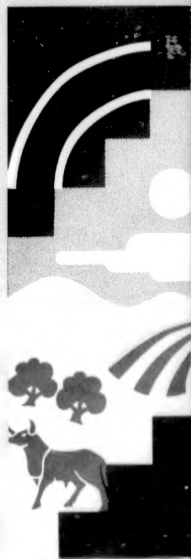

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EXPLANATORY NOTES

1. Introduction

This publication contains statistics on agricultural commodities for the year ended 31 March 1987, together with comparative information for earlier years. The source of the statistics is the census of agricultural establishments conducted throughout Australia at 31 March each year. A specimen of the 1986-87 form is shown in Appendix A.

2. Scope

(a) Establishments which make only a small contribution to overall agricultural production are excluded from the scope of the census. From 1986-87, establishments with an estimated value of agricultural operations (EVAO) less than \$20,000 are excluded (previously those establishments with an EVAO less than \$2,500 were excluded).

(b) This change in scope means that the current census results are not directly comparable to previously published results from past censuses. To assist users in making comparisons, selected data from the 1985-86 census have been presented in bridging tables 1 and 2 on both the old and new basis. Tables 3 to 16 are on the new basis. Data contained in these tables for years prior to 1986-87 have been adjusted to exclude the contribution of establishments with an EVAO less than \$20,000.

(c) Limited data is collected for establishments with an EVAO of between \$5,000 and \$19,999. Counts of establishments in this category, by industry, are shown for Statistical Divisions and selected Subdivisions in table 17.

3. Statistical Areas of N.S.W.

(a) This bulletin contains small area data presented according to the Australian Standard Geographical Classification (ASGC) Edition 3. For further information refer to Appendix B. Statistical boundaries are shown on the maps inside the back cover.

(b) Due to changes to Local Government Area boundaries, care should be taken if comparing statistics for these areas over time. All changes which have occurred between 1 April 1986 and 31 March 1987 are shown in Appendix C of this publication. When changes have occurred, the data for the 1986-87 season relate to boundaries of these areas as at 31 March 1987.

4. Structure of the Agricultural Sector (Tables 15, 16 and 17)

(a) **Industry classification**
The economic units within the agricultural sector have been classified in accordance with methodology used in the 1983 edition of the Australian Standard Industrial Classification (ASIC) (Catalogue No. 1201.1).

(b) The ASIC group and class codes of agricultural units are determined annually by assessing that units *predominant activity* and then attributing to it the ASIC group and class appropriate to that activity. Part of this operation involves the valuing of crop and livestock data reported by each unit and the aggregation of derived values for all crop and livestock activity is termed *Estimated Value of Agricultural Operations (EVAO)*.

(c) The valuation procedure used to determine the EVAO is designed to be applicable **ONLY FOR INDUSTRY CODING AND SIZE VALUATION PURPOSES**. It is not a true indicator of receipts obtained by units nor of the value of agricultural commodities produced by establishments with agricultural activity in a particular year.

(d) A list of industries in the 1983 edition of ASIC which relate to 'Subdivision 01 : Agriculture' is provided in Appendix D to this bulletin.

