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This publication is the first of a series of four publications presenting for Western Australia the final results from the Census of Retail Establishments and Selected Service Establishments conducted in respect of the year ended 30 June 1969. This publication contains details of operations of retail and selected service establishments classified by industry. Further publications in the series will present industry and commodity data classified by size of establishment, details of commodity sales by industry, and industry and commodity data for Statistical Retail Areas. These areas are in most instances groups of contiguous local government areas but in some cases are individual local government areas or parts of a local government area. Similar details for other States and Territories and Australia (excluding Statistical Retail Areas) are being published separately.

2. The 1968-69 Census was the sixth Census of Retail Trade undertaken in Australia. Previous Retail Censuses were taken in respect of the years ended 30 June 1948, 1949, 1953, 1957 and 1962. In addition to annual figures for the years in which retail censuses have been conducted quarterly estimates of the value of retail sales have been calculated from the September quarter 1950 inclusive and monthly estimates of the total value of retail sales in Australia from April 1961 by means of sample surveys.

3. Preliminary results of the 1968-69 Census of Retail Establishments and Selected Service Establishments have been published by the Commonwealth Statistician, Canberra in publications reference numbers 11.7 to 11.18. Some of the figures in those publications have been revised in this series of publications.

Integration of the Economic Censuses

4. For the year ended 30 June 1969 the Census of Retail Establishments and Selected Service Establishments was conducted as part of the first integrated economic censuses, which covered also Censuses of Wholesale Trade, Mining, Manufacturing and Electricity and Gas. The integration of these economic censuses was designed to increase substantially the usefulness and comparability of economic statistics collected and published by the Bureau and to form the basis for the sample surveys which supply current economic statistics from quarter to quarter, particularly those which provide data for the quarterly national income and expenditure estimates.

5. The economic censuses of Retail Trade, Mining, Manufacturing and Electricity and Gas previously conducted in Australia were originally designed and subsequently developed primarily to provide statistics for particular industries on a basis which would best suit the requirements of users interested in statistics of those industries. More recently there has been a growth of interest in statistics describing activity in the economy as a whole - reflected, for example, in the development of employment and earnings statistics, surveys of capital expenditure and stocks and the whole field of national accounts statistics. For such purposes statistics derived from economic censuses in the past have had serious limitations despite the fact that they covered a broad area of the whole economy. Because of the special-purpose nature of each of these censuses, there were no common definitions of data, there was no common system of reporting units, and, as a standard industrial classification was not used for these censuses, industry boundaries were not defined in ways which would avoid overlapping or gaps occurring between the industrial sectors covered. For these reasons, direct aggregation and comparison of statistics from different censuses were not possible.

6. In the integrated economic censuses information was collected using a common framework of reporting units and data concepts and in accordance with a standard industrial classification. As a result, the statistics for the industries covered by the censuses are provided with no overlapping or gaps in scope, and in such a way that aggregates for economic data such as value added, employment, wages and salaries, fixed capital expenditure and stocks can be obtained on a consistent basis and meaningful comparisons for these aggregates can now be made with all sectors of the economy covered by the censuses.

7. For a more detailed description of the Integrated Economic Censuses, reference should be made to Chapter 31 of 'Official Year Book of the Commonwealth of Australia', No. 56, 1970.

Developments Associated with Integration of the Economic Censuses

8. For the integration of the various censuses it was necessary to undertake three major developments:

- (a) The census units for which the statistics were to be collected (factories, mines, shops, etc.) had to be defined and identified in consistent ways and recorded in a central register, together with identifying data about the businesses owning and operating them.
- (b) A standard industrial classification had to be adopted so that the census units could be classified in consistent ways and to enable the boundaries of the various economic censuses to be determined without gaps or overlapping between them.
- (c) New forms had to be designed with definitions of data items consistent for all censuses.

Standardisation of the Census Units

9. The standardisation of census units in the integrated economic censuses has resulted in changes to the definition of the retail establishment used in previous retail censuses conducted by the Bureau. Previous retail censuses covered the retail trading activities of establishments which normally sold goods to the value of \$1,000 or more in the census year by retail to the general public from fixed premises. The retail activities of wholesalers and manufacturers were included if they sold regularly by retail to the general public.

