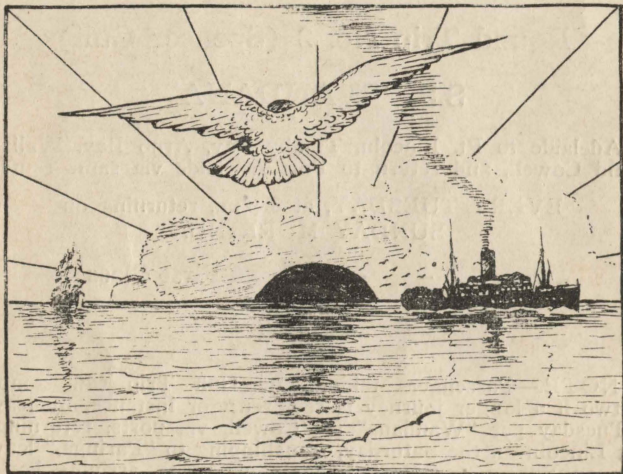

S.S. "WANDANA"

Pt. Adelaide to Pt. Lincoln, Tumby Bay, Arno Bay, Wallaroo,
and Cowell, and return to Port Adelaide via same route.

EVERY TUESDAY, at 3 p.m., returning on
SUNDAY MORNING.

FARE - - - £6 First Class

NOTE.—Passengers taking one Gulf Trip can complete the two if a longer journey is required: for instance, by leaving on Tuesday per "Wandana" for Cowell, via ports, returning to Port Lincoln on the Saturday, transhipping to "Paringa," leaving there on Sunday for Port Augusta via ports, arriving back in Adelaide on the following Thursday, i.e., about nine days' trip. The cost of the steamer fare for the double trip is £10.

The "Wandana" has a limited number of cabins on the promenade deck, berths for which an extra charge is made, viz. :—

Round Trip, in 2-berth Cabin, £1 extra; 4-berth Cabin, 10/- extra
To Pt. Lincoln " " 5/- " " " " 2/6 " "

The "Paringa" also has two 2-berth Cabins on the upper deck for which extra charges are made, as above.

Ladies, unless accompanied by their husbands, are not berthed in Deck Cabins.

General Information

CONDITIONS AND REGULATIONS

Passengers should make themselves acquainted with conditions and regulations on the Company's Passage Ticket.

Children under 12 years must be accompanied by a Guardian.

Deck Chairs received on board at passengers' risk.

BREAKING JOURNEY

Saloon passengers can break journey at any port en route, but must complete the voyage covered by the ticket within two months of embarkation.

Passengers are respectfully requested to notify, when booking, should they desire to break journey at any port.

CURRENCY OF TICKETS

Saloon Tickets, after first port of call, are available for two months from date of embarkation.

HOW TO BOOK

If unable to call, write and enclose the full fare or half of it as a deposit. This secures berths, and you can pay the balance at any time before embarkation.

Passengers desirous of securing accommodation should, when writing, state clearly the date on which they propose sailing, the class of accommodation required—in the case of a party, the sex and relationship of each person (and also the ages in the case of children)—and whether upper or lower berths are preferred.

ENGAGEMENT OF BERTH

A berth will not be considered definitely reserved until half of the passage money has been paid, the balance to be paid before embarkation. In the interests of all concerned, this regulation is strictly enforced.

LUGGAGE

Saloon Passengers will be allowed 20 cubic feet each adult; Second Class, 10 feet. Children paying half fare half these measurements. Every package must have passenger's name and destination distinctly marked on it. Only the personal baggage of the passenger will be carried as luggage. Merchandise cannot be shipped as luggage.

Special labels are issued gratis by the Company to ensure passengers' luggage reaching proper destination, and same can be obtained on application at the Company's Offices.

Boxes for the cabin should not exceed 2 ft. 8 in. x 1 ft. 6 in. x 1 ft. 2 in. One package of this size can be taken by each adult passenger, but will be reckoned in the allowance.

The ship is not responsible for loss, damage or detention of luggage under any circumstances.

Baggage not claimed is deposited with the Branches, Agencies, or Custom Houses at the owners' risk and expense.

CAUTION—GOODS OF DANGEROUS NATURE

Passengers must not take on board any goods of a dangerous nature. Any person so doing will not only be liable to the penalties imposed by the Statute, but also for all damage sustained in consequence of such shipment.

Dogs, cats, pet birds, and other small domestic animals will be carried on deck at owners' risk. They must be kept in cages or dog kennels; the cages, kennels, and food to be provided by owners themselves, unless specially arranged otherwise. The rate of charges for them varies according to size.
