EXPLANATORY NOTES

This bulletin contains statistics of production in Australia of mines and factory products. Production statistics for the Australian Capital Territory and the Northern Territory have been included. An alphabetical index of these products is given on pages 2, 3, 4 and 5.

2. The following details are shown for each product :

- (a) Annual totals for the latest three complete financial years;
- (b) Monthly details for each of the latest fourteen months.

3. The figures for the year 1968-69 are mostly derived from Annual Factory Census returns collected by the Deputy Commonwealth Statistician in each State. In a small number of cases returns are accepted from factories for a year other than the normal financial year ending on 30 June.

4. The monthly figures are also based for the most part on returns collected by the Deputy Commonwealth Statisticians. Where another authority is the source, this is shown in a footnote. Monthly figures from July 1969 onwards may be revised when the results of the Annual Factory Census for 1969-70 become available.

5. For the purpose of factory statistics collections, a factory is taken to be a manufacturing establishment in which four or more persons are employed or in which power other than manual is used. Any production in small establishments not classified as factories is not included in the figures shown.

6. Further details in respect of many of the items will be found on an annual basis in the bulletin "Principal Manufacturing Commodities" (Reference No. 12.7) and on a monthly basis, in the Monthly Production Summaries (Reference No. 12.16), issued by this Bureau.

7. The bulletin contains seasonally adjusted statistics of several items. In the seasonal adjustment, account has been taken not only of normal seasonal factors but also of "trading-day" effects (arising from the varying numbers of Sundays, Mondays, Tuesdays, etc. in the month) and the influence of Easter and Australia Day which may, in successive years, affect figures for different months. Details of the methods used in seasonally adjusting these and other series are given in "Seasonally Adjusted Indicators 1971" (Ref. No. 1.10) issued on 2 July 1971.

8. Most items are identified by Commodity Codes which are derived from the Commodity Classification used in Australian Factory Statistics. In some cases where data is derived from sources other than Factory Collections, no Commodity Code is shown.

9. Any discrepancies between totals and sums of components in tables are due to rounding.