10. The basic unit for the 1966-69 census for which most data have been tabulated is the establishment, defined in general terms to include all the operations carried on under the one ownership at a single physical location. The retail establishment is thus one predominantly engaged in retailing but the data supplied for it cover all activities at the location. Data such as employment, turnover, stocks etc. included in respect of retail establishments relate not only to the retailing activity at the location but also to:

- (a) any wholesaling activity at the location, and
- (b) any manufacturing or other activity at the location.

However, in cases where a combination of activities primary to more than one industry is carried on at one location, each of the secondary activities which has a value of sales of \$1 million or more have, under certain circumstances, been treated as a separate establishment. Detailed rules relating to this treatment are included in Australian Standard Industrial Classification (Preliminary Edition), 1969, Volume 1 published by this Bureau.

11. Separately located administrative offices and ancillary units serving establishments and forming part of the business which owns and operates the establishments are also included in the scope of the integrated economic censuses. They are units such as head offices, storage premises, transport depots, and motor vehicle repair and maintenance workshops. The establishment statistics include data relating to these units but they are not included in the statistic 'number of establishments'. Details of employment and wages and salaries by ASIC class for establishments and ancillary units separately are shown in Table 3 of this publication.

Standardisation of the Industrial Classification

12. The Australian Standard Industrial Classification (ASIC), described in the Bureau publication Australian Standard Industrial Classification (Preliminary Edition), 1969, Volume 1, defines the industries in the economy for statistical purposes, thus permitting the scope of the different economic censuses to be specified without gaps or overlapping between them. It also sets out standard rules for identifying the statistical units (e.g. establishments) and for coding them to the industries of the classification. This classification is broadly convertible to the International Standard Industrial Classification adopted by the United Nations Statistical Commission.

13. The structure of the ASIC comprises four levels. The broadest of these is the Division level, which relates to wide categories such as 'Manufacturing' and 'Wholesale and Retail Trade'. The structure may be illustrated by the following examples. A retail establishment mainly engaged in retailing fresh fruit and vegetables would be classified to:

Division F	Wholesale and Retail Trade
Sub-division 48	Retail Trade
Group 482	Food Stores
Class 4824	Fruit and Vegetable Stores

A selected service establishment mainly engaged in projecting motion picture films would be classified to:

Division L	Entertainment, Recreation, Restaurants, Hotels and Personal Services
Sub-division 91	Entertainment and Recreational Services
Group 911	Entertainment
Class 9113	Motion Picture Theatres

14. Each ASIC class is defined in terms of a specified range of economic activities designated as primary to it. (Retailing of fruit and vegetables, shown in the above example, is primary to class 4824). Similarly each ASIC group is defined in terms of the economic activities designated as primary to the classes within that group, and so on. An establishment which is engaged mainly in economic activities which have been designated as primary to a particular class has been classified to that class whether or not that establishment is also engaged in other 'secondary' activities. It should be noted that all dealers in motor vehicles and boats, either selling at wholesale or retail, have been classified as retail establishments. However, establishments whose predominant activity is selling new tyres, tubes, batteries or motor vehicle parts or accessories at wholesale have been classified as wholesale establishments. Administrative offices and ancillary units have been classified to an ASIC class according to the predominant industry of the establishments they administer or serve.

15. Previous censuses of retail establishments include a number of activities that were also covered by the annual manufacturing census: principally motor vehicle repairs, dry cleaning, shoe repairs and tyre retreading. Takings from these activities were reported in the retail trade census and treated as other takings. The following activities also covered by the annual manufacturing census, were included in previous retail censuses if they were carried on in establishments which had retail sales of more than \$1,000: custom dressmaking and custom tailoring; clothing repair and alterations; making up and repair of blinds, awnings and curtains; repair of domestic appliances; panel beating and smash repairs; watch and clock repairs; jewellery repairs; and baking of cakes in cake shops. With the adoption of the new establishment concept in the 1966-69 economic censuses, no establishment was required to supply returns in more than one census and all establishments mainly engaged in the above activities are now included in the retail trade censuses only.

Standardisation of Data Concepts

16. The third step in integrating the economic censuses, whereby the items of data on the census forms were standardised for all census sectors, was designed to ensure that, as far as possible, the items of data collected and the definitions of those items used in the retail census would be the same as those adopted in the other censuses. This has resulted in changes in the content of the statistics. For example, the main changes affecting turnover (or 'total takings' as it was called in the 1961-62 Retail Census) are:

- (a) Wholesale sales of goods by retail establishments are included in 'turnover', from which they were in general omitted in the 1961-62 census because it was based on the narrower establishment concept;
- (b) 'Goods withdrawn from stocks for own use as fixed tangible assets or for rental or lease' is a new item which is included in turnover. This item would be important in some types of business doing extensive hiring out of consumer goods;
- (c) Any goods manufactured by the retail establishment and included in its sales are also included in turnover.

