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MAIN FEATURES

TOTAL CARGO

The value of total inward overseas cargo for the June quarter 1989 rose by \$1,217m to \$12,363m, a rise of 11 per cent compared with the March quarter 1989. The gross weight of this cargo rose by 11 per cent to 10.2m tonnes.

The value of total outward overseas cargo for the June quarter 1989 was \$12,074m, up \$1,366m (13%) from the March quarter 1989. The gross weight of this cargo increased by 6 per cent to 68.6m tonnes.

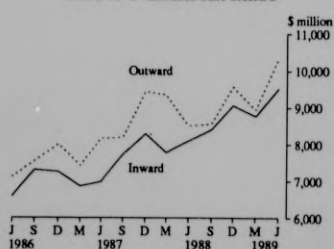
SEA CARGO

For sea cargo, the value of inward overseas cargo for the June quarter 1989 was \$9,525m, a rise of \$708m (8%) compared with March quarter 1989. Increases were recorded in three quarters of commodities. The largest increases were recorded in road vehicles, up \$151m (12%) to \$1,366m; electrical machinery, apparatus and appliances, nes., up \$70m (24%) to \$360m; and non-metallic mineral manufactures, nes., up \$51m (30%) to \$218m. Significant decreases were recorded in the residual other commodities and transactions category, down \$132m (16%) to \$695m; and articles of apparel and clothing accessories, down \$63m (37%) to \$106m.

The major trade areas from which inward sea cargo came in the June quarter 1989 were, in value terms, Japan and North Asia (26%), Europe-Atlantic (20%) and North America-West Coast (9%).

The value of outward sea cargo for the June quarter 1989 was \$10,351m, an increase of \$1,403m (16%) over the March quarter 1989. Increases were recorded in most commodities. The largest increases were in cereals and cereal preparations, up \$430m (62%) to \$1,123m; coal, coke and briquettes, up \$126m (21%) to \$718m; and meat and meat preparations, up \$122m (27%) to \$570m. The only significant decrease was recorded in textile fibres and their wastes (not manufactured into yarn or fabric), down \$224m (14%) to \$1,369m.

The major trade areas to which outward sea cargo went in the June quarter 1989 were, in value terms, Japan and North Asia (34%), Europe-Atlantic (11%), and East Asia (11%).

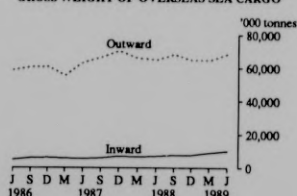
The gross weight of inward sea cargo for the June quarter 1989 was 10.1m tonnes, an increase of 1m tonnes (11%) on the previous quarter.

The gross weight of outward sea cargo was 68.6m tonnes, compared with 64.7m tonnes in the March quarter 1989. Increases in tonnages were recorded in three quarters of commodities. The largest increases were recorded in cereals and cereal preparations, up 1.7m tonnes (50%); and coal, coke and briquettes, up 1m tonnes (7%). Commodities recording the largest decreases were petroleum, petroleum products and related materials, down 0.4m tonnes (24%); and crude fertilisers and minerals (excl. coal, petroleum and precious stones), down 0.1m tonnes (5%).

AIR CARGO

For air cargo, the value of inward overseas cargo for the June quarter 1989 was \$2,839m, an increase of \$509m (22%) compared with the March quarter 1989. The major contributors to this increase were office machines and ADP equipment, up \$225m (47%) to \$702m; professional, scientific and controlling apparatus, nes., up \$37m (20%) to \$218m; and electrical machinery, apparatus and appliances, nes., up \$54m (26%) to \$261m.

The major trade areas from which inward air cargo came in the June quarter 1989 were, in value terms, North America-East Coast (20%), Europe-Atlantic (20%), and North America-West Coast (19%).

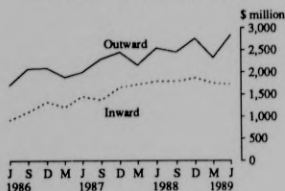
The value of outward air cargo for the June quarter 1989 was \$1,723m, a decrease of \$37m (2%) compared with the March quarter 1989. The largest decrease was recorded in non-monetary gold, down \$55m (8%) to \$611m. The largest increase was in office machines and ADP equipment, up \$24m (30%) to \$101m.

