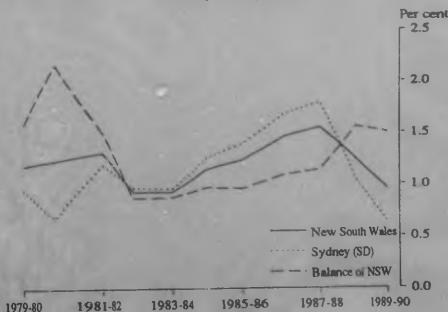
MAIN FEATURES

The estimated resident population of New South Wales at 30 June 1990 was 5,827,400, an increase of 53,350 (or 0.96 per cent) during 1989-90, compared with an increase of 70,400 (or 1.24 per cent) during 1988-89. The components of change over the 1989-90 year consist of increases of 50,500 for net overseas migration and 41,950 for natural increase, and a decrease of 37,050 for net interstate migration.

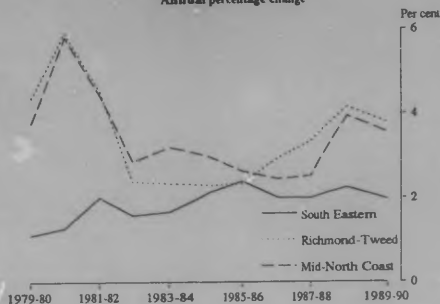
The population of the Sydney Statistical Division rose by 23,350 (or 0.64 per cent) during the year. The growth in this Division in 1989-90 accounted for 42.2 per cent of the increase for the State. The downturn of the growth in the Sydney Division experienced in 1988-89 continued during the 1989-90 period. The SLAs in the Sydney Division which experienced the highest percentage growth were Wollondilly (4.12), Wyong (3.33) and Gosford (3.07).

Across the remainder of New South Wales, the coastal Statistical Divisions of Richmond-Tweed (3.78), Mid-North Coast (3.55) and South Eastern (1.97) continued to show the highest percentage growth. The SLAs with the most significant percentage growth were Nymboida (5.60), Tweed (Part A) (5.51), Ballina (5.40) and Nambucca (4.93).

NOTES

This publication presents the estimated resident population and area of each statistical local area of New South Wales at 30 June 1989 (final) and 1990, on boundaries existing at 30 June 1990. The 1990 estimates are preliminary being based on incomplete indicators of population change and a preliminary estimate of the resident population for the State as a whole.

The final estimates will be available later in the year in the publication, *Age and Sex Distribution of the Estimated Resident Population of Statistical Local Areas (3209.1)*, and will also be included in next year's issue of this publication. The final estimates, however, are not expected to vary greatly from the preliminary estimates.

An additional table, located on page 7, shows aggregate estimates for legal local government areas which are split into two or more statistical local areas in the main table.

Explanatory notes and definitions are provided at the back of this publication.

EXPLANATORY NOTES

The *Estimated Resident Population (ERP)* of an area is the estimate of the number of persons who usually reside in that area.

2. Intercensal estimates of resident population are based on the ERP at the date of the previous census (in this case, 30 June 1986) and available measures of change in resident population since that date. As no direct measure of population movement at the SLA level is available, the indicators used may give an incomplete picture of such movement. Therefore it should be noted that all intercensal estimates will be subject to revision when final figures are available from the processing of the 1991 Census.

3. Detailed explanation of the concept of estimated resident population, as adopted by the Australian Bureau of Statistics for official population estimates, is contained in the ABS Information Paper *Population Estimates: An Outline of the New Conceptual Basis of ABS Population Estimates* (3216.0).

Statistical Areas of New South Wales

4. This bulletin contains data presented according to the Australian Standard Geographical Classification (ASGC). Under this classification, statistical areas are defined as follows:

Statistical Local Areas (SLAs)

These geographical areas are, in almost all cases, identical with, or have been formed from a division of, whole legal local government areas (LGAs) as defined under the (State) Local Government Act 1919 and comprising cities (C), municipalities (M) and shires (S). In other cases, they represent areas which are unincorporated under the Act. In aggregate, SLAs cover the whole of the State without gaps or overlaps. In some cases legal LGAs overlap statistical subdivision boundaries and therefore comprise two SLAs (Part A and Part B) or three SLAs in the case of Cabonne (S) (Part A, Part B and Part C). *Separate estimates for these Legal LGAs are shown on page 7 of this publication.*

Statistical Subdivisions (SSDs)

These consist of one or more SLAs and form the intermediate size spatial unit for the presentation of regional data.

Statistical Divisions (SDs)

These consist of one or more Statistical Subdivisions (SSDs). Where SSDs are not shown, statistical local areas are ordered alphabetically within statistical divisions. The divisions are designed to be relatively homogeneous regions characterised by identifiable social and economic units within the region, under the unifying influence of one or more major towns or cities.

5. Further information concerning statistical areas is contained in the publication *Regional Statistics, New South Wales* (1304.1) and in the publication *Australian Standard Geographical Classification* (1216.0).

Rounding of figures

6. The estimates of resident population contained in this publication have been rounded to the nearest 50 persons for all areas in the Sydney Statistical Division. For the remainder of New South Wales, individual statistical local areas and subdivision totals have been rounded to the nearest 10 persons while statistical division totals have been rounded to the nearest 50 persons.

7. This level of rounding represents a change, from 1986, for areas outside of the Sydney Statistical Division. This change has been made because more severe rounding in those areas, in general terms, could result in substantial year to year fluctuations in the estimates for some statistical local areas, due to the rounding process rather than an actual population change.

8. As a result of rounding, discrepancies may occur between sums of the component items and totals shown.