The main changes to statistics of stocks brought about by the integration of the censuses arise from the use of the new establishment concept; the statistics will relate to total stocks of the establishment, not merely to those associated with the main activity covered by the census. Thus, retail establishments now include any stocks of materials held for other purposes, e.g. wholesaling or manufacturing.

17. In the economic censuses the fundamental measure of an establishment's contribution to economic activity is the value added. In the 1968-69 retail census value added is calculated as follows:

Sales of goods, plus
 Goods withdrawn from stocks for own use, plus
 All other operating revenue,
Equals: Value of turnover
Plus:
 Value of closing stocks
Less:
 Value of opening stocks
Less:
 Purchases and transfers in * (from other establishments of the enterprise)
Less:
 Selected expenses
Equals: Value added

The 'selected expenses' do not include wages and salaries, interest, rent, depreciation or overhead expenses usually recorded only for the enterprise as a whole. Broadly speaking, therefore, the value added is the source from which establishments derive the surplus to meet wages and salaries, interest, rent, depreciation and overhead expenses of the enterprise, and to provide a contribution to the Retail Trade sector with other sectors of the economy - Wholesale Trade - Manufacturing - Mining - Electricity and Gas - included in the integrated economic censuses.

Scope of the Retail Census

18. The Census of Retail Trade for 1968-69 covered establishments classified to Retail Trade (Sub-division 46 of the Australian Standard Industrial Classification). In addition it included the following types of service establishments in its scope: motion picture theatres; cafes and restaurants; licensed hotels, motels and wine saloons; licensed clubs; laundry and dry cleaning services; and hairdressing and beauty salons.

19. Censuses of Retail Trade in Australia have traditionally included certain types of service establishments in their scope in addition to retail establishments more narrowly defined. Some of the service establishments so included make retail sales in appreciable volume as well as providing important services for which the statistics can be conveniently collected in the framework of the retail census. Of the service industries covered by the 1968-69 census, cafes and restaurants, licensed hotels, motels and wine saloons and hairdressing and beauty salons had been included in previous censuses as retail establishments while the remainder were included in the supplementary collections made from establishments not described as retail establishments.

* It should be noted that in the retail census 'transfers in' are limited to transfers from establishments of the same enterprise other than retail establishments. Transfers of goods between retail establishments of the same enterprise are deducted from the purchases item in the return of the supplying establishments and added to purchases in the receiving establishments' returns.

20. Bread vending and milk vending by independent vendors mainly engaged in retailing bread and milk by home service delivery are included for the first time. However, sales by door to door salesmen (of all kinds other than independent bread and milk vendors), independent van salesmen and occasional stall holders are not included in the census. In addition details of sales were not collected from organisations operating vending machines on the premises of other businesses.

21. In supplying details of their sales retailers were requested to include cash and credit sales made during the year and to state their sales on a cash selling price basis.

22. The definition of retail trade adopted in the 1968-69 Retail Census was the same as that used in previous retail censuses i.e. the sale of new and used goods to the final consumer for household and personal purposes. To conform with this definition, sales of building materials, timber, commercial refrigerators and freezers, agricultural machinery and implements, agricultural tractors, construction and earthmoving machinery and equipment were not treated as retail sales. For the same reason, and because most retailers have difficulty in providing separate details of the value of retail and wholesale sales of builders hardware and building supplies, grain feed and fertilisers, and agricultural supplies, business machines and equipment, these commodity items also, as in previous retail censuses, were not treated as retail sales. However, they were collected separately on the census forms to ensure that details of their sales were not included under any other retail commodity group. Where the value of sales of these commodities were supplied by retailers they were included in the economic census tabulations as wholesale sales. Sales of motor vehicles other than sales to motor vehicle dealers whether for industrial, commercial, farm or private use were treated as retail sales in the census.

Coverage

23. The listing of establishments for the 1968-69 Census of Retail Establishments and Selected Service Establishments was obtained from a number of sources such as the listings of retail establishments and selected service establishments compiled by postmen throughout Australia, questionnaires sent to group employers, trade directories, lists of liquor licence holders, questionnaires sent to multi-establishment enterprises etc. All units were recorded in a central register together with information identifying the businesses owning and operating them.

