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EXPLANATORY NOTESIntroduction

This publication contains statistics of government and non-government schools, students enrolled and active in a course of study at those schools, and staff employed at July 1986.

2. The National Schools Statistics Collection (NSSC) series was established through the work of the Australian Education Council School Statistics Committee, of which the ABS is a member. This Committee was established in 1979 by the Australian Education Council to improve the

quality of education statistics relating to government and non-government primary and secondary education and has developed a set of concepts, definitions, and classifications for use in the National Schools Statistics Collection.

3. The statistics are compiled from collections conducted, in co-operation with the Australian Education Council School Statistics Committee, by the State/Territory Departments of Education (government series) and the Commonwealth Department of Education (non-government series).

Introduction (continued)

4. Prior to the implementation of the NSSC in the non-government sector for 1984, the non-government collection was conducted by the ABS and some differences in concepts and definitions were used. These cases have been noted in the relevant tables.

Scope and Coverage

5. The scope of the NSSC series comprises government and non-government establishments which have as their major activity the administration and/or provision of full-time day primary, secondary and/or special education, or primary or secondary education by radio or correspondence.

6. As those establishments at which some other activity is the major one are excluded, the statistics presented do not include all establishments, students, or staff engaged in activities under the control of the Director-General of Education (or equivalent). For example, Colleges of Technical and Further Education are excluded.

Census Dates

7. Data published in this publication are collected in the first or second week of the second semester each year, the actual census dates varying to avoid school holidays. The reference date for age of students, however, remains static at 1 July.

Definitions

8. Non-special schools are establishments which have as their major activity the provision of full-time day, primary, or secondary education (including education by radio or correspondence). A school may have two or more campuses at separate physical locations, and for purposes of this publication, each campus is counted as a separate school.

9. A special school is one in which enrolment is limited to students with one or more of the following:

- (a) mental or physical handicap or slow learning ability;
- (b) social or emotional problems; or
- (c) in custody, on remand, or in hospital.

NOTE: Special schools are categorised according to the predominant disability for which the school caters.

10. Special schools previously administered by the Endeavour Foundation are, from January 1986, within the jurisdiction of the Director-General of Education and are now included as government special schools.

11. Primary education is defined as that full-time education which typically commences at around age 5 years and lasts for 7 years. It does not include seasonal education such as pre-school education.

12. Secondary education is defined as that education which typically commences at around age 12 years after completion of primary education and lasts for 5 years.

13. Special education is defined as that education provided at special schools.

14. A student is defined as a person who is enrolled in a school and active in a course of study other than pre-school or technical and further education courses. Persons absent at the reference date are included if they were expected to be absent for less than four continuous weeks (excluding school vacations) and are excluded if they had left the school or had been absent without explanation for four continuous weeks (excluding school vacations) prior to the reference week.

15. A full-time student is a person who satisfies the definition of a student and undertakes a work-load equivalent to, or greater than, that usually undertaken by a student of that year.

16. A part-time student is a person who satisfies the definition of a student but who undertakes a work-load less than that usually undertaken by a full-time student (as determined by that system) of that year. The full-time equivalent of a part-time student is expressed as a proportion, dependent on the number of hours attended (e.g. 0.5 of a full-time student).

17. An ungraded student is a person who cannot be allocated to a particular year of education.

NOTE: Students attending special classes at non-special schools are classified as ungraded from 1986.

18. A special student is one who is enrolled and active in a special school as defined in paragraph 9 above.

19. Correspondence students are those who are prevented from attending ordinary schools because of distance or illness. Students in receipt of primary education by radio through the Schools of the Air are included in this category. Part-time correspondence students are excluded from the tables in this publication but are included in footnotes where appropriate.

20. Staff are defined as persons who are involved in the administration or provision of primary, secondary, or special education.

21. Teaching staff are those paid under a teacher's salary award (or equivalent) and who are in contact with students, i.e. support students either by direct class contact or on an individual basis. They include classroom and general teachers, librarians, teacher librarians, guidance/counselling/careers advisors, and relieving teachers but exclude staff who provide professional support to teachers.

22. Teachers in administrative positions, such as principals and deputy principals, are considered to be teaching staff.

23. Non-teaching staff are defined as those who are not in contact with students, or who are not paid under a teacher's salary award (or equivalent).

EXPLANATORY NOTES (continued)

Definitions (continued)

24. Full-time staff are defined as those who perform the full allocation of duties specified as full-time in the relevant award, contract, or administrative arrangement. However, persons who are employed full-time by the Department of Education but part of whose duties are out of scope of the collection (e.g. pre-school) have been regarded as part-time.

