AUSTRALIAN CYCLOSA TRADE.

October, 1935.

The Cycloso Trade of Australia for the month of October, 1935, which has been made available by the Commonwealth Statistician (Mr. E.T. McPhoe) shows an increase in both Imports and Exports of Merchandise compared with October, 1934. Imports were higher in value by 14.0 per cent. (Estg. 7,575,000 in October 1935, as against Estg. 6,422,000 in October 1934), and Exports were higher by 19.2 per cent. (Estg. 9,499,000 in October 1935, as against Estg. 7,966,000 in October 1934).

The favourable commodity balance of trade of October 1935 was Estg. 1,923,000 compared with a favourable commodity balance of Estg. 1,546,000 in October 1934. The unfavourable commodity balance of trade during September 1935 was Estg. 135,000.

Including Bullion and Specie the favourable balance for October 1935 was Estg. 2,738,000, as compared with a favourable balance of Estg. 2,090,000 for October 1934.

The figures for the four months July to October 1935 show an improvement in comparison with the same months of the previous year, inasmuch as against the adverse commodity balance of Estg. 3,207,000 for the four months of 1934-35, the later period shows a similar balance reduced to Estg. 2,301,000. With bullion and specie taken into account an improvement of Estg. 1,474,000 is shown, the adverse balance of Estg. 994,000 for the four months of 1934-35 being converted into a favourable balance of Estg. 480,000.

IMPORTS - COMPARED WITH PREVIOUS PERIOD.

(a) October 1935 and October 1934. Imports of the following classes of goods (values in British Currency) increased in October 1935, as compared with October 1934:- Class II - Foodstuffs of Vegetable Origin, £300,000, as against £209,000; Class IV - Tobacco and preparations, £127,000 (£116,000); Class VI - Animal Substances, £140,000 (£114,000); Class VIII (a) - Apparel and Attire, £143,000 (£116,000); Class VIII (b) - Textiles, £1,153,000 (£1,133,000); Class VIII (c) - Yarns and Manufactured Fibres, £297,000 (£238,000); Class XI, £263,000 (£257,000); Class XII (a) - Machines and Machinery, £797,000 (£591,000); Class XII (b) - Metals and Manufactures, £1,292,000 (£1,083,000); Class XIII - Rubber and Leather, £38,000 (£36,000); Class XIV - Wood and Paper, £212,000 (£195,000); Class XV - Earthenware, Cements, China, etc., £162,000 (£139,000); Class XVI - Paper and Stationery, £216,000 (£266,000); Class XVII - Jewellery, etc., £145,000 (£112,000); Class XVIII - Optical and Scientific Instruments, £11,000 (£21,000); Class XIX - Drugs and Chemicals, £350,000 (£338,000); Class XX - Miscellaneous, £21,000 (£235,000); and Class XXI - Bullion and Specie, £238,000 (£201,000).

EXPORTS - COMPARISON WITH PREVIOUS PERIODS.

(a) October 1935 and October 1934. Exports of Merchandise (values in Australian currency) were £2,11,395,000 in October 1935 and £2,2,380,000 in October 1934. Exports of Bullion and Specie in the same months were, respectively, £2,1,317,000 and £2,231,000. The total exports in October 1935 were £2,13,212,000, compared with £2,10,311,000, an increase of 21.1 per cent.

The principal commodities to show an increase in the value of exports in October 1935, as compared with October 1934 were:- Butter, £1,042,000 as against £357,000; Frozen lamb, 2756,000 (£2503,000); Currants, 221,000 (£2,000); Barley, 230,000 (£23,000); Wheat, £1,131,000 (£1,148,000); Jam and Jellies, £15,000 (£24,000); Calf, Cattle and Horse Hides, 280,000 (£247,000); Rabbit and Hare Skins, £131,000 (£260,000); Sheep Skins, 2301,000 (£179,000); Wool, greasy, £4,436,000 (£25,412,000); Wool, scoured, £51,000 (£238,000); Silver and Silver lead Ores and Concentrates, 235,000 (£130); Fine Ores, 233,000 (£12,000); Lead, Pig, 2310,000 (£2236,000); Zinc bars, blocks, 206,000 (£340,000); Leather, 263,000 (£246,000); Timber, 269,000 (£25,000); Gold, £1,193,000 (£271,000); and silver, 2153,000 (£20,000).

