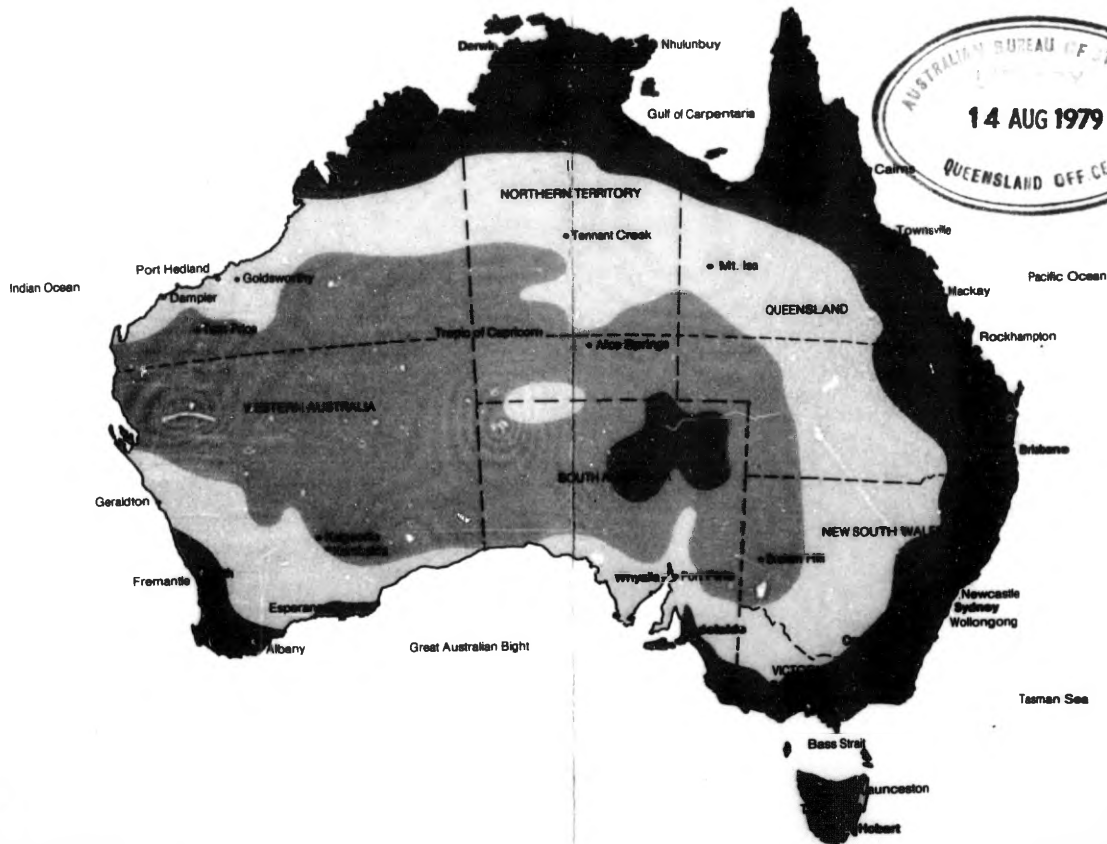

Statistics available from ABS

What statistics are available?

Statistics covering almost every field of economic and social activity are collected and processed by ABS.

In what form are they available?

- as publications—the ABS produces nearly 1900 monthly, quarterly and annual publications ranging from single page publications to the Australian Year Book. Most of these publications are free.

A complete list of publications produced is contained in a Catalogue of Publications (1101.0) available free on request from any office of ABS.

- on magnetic tape, microfiche, computer printout, etc.—some statistics are available in these forms to meet the special needs of users.
- in unpublished form—for economic reasons the ABS does not publish all its available statistics. A wide range of statistics is available on request in unpublished form.