24. All establishments in operation at 30 June 1969 were included whether they operated for the whole or only part of the year. In addition all establishments of multi-establishment enterprises in operation at 30 June 1969 were included whether they operated for the whole or any part of the year.

25. Where ownership of an establishment changed during the census year separate returns were obtained from the current and previous proprietors. Where it was impracticable to obtain returns from each proprietor estimates were included for the period concerned.

The Census Forms

26. Different form types were used in the census for enterprises (i.e. operating legal entities) with more than one establishment, for large single establishment enterprises and for smaller single establishment enterprises. In addition special forms were designed for motor vehicle dealers, garages, service stations, etc., hotels, motels and restaurants, motion picture theatres, laundries and dry cleaners, shoe repairers and hairdressers, and licensed clubs, to facilitate reporting by those businesses.

Commodity and Size Statistics

27. Details of commodity sales by industry class and details of industry and commodity sales classified according to sales size, will be published in later publications in this series.

28. The commodity items included in the tables are those described on the census forms for which retail sales were reported by establishments located in Australia. For publication purposes there will be seven broad commodity groups and forty five separate commodity items. Details shown in the tables will include data from retail and selected service establishments, wholesale, mining, manufacturing, and electricity and gas establishments. Numbers of establishments will relate to those which operated at 30 June 1969 but value of commodity sales will include sales by any establishments which operated during the year ended 30 June 1969.

29. The industry and commodity statistics of retail establishments and selected service establishments will be classified by total retail sales size, i.e. total value of retail sales of goods recorded on census forms after the deletion of sales of commodity items not included in total retail sales (see paragraph 22 above).

Area Statistics

30. In Table 11 details of numbers of establishments, persons employed, wages and salaries, retail sales and stocks are given for statistical divisions and their component statistical retail areas and local government areas as constituted on 31 December 1968. Statistical retail areas are which have been delineated for retail census purposes and their boundaries are determined by the boundaries of local government areas except for smaller areas which are described below.

31. Within the Perth Statistical Division, the City of Perth local government area has been divided into five areas, the Inner City Area, South, Outer City, North and Wannay-Coastal.

(1) The Inner City Area consists of an area bounded on the north by the railway, on the east by the centre of Lord Street and Victoria Avenue, on the south by the river and on the west by the centre of Spring Street, Mount Street, Milligan Street, Hay Street, George Street and its prolongation northerly to the railway.

- (11) The South Area consists of an area south of the Swan River and embracing the suburbs of Victoria Park, East Victoria Park and Carlsdale.
- (111) The Outer City Area consists of an area bounded on the east and south by the Swan River, on the west by the city boundary (the centres of Winthrop Avenue and Thomas Street) and the centre of Loftus Street, and on the north by the centres of Vincent and Beaufort Streets and the city boundary (the centres of Walcott Street, Lord Street, Guildford Road, Stanley Street, and Mitchell Street to the river), and embracing the suburbs of West Perth, East Perth and Highgate but excluding the area designated 'Inner City' (see above).
- (1v) The North Area consists of an area bounded on the north and east by the city boundary, on the south by the centres of Beaufort Street, Vincent Street, and Loftus Street, and the railway line, and on the west by the centres of McCourt Street, Cambridge Street, Joseph Street, Rutland Street and St Leonard's Avenue, and a line northerly along the eastern shores of Lake Monger to the city boundary, and embracing the suburbs of Leederville, North Perth and Mt Hawthorn.
- (v) The Wesley-Coastal Area consists of an area west of a line extending north from the railway along the centres of McCourt Street, Cambridge Street, Joseph Street, Rutland Street, St Leonard's Avenue, and a line northerly along the eastern shores of Lake Monger to the city boundary, and embracing the suburbs of Wesley, Floreat and City Beach.
32. Within the Perth Statistical Division, the Shire of Perth local government area has been divided into three areas, West, South Eastern and Central.
- (1) The West Area consists of an area bounded on the west by the Indian Ocean, on the north and south by the shire boundary and on the east (commencing at Cromarty Road) by the centres of Pearson Street, Selby Street, Scarborough Beach Road, Oswald Street, Hertha Road, Hugo Street, North Beach Road, Killarney Road, Huntriss Road, Finnerly Street, the southern and eastern boundaries of Lake Kariinyup Golf Course and the centre of Duffy Road, and embracing the suburbs of Churchlands, Wesley Downs, Woodlands, Doubleview, Scarborough, Innaloo, Kariinyup, Trigg, North Beach and Watersan.
- (11) The South Eastern Area consists of an area bounded on the south by the Swan River, on the west and east by the shire boundary and on the north by the centres of Walter Road, Eighth Avenue, Hamer Parade, Stancliffe Street and Learyod Street, and embracing the suburbs of Maylands, Inglewood and most of Mt Lawley.
- (111) The Central Area consists of an area bounded on the north and east by the shire boundary, the centres of Walter Road, Eighth Avenue, Hamer Parade, Stancliffe Street and Learyod Street and the southern boundary of the shire, and on the west by the centres of Pearson Street, Selby Street, Scarborough Beach Road, Oswald Street, Hertha Road, Hugo Street, North Beach Road, Killarney Road, Huntriss Road, Finnerly Street, the southern and eastern boundaries of Lake Kariinyup Golf Course and the centre of Duffy Road, and embracing the suburbs of Menora, Coolbinia, Mimalla, Yokine, Mollasmara, Balga, Haverley, Balcatia, Osborne Park, Tuart Hill and Joondana.
33. A map showing the statistical areas into which the City of Perth and the Shire of Perth local government areas have been divided is attached at the end of this publication.