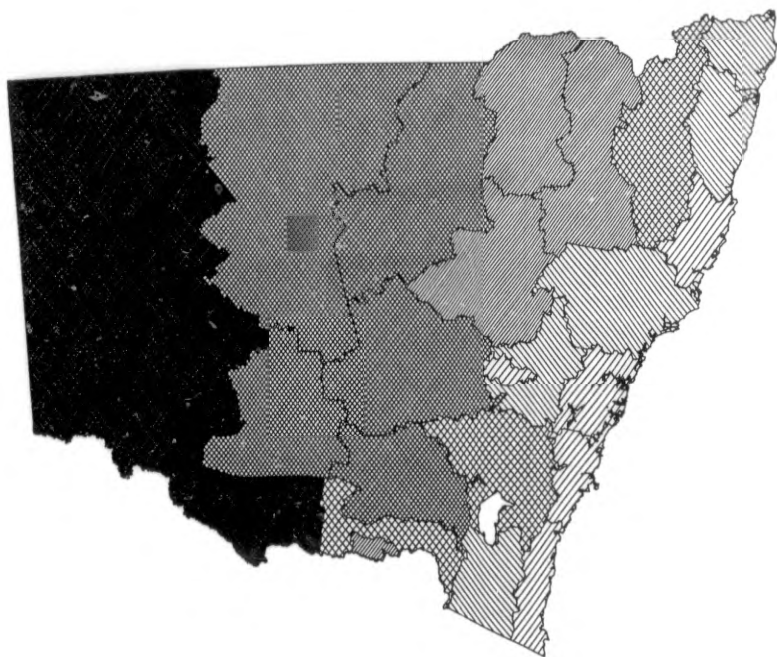

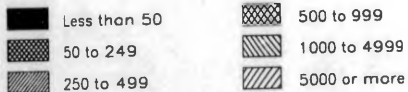
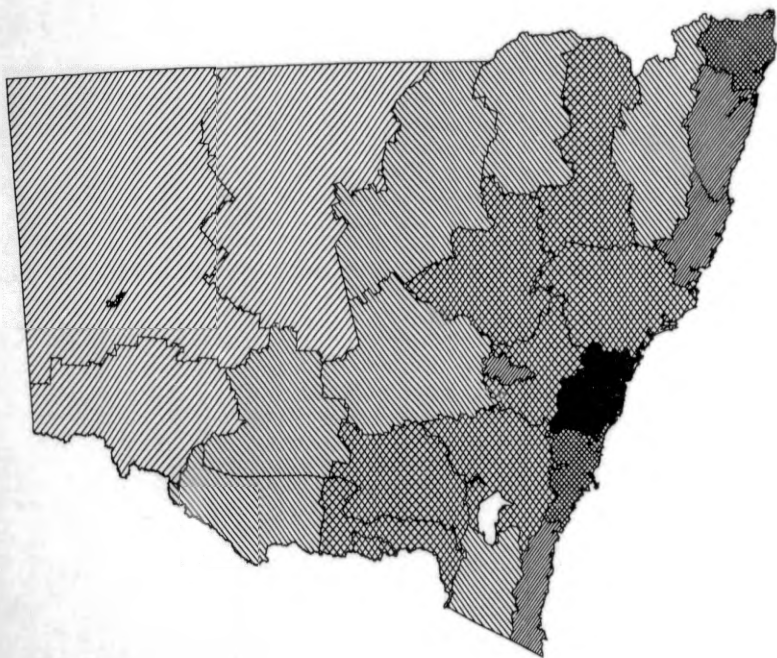

AGRICULTURAL ACTIVITY AT 31 MARCH 1987 (a)**

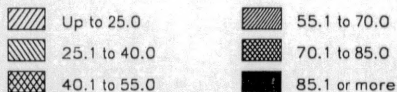
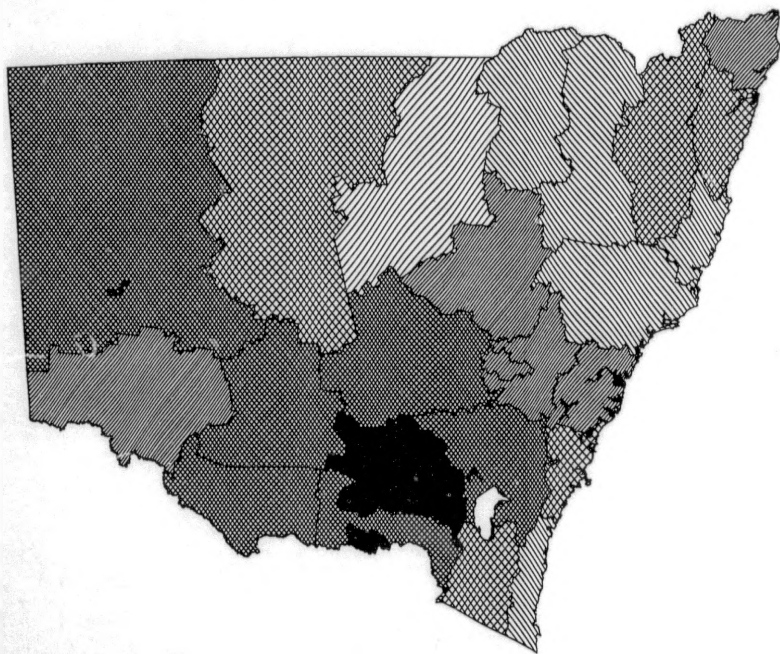

APPENDIX B

STATISTICAL AREAS OF NEW SOUTH WALES

This bulletin contains data presented according to the Australian Standard Geographical Classification (ASGC) Edition 3. Under this classification, statistical areas are defined as follows:

STATISTICAL LOCAL AREAS (SLAs). These geographic areas are in most cases either identical with, or have been aggregated to, the previously published whole or part legal Local Government Areas (LGAs) as defined under the (State) Local Government Act 1919 and comprising cities (C), municipalities (M) and shires (S). In other cases, they are identical to each previously published unincorporated area. In aggregate, SLAs cover the whole of the state without gaps or overlaps.

STATISTICAL SUBDIVISIONS (SDs). These consist of one or more SLAs and form the intermediate size spatial unit for the presentation of regional data.

