## INTRODUCTION.

The working population may be classified in two ways, according to two distinct concepts—

- (1) The occupation, which is personal to the individual;
- (2) The industry in which the individual carries on this occupation.

The distinction between the terms "industry" and "occupation" is not always sufficiently appreciated and frequently the terms are used as if they were interchangeable. It is desirable, therefore, to define the sense in which these terms are used.

*Occupation.* The occupation of a person is the kind of work that he or she personally performs. In general, the nature of the factory, business or service in which a person works has no direct bearing upon the classification of the occupation, but in the case of some occupations a dissection by industry has been made to give wider meaning to the occupation category.

*Industry* is defined as any single branch of productive activity, trade or service. All persons engaged in any such branch of economic activity are classified industrially as belonging to the particular branch in question irrespective of their personal occupations within the industry.

Thus a single firm may employ individuals performing completely different occupations in order to make a particular product or to render a particular service, but the industrial classification of each of these individuals is determined by the nature of the product made or the service rendered by the firm which employs him.

This volume deals only with one of these methods of classifying the working population, namely, the classification by occupation. It provides an alphabetical index of occupation descriptions to be used as a reference in assigning them to the Classification of Occupations. The number appearing opposite each description is the code number of the occupation category to which it has been assigned.

The Classification of Occupations to which the index refers has been compiled for use in the 1961 Census. It has been adapted from and closely adheres to the principles embodied in the International Standard Classification of Occupations issued by the International Labour Office, Geneva, 1958, and contains 12 Major Groups, 73 Minor Groups and 348 Occupation Categories. Details of this classification including Major and Minor Group headings and Occupation Category descriptions are given in the companion volume, Classification and Classified List of Occupations, June, 1961. In the Classified List of Occupations, occupation descriptions appearing in this index are arranged alphabetically under the occupation category to which each is assigned.

In accordance with the International Standard Classification of Occupations the structure of this occupational classification has been based primarily on the nature of the work done.

The most important feature of any occupational category in this classification is that the occupation descriptions assigned thereto are more closely related to each other than to other occupation categories as regards the functions involved, skills, knowledge and abilities required for satisfactory performance of the job. Other aspects of work characteristics have also been taken into account in forming some of these categories. They include the type of material worked on, workplace environment, use of specialized equipment and other relationships; nevertheless, the particular skills, knowledge and abilities of the workers have an intimate connexion with these factors.

The combination of the widespread coverage of occupation categories into a relatively short list of minor groups necessarily implies that the common characteristics which link them together are frequently of a broad or general nature. They are similar to those already outlined for the grouping of occupation descriptions into occupation categories, namely, kind of material worked in, environment of work, type of equipment used or type of production-process employed.

The major groups constitute a convenient summarization of the minor groups rather than the basis from which the occupational classification has been developed.

The occupation descriptions which appear in this index have been taken, in the main, from indexes used in past Censuses and Surveys in Australia. This information has been augmented, to some extent, by the inclusion of a number of designations of numerically important governmental employees. A separate supplementary index of designations of governmental employees has also been prepared.

The practice followed in indexing multiple word occupation descriptions has been to use the natural or usual word order as far as possible.

No comprehensive system of cross-referencing has been adopted in preparing the index and, in the majority of cases, occupation descriptions will be found in one form only—the natural or usual word order mentioned above. However, a limited amount of cross-referencing has been considered necessary. Thus "coal miner" is cross-referenced as "miner, coal" but "antimony miner", "gold miner", "silver lead miner", "wolfram miner", "zinc miner" and other miners in the metalliferous group, are cross-referenced only in general terms, thus:—"Miner, metalliferous—see mineral mined".

Rather than repeat a large number of variations of such general occupation descriptions as employer, manager, proprietor, shopkeeper, only a limited number of references have been included to cover these occupations, each of which is cross-referenced to one representative description under which precise instructions for coding are given. This procedure has been used in two cases—see Index:—(1) Manager, n.e.c. and (2) Proprietor working on own account.

The index has been arranged in strict alphabetical order, in accordance with the letters as they appear continuously throughout the occupation description, irrespective of the number of words or other supplementary description data.

