This piece of land called Samarara and Saumbarapa, commencing on the sea coast from a cement block, thence 27 chains E.S.E, thence South 1 pt West 3 chains, then W.N.W 13 chains then S 1° W 10 chains, then W.N.W 13 chains to the sea coast then back along the sea coast 13 chains to the point of commencement.

This is a small piece of 1st class land, at present used for a copra station by J.A.Wilson.

There is no fresh water except wells at sea coast.

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DESCRIPTION OF LAND AT NEW HEBRIDES. RECORD NO. 17.

MALO

Describing these pieces or parcels of land called "Sanarora" and "Saumbarabo" on the west side of the Island of Malo to the North East of the Mission Station at a distance of about three hundred yards to a marked tree on the beach from thence about South East about four hundred yards, then north east for two hundred yards to a path running about South East, thence along that path one hundred and fifty yards to a marked tree and coral wall, thence along that coral wall for three hundred yards to the North East boundry from thence following the said wall to a marked tree on the beach, from thence along the shore to the marked tree from which we begun containing about 40 acres more or less.

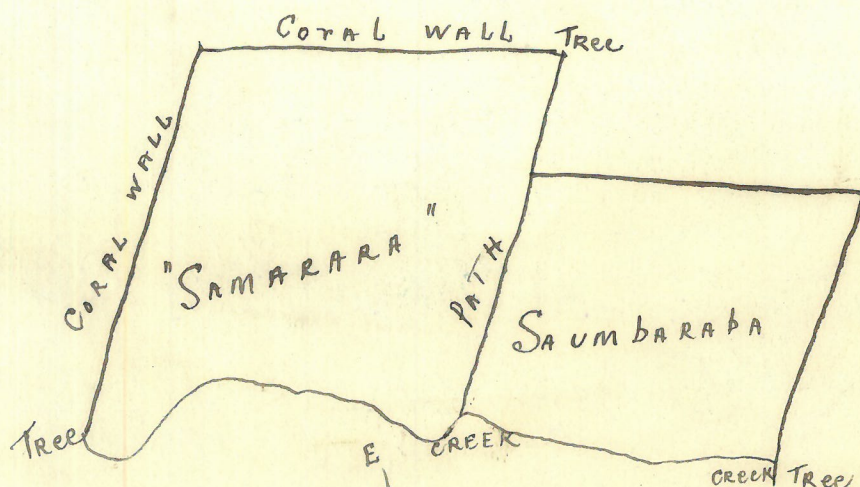

That piece of land called Matoeamila on the N.W side of Malo commencing from a cement block on the sea coast, then 23 chains along the sea coast to cement block, then 35 chains South East, thence S.W 43 chains to a dry creek, then 49 chains to point of commencement.

This is a very nice piece of land with very rich soil, all timbered country, at present the natives are planting yams on it and they use the best land they can get for that purpose.