STATISTICAL DIVISIONS (SDs). These consist of one or more Statistical Subdivisions (SSDs). Where SSDs are not shown for statistical purposes, statistical local areas are shown ordered alphabetically within statistical divisions. The divisions are designed to be relatively homogeneous regions characterised by identifiable social and economic units within the region, under the unifying influence of one or more major towns or cities.

STATISTICAL DISTRICTS. To provide comparable statistics over a period of time, statistical districts have been defined around selected urban centres, with a population of 25,000 or more, experiencing urban growth beyond the legal local government area boundaries. Those districts are intended to contain the anticipated urban spread over the next 20 years.

Further information concerning statistical areas is contained in the publication *Regional Statistics, New South Wales, 1987* issue (1304.1) and in the publication *Australian Standard Geographical Classification* (1216.0)

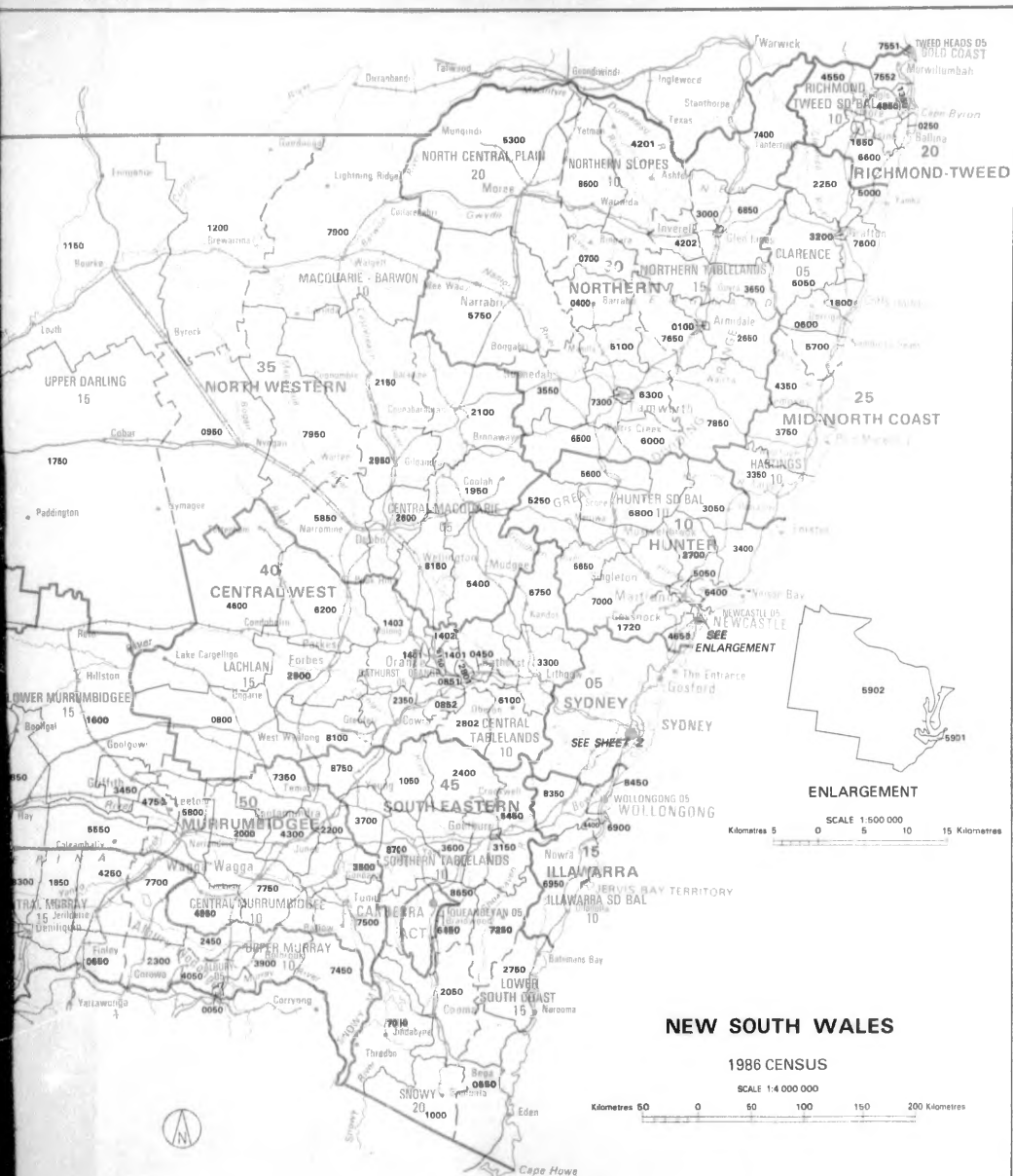

More recent statistics are available in the *Monthly Summary of Statistics*. *Regional Statistics* presents a selection of the more important statistics available for geographical areas of the State.