The major trade areas to which outward air cargo went in the June quarter 1989 were, in value terms, South East Asia (20%), Japan and North Asia (17%), and East Asia (15%).

The gross weight of inward air cargo for the June quarter 1989 was 46,034 tonnes, an increase of 6,828 tonnes (17%) compared with the March quarter 1989.

The gross weight of outward air cargo for the June quarter 1989 was 44,044 tonnes, an increase of 707 tonnes (2%) compared with the March quarter 1989.

GROSS WEIGHT OF OVERSEAS AIR CARGO

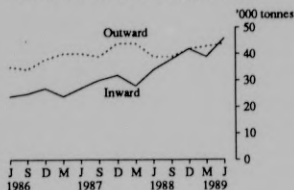

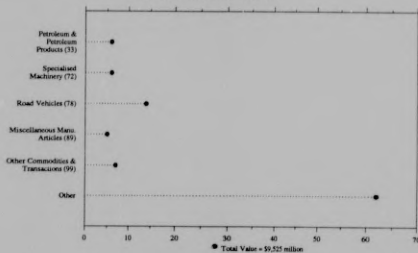

(ATPC DIVISION - JUNE QUARTER 1989)

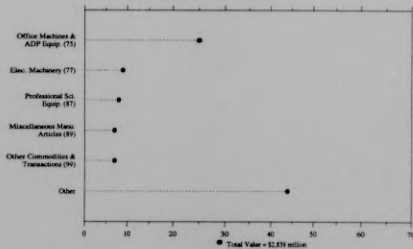

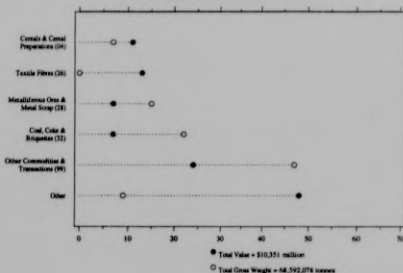

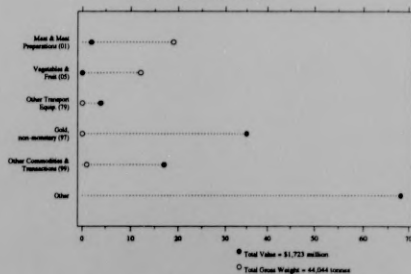

EXPLANATORY NOTES

Introduction

This publication contains June quarter 1989 inward and outward overseas shipping and air cargo commodity statistics and ship movements statistics.

2. A brief outline of the major definitions used in compiling these statistics is contained in the following explanatory notes and in table footnotes.

Source of data

3. These statistics have been compiled from the following sources:

- (a) Shipping and Air Cargo Commodity Statistics (SACCS) are compiled from information contained in import and export documents submitted by importers and exporters or their agents to the Australian Customs Service (ACS).
- (b) Ship movement statistics are compiled from returns completed by ACS officers for ships engaged in overseas voyages entering or departing Australian ports.

4. Data in some tables have been augmented with information from Lloyd's Register of Shipping to enable classification by selected shipping characteristics such as ship type and country of registration, and from the Department of Transport and Communications to enable classification by type of service.

Scope of the statistics

5. Inward commodity statistics relate to cargo loaded overseas, discharged from ships and aircraft at Australian ports and for which Customs imports documents have been received by the ABS.

6. Similarly, outward commodity statistics relate to cargo loaded on ships and aircraft at Australian ports for discharge at overseas ports and for which Customs export documents have been received by the ABS.

7. The commodity statistics include cargo shipped by sea and air and include Australian produce and re-exports of foreign produce.