Comparison with 1961-62 Census Results

34. It has not been possible to show in tables included in this publication comparisons of the 1961-62 and 1968-69 Retail Census results because of the changes which have occurred in the definition of census units, the scope of the censuses and in the items of data collected as set out in paragraphs 9 to 22 above. To provide comparative figures it would be necessary to reclassify establishments from the type of business classification used in the 1961-62 census to the industry classification according to the Australian Standard Industrial Classification used in the 1968-69 census. It has not been practicable to make these adjustments.

35. Generally, establishments included in the 1961-62 census were coded to the type of business which corresponded to the predominant type of goods sold or service rendered (i.e. the type with the largest sales or takings). However establishments whose predominant activity was other than retail e.g. wholesaling or manufacturing, which sold regularly by retail to the general public and whose retail sales or takings exceeded \$1,000 in the census year, were included in the 1961-62 census. In general the retailing activity of these establishments was treated as a separate retail establishment and coded according to predominant type of retail goods sold or service rendered (i.e. the type with the largest sales or takings) and then included in the census tabulations with establishments of similar types of business. These types of establishments were not included as retail establishments in the 1968-69 Retail Census. The value of retail sales made by establishments not classified as retail or selected service establishments amounted to \$27 million for the year 1968-69.

36. Due to changes in scope, it is not possible to compare details of the value of stocks and purchases and of persons employed in retail establishments as at 30 June 1969 with those at 30 June 1962 from the previous retail census. In the 1961-62 Retail Census traders were asked to supply particulars of the value of purchases and stocks of goods for retail sale only whereas in the 1968-69 Retail Census the figures for total purchases and total stocks of goods for sale owned by the enterprise and under the control of the establishments were obtained. Separate details of the value of purchases and stocks of goods for sale other than for retail sale are not available for retail establishments. Details of persons working mainly on retail activities only were published in the 1961-62 Retail Census whereas details of all persons working at the establishments were obtained in the 1968-69 Retail Census.

37. Definitions:

Number of retail and selected service establishments. The number of retail and selected service establishments which operated at 30 June 1969. These relate to establishments as such and do not include the numbers of separately located administrative offices and ancillary units.

Persons employed, male, female and total. Working proprietors at end of June 1969, employees (including part-time) on the pay-roll of the last pay period in June 1969, and unpaid members of the proprietor's family and other unpaid helpers working at least 15 hours during the last week of June 1969. Persons employed include those working at separately located administrative offices and ancillary units in the State. Note that persons employed (and their wages and salaries) relate to those employed at establishments, administrative offices or ancillary units located in the State even though the administrative offices or ancillary units may serve establishments located in another State.

Wages and salaries. The wages and salaries of all employees of the establishment including those working at separately located administrative offices and ancillary units in the State. Drawings of working proprietors are not included.

Turnover. Sales of goods (retail and wholesale), all other operating revenue from outside the enterprise such as repair and service revenue, hiring of consumer goods, commission, takings from meals and accommodation, hairdressing, theatre admissions and laundry and dry cleaning and goods withdrawn from stocks for own use as fixed tangible assets or for rental or lease.

Stocks at 30 June 1968 and 1969. All stocks of goods for sale, materials, fuels and work-in-progress, owned by the enterprise and controlled by the establishment, whether located at the establishment or elsewhere.