25. Part-time staff are staff who are not employed full-time or who are employed full-time but part of whose duties are out of scope of this collection (e.g. pre-school). The full-time equivalent of part-time staff is calculated on the basis of the proportion of time spent on in-scope activities compared to that spent by full-time staff with similar duties.

26. Staff spending more than half of their time actively engaged in duties at one or more ancillary education establishments are included.

27. The area of activity of staff is classified to the following:

- (a) active in 'primary education' also includes 'special' primary education at non-special schools;
- (b) active in 'secondary education' also includes 'special' secondary education at non-special schools; and
- (c) active in 'special education' excludes persons active in administration or provision of special classes at non-special schools.

28. Staff who worked in more than one area of activity have been apportioned as full-time equivalent units across areas of activity on the basis of the number of enrolments in that sector.

29. Apparent retention rates are measures of the tendencies of students to remain in secondary education from Year 8 to Year 10, Year 11, and Year 12. To calculate the apparent retention rate of students in Year 12 in 1996, the number of those students in 1996 is expressed as a proportion of the number of students in Year 8 in 1992 (1992 being the year in which the 1996 Year 12 students would have normally enrolled in Year 8). The retention rate thus derived is called an apparent retention rate because the method of calculation does not explicitly take account of net changes to the school population due to migration, deaths, transfers between government and non-government schools, or of those students who spend more than 1 year in the same year level.

Geographic Classification

30. Establishments in this collection are classified and data presented according to the Australian Standard Geographical Classification (ASGC).

31. Legal local government areas (LGAs) are spatial units which represent the whole undivided geographical area of responsibility of an incorporated local

government council. Their creation and delimitation is the responsibility of the State Government and is governed by the provision of State Local Government Acts. The various types of legal LGAs in Queensland are cities (C), towns (T), and shires (S).

32. In Table 16 of this publication, the ASGC legal LGA structure has been cross-classified with the statistical division level of the main ASGC structure. The use of this classification requires the combination of the Brisbane Statistical Division and the Moreton Statistical Division as some legal LGAs cross the border of these two statistical divisions. Unpublished data are available by other ASGC structures.

33. Statistical divisions are designed to be relatively homogeneous regions characterised by identifiable social and economic units within the region, under the unifying influence of one or more legal LGAs which are shown alphabetically within statistical divisions.

34. Statistical districts. To provide comparable statistics over a period of time, statistical districts have been defined around selected urban centres with a population of 25,000 or more experiencing urban growth beyond the legal LGA boundaries. These districts are intended to contain the anticipated urban spread over the next 20 years.

Summary of Findings

At July 1986, there were 491,190 students enrolled at 1,698 schools in Queensland. This excludes 2,764 part-time day students and 3,047 full-time and part-time evening students attending government schools. The 1986 enrolments represent an increase of 0.3 per cent over those in 1985.

Diagrams 1 and 2 show the distribution of enrolments and schools by controlling authority. Government schools account for the majority of enrolments with 374,329 students attending 1,313 schools. Of the remaining 116,861 students, 85,695 attend 275 Catholic schools, 8,141 attend 13 Anglican schools, and 23,035 attend 97 other non-government schools.

Diagram 1 - All Schools: Enrolments by Controlling Authority, Queensland, July 1986