Coverage of the statistics

8. The following shipments are excluded:

- (a) direct transit trade, i.e. goods being trans-shipped or moved through Australia for purposes of transport only;
- (b) migrants' and passengers' effects exported or imported and parcel post exports and imports of small value, for which Customs documents are not required;
- (c) certain materials under inter-governmental agreements for defence and similar projects for which Customs entries are not required;

(d) ships and aircraft entering and departing Australia under their own power;

(e) fish and other sea products landed in Australia and abroad directly from the high seas by Australian ships (such products landed in Australia directly from the high seas by foreign ships are included);

(f) bunkers, ships' and aircraft stores;

(g) from 1 July 1986, export consignments where the value of the goods in each transaction is less than \$500. Prior to that date the value level was \$250; and

(h) import documents lodged on informal clearance documents (ICDs) for values not exceeding \$250 and ICDs for postal articles valued between \$250 and \$1,000.

9. Ship movement statistics relate to visits made to Australian ports by ships engaged in overseas voyages. Details are not included for the following:

- (a) naval ships;
- (b) yachts and other craft used for pleasure;
- (c) foreign fishing ships visiting Australian ports for purposes other than the loading or discharging of cargo;
- (d) geophysical, oceanographic research and seismic survey ships;
- (e) offshore oil drilling rigs and related service ships;
- (f) Australian registered fishing ships operating from Australian ports; and
- (g) all ships of 200 registered net tonnes and under.

Commodity Classification

10. Commodity statistics in this publication are classified by Sections (1 digit) and Divisions (2 digit) of the Australian Transport Freight Commodity Classification (ATFCC). The ATFCC is the Australian standard for classifying goods transported by any of the transport modes (sea, rail, road and air) to and from Australia and within Australia. Full details of the ATFCC are included in the publication *Australian Transport Freight Commodity Classification and Interim Australian Pack Classification* (1210.0).

11. In the ATFCC, commodities are defined in terms of one or more categories of the United Nations' Standard International Trade Classification (SITC).

Change in commodity classification

12. For periods up to and including December 1987 inward and outward cargo commodity statistics were

presented using the codes and descriptions of the ATFC. This classification was based on the second revision of the United Nations' Standard International Trade Classification (SITC Rev 2).

13. From January 1988 inward and outward cargo commodity statistics in this publication have been presented using the revised version of the ATFC based on the new international version of the SITC (i.e. SITC Rev 3).

14. SITC Rev 3 was developed by the U.N. to coincide with the introduction of a new international classification for describing goods for customs and other purposes, the Harmonized Commodity Description and Coding System (the Harmonized System). The Harmonized System was adopted in January 1988 by most of the major trading nations of the world.

15. The revised ATFC incorporates a number of changes to take account of the differences between the second and third revisions of the SITC. These changes have resulted in a break in the statistical series published by the ABS. Accordingly, caution should be exercised when comparing data from March quarter 1988 onward with data from previous quarters. It should be noted that these changes affect only the commodity series and do not affect total inward and outward cargo figures or other dissections of these figures.

16. More information about links between SITC Rev 2-based and SITC Rev 3-based versions of the ATFC are contained in the publication *Australian Transport Freight Commodity Classification and Interim Australian Pack Classification* (1210.0).

Time of recording

17. SACCs data are compiled according to the date of arrival or departure of the ship or aircraft concerned at Australian ports. SACCs data are therefore not directly comparable to foreign trade statistics which are compiled according to the month in which relevant documents are finalised by the ACS and passed to the ABS for further processing.

Valuation

18. The recorded value of inward cargo is the free on board (FOB) Customs value. The value of outward cargo is the FOB transactions value of the goods expressed in Australian dollars.

Unit of quantity

19. SACCs data record commodity movements in gross weight tonnes which is the total weight of cargo, irrespective of the basis on which freight is charged. It includes the weight of moisture content, wrappings, crates, boxes, and containers (other than standard international containers used for containerised cargo).

20. This publication also contains statistics on dead-weight tonnage, which is the displacement of a fully loaded ship, less the weight of the ship itself.