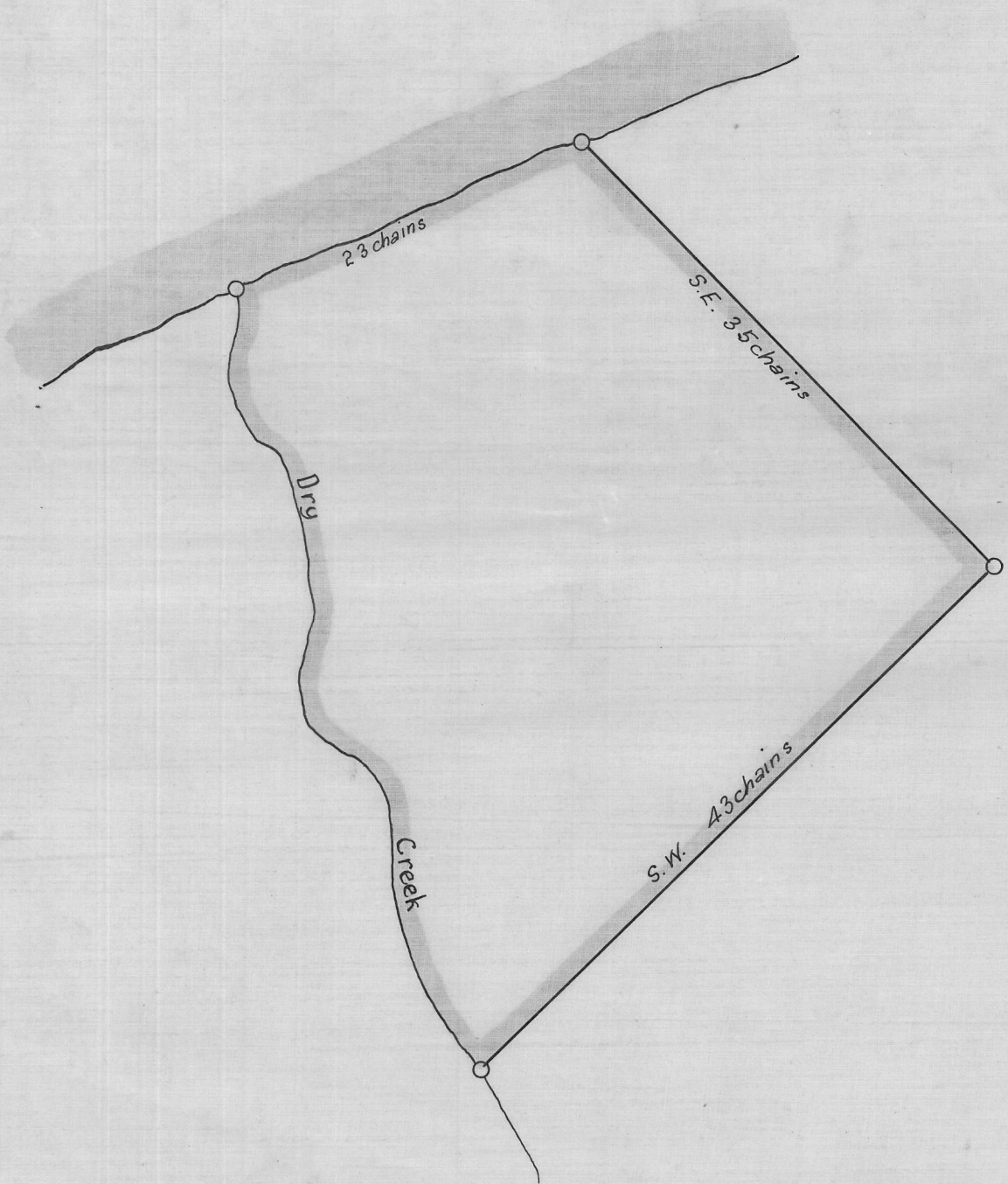

SCALE 10 CHAINS TO ONE INCH



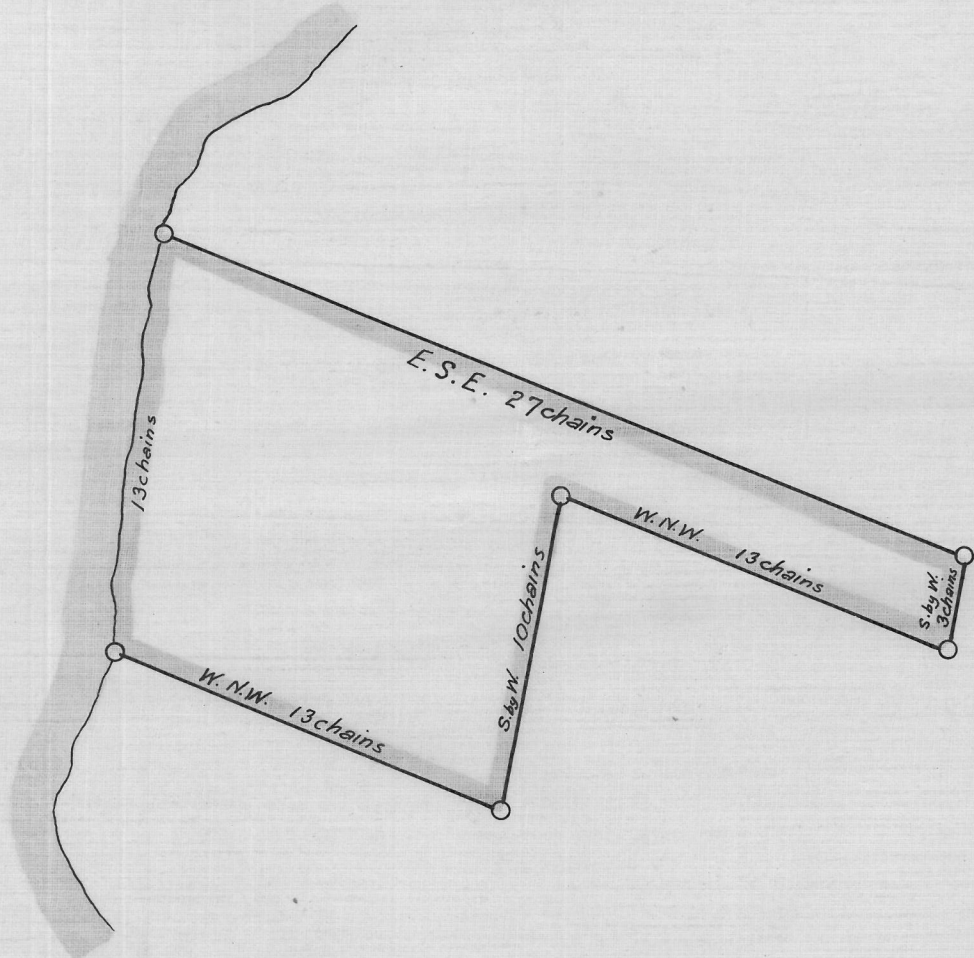