Purchases, transfers in and selected expenses. Purchases of goods for resale and materials for manufacturing; transfers in from establishments of the enterprise other than retail establishments; charges for commission and sub-contract work; purchases of wrapping and packaging materials, electricity and fuel; repair and maintenance expenses; outward freight and cartage; motor vehicle running expenses; and sales commission payments.

Value added. Turnover plus increase (or less decrease) in the value of stocks less purchases, transfers in and selected expenses. See paragraph 17 above.

Rent and Leasing Expenses. Value of rent and leasing of the establishment. Includes rent and leasing of vehicles and equipment.

Fixed Capital Expenditure. Outlay on new and second-hand fixed tangible assets less disposals.

Retail Sales. Total value of retail sales of goods recorded on census forms excluding the value of sales of commodity items as set out in paragraph 22 above.

Wholesale Sales. Value of wholesale sales made by retail and selected service establishments to other retailers, institutions or other businesses. Also includes retail and wholesale sales of commodity items referred to in paragraph 22 above.

Charges for commission and sub-contract work. Amounts paid for work performed during the year on these establishments materials and sub-contract work done for the establishment. Associated freight charges are included.

Authority

38. The census was conducted under the authority of the Census and Statistics Act 1905-1966 under the terms of which all returns supplied must be treated as strictly confidential, and disclosure of information shown on individual returns is prohibited. Consequently in the tables set out in this publication, figures for some categories are either grouped with figures for other categories or withheld from publication in order to avoid disclosure of confidential information.

SYMBOLS AND ABBREVIATIONS USED IN THIS PUBLICATION

The following symbols, where used in the tables, mean:

- Nil or less than \$500.

n.e.c. Not elsewhere classified.

ROUNDING OF FIGURES

Figures appearing in the tables have been rounded to thousands, without making those adjustments which would be needed to make the rounded figures add to the rounded total. It is for this reason that figures do not always add to the totals shown in the tables.

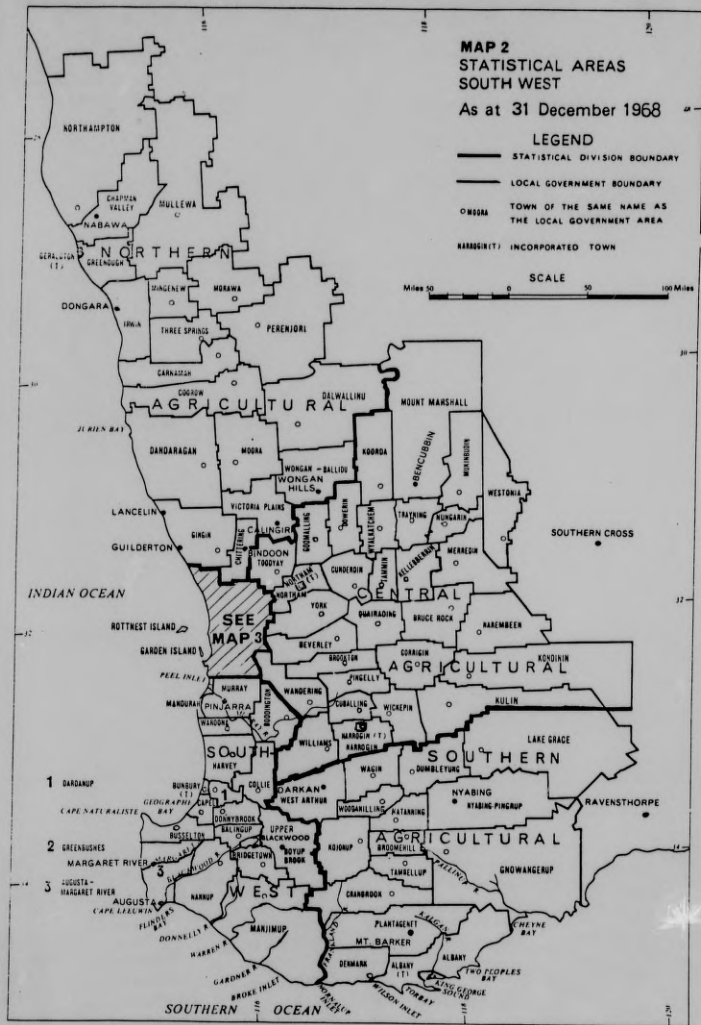

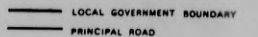
