

ESTIMATED RESIDENT POPULATION AND AREA, QUEENSLAND, 1988

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MAIN FEATURES

- The estimated resident population of Queensland at 30 June 1988 was 2,743,765 persons, a rise of 67,000 or 2.5 per cent since 30 June 1987.
- Moreton Statistical Division experienced the largest absolute increase (27,136 or 6.4 per cent) closely followed by Brisbane Statistical Division (24,945 or 2.1 per cent). Significant growth also occurred in Far North Statistical Division (5,845 or 3.5 per cent) and Wide Bay-Burnett Statistical Division (3,603 or 2.1 per cent). Small population declines occurred in South-West Statistical Division (-24 or -0.1 per cent) and Central-West Statistical Division (-20 or -0.1 per cent). North-West, the other predominantly rural western Statistical Division, experienced a small increase (184 or 0.5 per cent).
- The Gold Coast-Tweed Statistical District grew by 15,881 or 7.2 per cent. Strong growth was also experienced in Sunshine Coast Statistical District (5,499 or 6.1 per cent) and Cairns Statistical District (3,313 or 4.5 per cent).
- Albert Shire recorded the largest increase of any local government area with a rise of 11,640 or 11.2 per cent. Other significant increases in South-East Queensland occurred in Logan City (6,103 or 4.8 per cent), Gold Coast City (5,490 or 4.5 per cent), Redland Shire (4,815 or 7.5 per cent) and Caboolture Shire (4,237 or 8.1 per cent). In the remainder of Queensland, the largest increases occurred in the coastal areas of Mulgrave Shire (2,913 or 6.9 per cent), Thuringowa City (1,405 or 4.3 per cent) and Hervey Bay City (1,377 or 7.0 per cent).

Explanatory Notes

Australian Standard Geographical Classification (ASGC)

The data in this publication are presented according to the Australian Standard Geographical Classification (ASGC), Edition 6.

2. *Legal local government areas (LGAs)*, as defined under the *Local Government Act 1936-1988*, are spatial units which represent the geographical areas of incorporated local government councils, such as Cities (C), Towns (T), and Shires (S).

3. *Statistical local areas (SLAs)* are the smallest types of spatial units in the ASGC for which estimates of the resident population are presented. They correspond either to legal local government areas (LGAs), as defined under the *Local Government Act 1936-1988*, or to suburbs in certain urban legal LGAs. Some legal LGAs are split into two or more parts, with each part forming a separate spatial unit. The unincorporated area of Queensland also forms a SLA. In aggregate, SLAs cover the whole of the State without gaps or overlaps.

4. *Statistical subdivisions (SSDs)* consist of one or more SLAs.

5. *Statistical divisions*, which are groupings of SLAs, are designed to be relatively homogeneous regions characterised by identifiable social and economic units within the region. The Brisbane Statistical Division comprises the Cities of Brisbane, Ipswich, Logan and Redcliffe, the Shire of Redland and parts of the Shires of Albert, Beaudesert, Caboolture, Moreton and Pine Rivers.

6. *Statistical districts* have been defined around selected urban areas to provide comparable statistics over a period of time. These districts, which are intended to contain the anticipated urban spread for at least 20 years, are generally defined as having a population of 25,000 or more and experiencing urban growth beyond the legal LGA boundaries.

7. Areas shown are from information supplied by the Queensland Surveyor-General. The conventions followed in the rounding of areas are:

Statistical subdivisions and statistical local areas	- To the nearest square kilometre
Statistical divisions	- To the nearest 10 square kilometres
State total	- To the nearest 1,000 square kilometres

Population Estimates

8. The ABS releases population census figures on three different bases: the census count at place of enumeration, the census count at place of usual residence and the estimated resident population. The *census count at place of enumeration* is based on the actual location of persons on census night. The *census count at place of usual residence* is based on the reported usual residence of all persons enumerated on census night.

9. The *estimated resident population (ERP)* at 30 June 1986 for each SLA, is the official ABS population estimate which is derived by making two further adjustments to the census count at place of usual residence. The first is an adjustment of census underenumeration as measured by the Post-enumeration Survey. Adjustments at the SLA level were calculated separately for Brisbane Statistical Division and Balance of State and took into account differences in underenumeration by age, sex and birthplace (Australian-born/overseas-born). More detailed explanations of this process are available on request. The second adjustment is the addition of Australian residents temporarily overseas at census date. This second adjustment is made down to SLA level and is obtained by analysis of the passenger cards which all persons arriving in or departing from Australia must complete. This produces an accurate estimate of the usual resident population of Australia and of each State/Territory and SLA.

10. For each geographical area, estimates of resident population for intercensal years are calculated by taking into account changes in a number of statistical variables which indicate population change. These include natural increase, pension and family allowance information, number of dwelling units, electoral enrolments, school enrolments and medicare registrations. A linear regression model is used to assist in making the estimates.

Reliability

11. Although estimates of resident population are shown to the nearest unit, accuracy to this level is not claimed and should not be assumed.