The principal commodities to show a decrease were:- Eggs, £2297,000 (£322,000); Frozen beef, £180,000 (£136,000); Frozen mutton, 234,000 (£276,000); Rabbits and Hares, £11,000 (£31,000); Milk and Cream, 263,000 (£20,000); Raisins, 245,000 (£267,000); Citrus fruits, 224,000 (£246,000); Bran, pollard and sharps, 222,000 (£272,000); Flour, 2434,000 (£2435,000); Sugar, 2201,000 (£2325,000); Opium skins, 24,000 (£28,000); Tallow, 232,000 (£111,000); and Arms, Ammunition etc., 214,000 (£34,000).

(b) Four Months July-October 1935 and July-October 1934. In the four months ended 31st October 1935, exports of Merchandise (values in Australian Currency) were:- £A.31,808,000, compared with £A.27,069,000 in the corresponding four months of 1934. Bullion and Specie shipped abroad in the two periods were, respectively, £A.4,271,000 and £A.3,561,000.

Marked increases were recorded in the value of exports of the following principal commodities during July-October 1935, compared with July-October 1934. Butter, £1,997,000, compared with £1,909,000; Frozen lamb, £1,053,000 (£362,000); Meats preserved in tins, £73,000 (£39,000); Sausage casings, £102,000 (£31,000); Currants, £131,000 (£75,000); Flour, £1,562,000 (£1,523,000); Wine, £410,000 (£305,000); Calf, cattle and horse hides, £256,000 (£136,000); Kangaroo and Wallaby Skins, £115,000 (£76,000); Rabbit and Hare Skins, £908,000 (£473,000); Sheepskins, £903,000 (£516,000); Wool, greasy, £3,001,000 (£6,077,000); Wool, scoured, £1,854,000 (£1,352,000); Wool tops, £151,000 (£76,000); Zinc ores and concentrates, £108,000 (£48,000); Lead pig, £1,408,000 (£336,000); Zinc bars etc., £319,000 (£161,000); Leather, £195,000 (£168,000); Gold, £3,910,000 (£3,396,000); and Silver, £361,000 (£164,000).

Marked Decreases were recorded in the value of the following principal commodities:- Eggs, £653,000 (£761,000); Frozen beef, £110,000 (£341,000); Frozen mutton, £4,000 (£264,000); Rabbits and Hares, £143,000 (£358,000); Milk and Cream, £155,000 (£212,000); Fodders, £16,000 (£45,000); Raisins, £371,000 (£487,000); Citrus fruits, £149,000 (£180,000); Barley, £107,000 (£126,000); Wheat, £3,270,000 (£3,622,000); Bran, pollard and sharps, £71,000 (£153,000); Sugar, £1,612,000 (£1,380,000); Opossum skins, £13,000 (£113,000); Pearlshell, £31,000 (£94,000); Sandalwood, £19,000 (£30,000); Seeds, £9,000 (£19,000); Tin ingots, £38,000 (£116,000); Oils essential, £23,000 (£39,000), and arms and ammunition etc., £24,000 (£41,000).

(c) Quantities. The principal commodities exported in larger quantities in the four months July-October 1935, as compared with the corresponding period of 1934, were:- Frozen lamb, Meats preserved in tins; Currants; Fresh apples; Jams and Jellies; Wine; Calf, cattle and horse hides; Kangaroo and Wallaby, rabbit and hare, and sheep skins; wool, greasy, scoured and tops; Coal, Zinc ores and concentrates; lead pig, and zinc bars, blocks etc.

Smaller quantities of the following items were exported:- Butter; Cheese; Beef; Mutton; Rabbits and Hares; Sausage casings; Milk and Cream; Raisins; Citrus fruits; Fruits preserved in liquid; Wheat; Flour; Sugar; Opossum skins; Tallow; Silver and Silver lead ores and concentrates; and tin ingots.

(d) Declared Unit Value. A comparison of the average prices computed from the declared export values of the principal commodities exported, shows that the average prices were higher in October 1935 than in October 1934 for - Wool; Sheepskins; Wheat; Butter; Wine; Beef; Mutton; Tallow; Lead pig and zinc. Slightly lower prices were recorded for Flour; Sugar and Raisins.