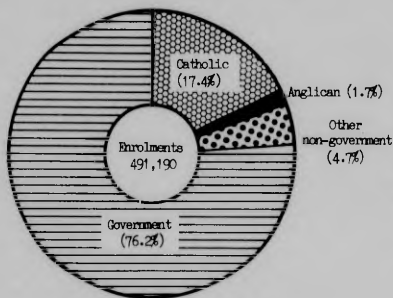


Diagram 2 - All Schools: Number by Controlling Authority, Queensland, July 1986

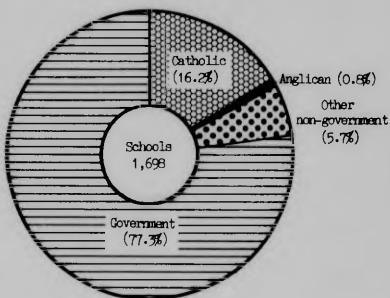
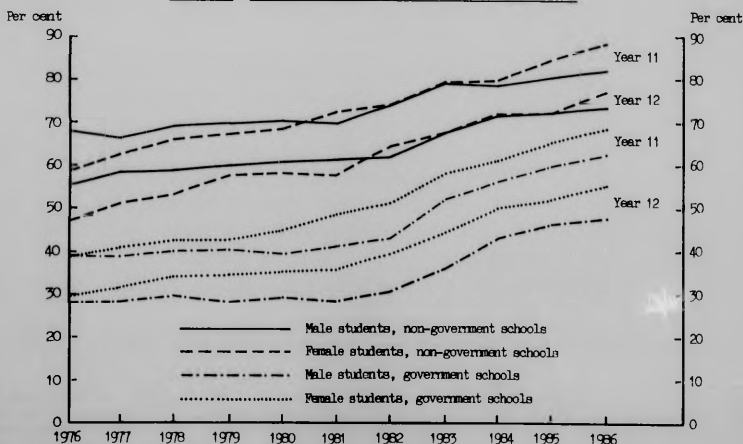


Diagram 3 shows the apparent retention rates between 1976 and 1986. These are measures of the tendencies of students to remain in school from their first secondary year (Year 8) to the second last and last year of schooling (Years 11 and 12). This apparent retention rate does not take into account net changes to the school population due to migration, deaths, transfers between sectors, or repeating students.

Summary of Findings (continued)

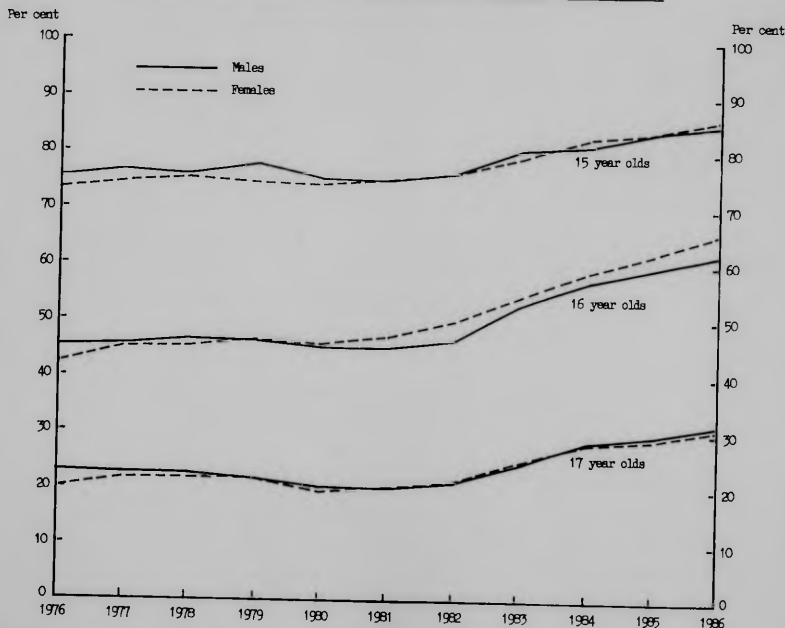
The apparent retention rates in non-government schools are higher than those of government schools. These differences have remained fairly constant over the last 10 years. In non-government schools the apparent retention rates to Year 12 have risen in the 10 years since 1976 from 55.4 per cent to 73.2 per cent for males and 47.3 per cent to 77.1 per cent for females. Over the same period in government schools, the retention rate to Year 12 for males has risen from 28.1 per cent to 47.6 per cent and for females from 29.7 per cent to 55.2 per cent. The apparent retention rates have risen more for females than for males.

Diagram 4 shows the age participation rates of 15 to 17 year olds in Queensland schools from 1976 to 1986. The age participation rate is the number of school students of a particular age and sex expressed as a proportion of the population of the same age and sex in a specified year, and indicates the percentage of students still at school.

Education in Queensland is compulsory to age 15 years and the participation rate of this age group is high. The age 15 rate, however, is significantly below 100 per cent as the Census date of the schools collection is in July and some students with birthdays prior to the Census date leave school immediately upon attaining 15 years of age.

The participation rate of 15 year old students in Queensland has, however, risen from 74.4 per cent in 1976 to 85.8 per cent in 1986, with the female participation rate increasing faster than that of the males.

(a) Prior to 1980, the reference date for determining age was 1 August. Since 1980 the date has been 1 July.

Since 1981, the participation rates of all ages have been increasing, with those of 16 year olds showing the more marked increases. In 1981, the participation rate of 16 year olds was 45.3 per cent for males and 47.1 per cent for females while in 1986 the rate has reached 62.0 per cent for males and 65.9 per cent for females. The participation rate for 17 year olds was 20.2 per cent for males and 20.6 per cent for females in 1981 and in 1986 was 31.7 per cent for males and 31.0 per cent for females.