Ship type

21. All ships are classified from Lloyd's Register of Shipping according to one of 11 ship types in terms of their structure or design. For the purposes of the tables in this publication, these 11 ship types are amalgamated into 4 categories as follows:

Ship characteristics

22. Ships are also classified according to the type of service they provide. The 2 types of service for which statistics are shown in this publication are:

- Liner service, which relates specifically to a ship operated by a carrier providing services on a specified route on a relatively regular basis; and
- Other service, which refers to all ships operating on other than a liner service.

23. Liner service is further broken down into conference and non-conference. A 'conference' is an association of ship owners which regulates the freight rates and terms and conditions of carriage of goods in any particular trade. Conference agreements exist only in respect of liner services and normally include provisions for sharing the trade, rationalising sailing schedules, and pooling arrangements for resources and/or revenue.

24. The Department of Transport and Communications provides periodic details of the type of service on which a vessel has been engaged. These details are used in this publication to classify vessel data by type of service. For vessels calling infrequently, or for those frequently changing the type of service under which they operate, the service status may not be appropriate to the current period data.

25. Ship calls refers to the number of port visits made to Australian ports by ships engaged in overseas voyages.

26. Country of Registration or flag of the ship, refers to the country in which the ship is registered according to Lloyd's Register of Shipping.

27. In Tables 17 and 18 statistics of cargo loaded and discharged appear side by side with statistics of ship arrivals and departures. These statistics are not directly

comparable as ships in ballast are included in ship calls and corresponding deadweight tonnages.

Geographic terms

28. For inward cargo, the port of loading is the overseas port at which the cargo is loaded onto the ship or aircraft. This port is not necessarily in the country of origin of the cargo. The port of discharge is the Australian port at which the cargo is unloaded from the ship or aircraft.

29. For outward cargo, the port of loading is the Australian port at which the cargo is loaded onto the ship or aircraft. The port of loading is not necessarily in the State of origin of the cargo. The port of discharge is the overseas port at which the cargo is unloaded from the ship or aircraft. The port of discharge is not necessarily in the country of final destination as the cargo may be subsequently trans-shipped.

30. The State of origin is defined as the State in which the final stage of production or manufacture occurred.

31. The trade areas shown in this publication relate to ports at which ships load or discharge cargo aggregated to country groups. The list of countries within each trade area is shown in Appendix D.

Confidentiality

32. Restrictions are placed on the release of statistics for certain commodities and ports for reasons of confidentiality. These restrictions do not affect total inward and outward cargo figures, but they can affect statistics at all levels of the ATFC. To ensure that confidential information is not disclosed, the commodities affected by restrictions are included in the item 99 'Other commodities & transactions'. Port information affected by restrictions is combined within the country concerned. Refer to Appendixes A, B and C for further details. More details on the confidentiality process can be obtained from the Confidentiality Manager on Canberra (06) 252 5425.

Reliability

33. SACCs data for the June quarter 1989 are compiled from documents finalised by the ACS and passed to the ABS up to and including September 1989. The finalisation of further data is more likely to result in revision to SACCs data for the most recent quarter than earlier periods. All SACCs data are also subject to revision resulting from continuing quality checks.

34. Inward and outward cargo statistics are also available on microfiche, magnetic tape and floppy disk.

35. More detailed import and export commodity statistics with mode of transport dissections are also available from the ABS for users who require transport oriented commodity information in finer detail than provided under the ATFC.

INWARD CARGO CONFIDENTIAL COMMODITY ITEMS

Restrictions are placed on the release of statistics for certain commodities for reasons of confidentiality. Prior to the introduction of the Harmonized System on 1 January 1988 (see Explanatory Notes, paragraphs 12 to 16), import confidentiality restrictions were applied at the item level of the Australian Import Commodity Classification (AICC). Details of the commodities affected by those restrictions are contained in previous issues of this publication.

From 1 January 1988, import confidentiality restrictions have been applied at the item level of the Harmonized Tariff. The Harmonized Tariff items affected by the restrictions, together with the code and description of the ATFCC item affected and the period for which the restriction applies, are listed below. Confidentiality restrictions applying in 1987 were reviewed prior to January 1988, converted from the AICC code to the Harmonized Tariff and shown as having started in January 1988.
