already born (live-born only), number of (additional) children expected, intervals between successive children, expected interval to the next birth, sex of surviving children, State and type of locality (metropolitan/non-metropolitan), and labour force

status. These and other items covered in the survey are listed in Attachment II with a brief description and details of the classifications where appropriate.

ATTACHMENT II

ITEMS OF INFORMATION AND CLASSIFICATIONS

The following items were obtained direct or imputed from the survey results. All data are on tape and tables can be produced if required. Details of imputation methods may also be obtained on request.

AGE OF WOMAN – in completed years at the date of the survey (15-39 years).

BIRTHDATE OF WOMAN – the month and year of birth was imputed to facilitate estimation of the mother's age at marriage and at the birth of a child.

COUNTRY OF BIRTH OF WOMAN – approximately 90 countries, or groups of countries, are identified.

YEAR OF ARRIVAL OF WOMAN IN AUSTRALIA – for overseas-born respondents.

OCCUPATION OF WOMAN – the classification used is : not in the labour force; looking for work; employer, self-employed, unpaid helper in family business; professional, technical, administrative, executive and managerial employees; clerical and sales employees; farmers, fishermen, hunters, timber getters, miners, quarrymen, etc. (employees); transport and communication employees; tradesmen and production (employees); storemen, packers, labourers; service, sport and recreation employees; inadequately described or 'not stated' employees.

HOURS WORKED BY WOMAN – this applies to the week preceding the survey and allows identification of women working part-time (i.e. less than 35 hours per week). The classification is in single hours.

DURATION OF MARRIAGE OF WOMAN – duration of the current marriage only, in completed years of marriage.

MARRIAGE DATE OF WOMAN – the month and year of marriage was imputed to facilitate estimation of various intervals involving date of the marriage.

NUMBER OF CHILDREN ALREADY BORN – live-born children only.

NUMBER OF SURVIVING CHILDREN – live-born children still living at the time of the survey.

NUMBER OF CHILDREN OF THE CURRENT MARRIAGE – this number refers to live-born children whose birth occurred in or after the (imputed) month and year of marriage of the mother.

COUNTRY OF BIRTH OF CHILDREN – numbers born overseas or in Australia respectively. The numbers are imputed by comparing the date of birth of a child with its mother's year of arrival in Australia.

BIRTHDATE OF EACH CHILD – month and year in order from the youngest to the oldest. For families of 8 or more children, date of birth is imputed for children other than the youngest and the six eldest.

SEX OF FIRST TWO CHILDREN – where there are two or more children.

SEX OF ALL CHILDREN – where there are 2 to 6 children. The classification is : all boys, all girls, boy(s) and girl(s).

NUMBER OF EXPECTED CHILDREN – the classification used is : none, one, at least one, one or two, two, two or three, three, three or four, four, four or five, five or more, not stated.

NUMBER OF EXPECTED CHILDREN (ADJUSTED) – "one or two", "two or three" etc. were allocated evenly to the two numbers involved in each case, and "not stated" was allocated proportionately.

NUMBER OF CHILDREN EXPECTED IN NEXT FIVE YEARS – classified in the same way as "expected children".

NUMBER OF CHILDREN EXPECTED IN NEXT FIVE YEARS (ADJUSTED) – "one or two", "two or three" etc. allocated evenly to the two numbers involved in each case.

EXPECTED INTERVAL TO NEXT CHILD – the classification used is : within 12 months, 1 to less than 2 years, 2 to less than 3 years, 3 to less than 4 years, 4 to less than 5 years, 5 years or more, not stated.

EXPECTED COMPLETED FAMILY SIZE – sum of live-born children and expected children.

AGE OF YOUNGEST CHILD – in completed years at the time of the survey.

BIRTH INTERVAL FROM FIRST TO LATEST CHILD – in months. This relates to live-born children, whether surviving or not.

DURATION OF MARRIAGE AT BIRTH OF FIRST CHILD – in months. This is calculated for women married once only and relies on the imputed month of marriage.

AGE OF WOMAN AT CURRENT MARRIAGE – in completed years. This is calculated from the imputed date of marriage and imputed birthdate.

INTERVALS BETWEEN CHILDREN'S BIRTHS – in months; from first to second, second to third etc.