## INSTRUCTIONS FOR CODING.

1. This index has been prepared to enable coders readily to ascertain the occupation category in the Classification of Occupations to which an occupation description written on Census Schedules is to be assigned. The index is only an aid to facilitate the work of classifying occupations. Before attempting to code (i.e., classify) occupation the coder must be familiar with the general structure of the Classification of Occupations, with the observations in the "Introduction" to this index and with the instructions set out below.

2. As a general rule the reply given to question 13 (e) (i) on the Census Householder's Schedule or Personal Slip is coded to the number assigned to that particular occupation description in the Index of Occupations. However, the reply to this question must not be considered in isolation but as part of a general description of the economic characteristics of the individual. Before assigning an occupation code number the coder must endeavour to visualize the individual by reference to the replies to the following questions:—

Question	3.	Sex.
"	4.	Age.
"	11.	Persons not engaged in industry.
"	12.	Unemployment.
"	13 (d).	Grade.
"	13 (f).	Industry, Trade or Service.
"	14.	Place of work.

Where an improbable combination is encountered the coder is to refer the entry to the Section Leader for a decision.

A reply in part (ii) of question 13 (e) should only be used to supplement the occupation description and not to alter the basic description.

### *Procedure for Determining Occupation Code.*

(a) Where the occupation stated in reply to question 13 (e) (i) appears in the index, either as described or in some alternative word combination, and replies to other questions do not conflict, code as indicated in the index.

(b) If the reply to question 13 (e) (i) is such that professional qualifications, trade training or particulars of other qualifications held may be of assistance in determining the precise code to which the occupation should be allocated, then refer to the reply to question 13 (e) (ii). Where the replies to these two questions appear to conflict, refer to Section Leader.

(c) Where the occupation stated does not appear in this index and the answer to question 14 indicates that the person is employed by a government department or authority, refer to the supplementary index of government designations.

(d) Where the occupation stated does not appear in either index, as described or in some alternative word combination, then an occupation query card must be completed and given to the Section Leader who will instruct the coder as to the code number to be assigned.

(e) If question 13 (e) (i) is not answered, or the reply is indefinite, refer to question 13 (f), Industry, Trade or Service, and question 13 (d), Grade to see if the information given there will enable the occupation to be determined from the index.

(f) If additional information to determine occupation is still required, refer to question 14, Name of Employer and Place of Work.

(g) If still unable to determine occupation to ensure accurate coding by reference to the index, refer to Section Leader.

(h) Where no reply is given to questions 11 to 14 inclusive, the following procedure is to be adopted unless evidence to the contrary appears elsewhere on the Schedule:—

#### Record of Occupation Descriptions Used.

In order to check current usage of terms each coder must place a small tick against each occupation description in the index as it is used for the first time only.

#### Occupation and Grade.

In general, the reply to Grade, question 13 (d), is not a determining factor in coding occupation. However, in the following cases grade will specifically determine the choice of occupation category:—

#### Instructions for Coding Occupations Classified to Major Group I.—Administrative, Executive and Managerial Workers

When it is decided that an occupation description is to be coded to Major Group I., then the occupation will be allocated to a precise category within this group depending upon the industry code applicable in each individual case in accordance with the following tables:—

#### ADMINISTRATORS AND EXECUTIVE OFFICIALS, GOVERNMENT.

(Industry Code 650-652, 670-679.)

The occupational categories included in this minor group heading cover administrative and executive officials in Commonwealth, State and Local Government. Also included are government inspectors assigned

to industry codes **650, 651, 670-679**, i.e. Government Administration, who generally carry out inspectorial functions in administering government legislation. Representatives of overseas governments in Australia are also included.

#### EMPLOYERS, WORKERS ON OWN ACCOUNT, DIRECTORS, MANAGERS, N.E.C.

Occupations to be allocated to codes **110-118** are those "managerial" or "administrative" occupations in private business, which are not classified elsewhere; and in Government, which are not classified to occupation codes **100-106**, as shown in the preceding table.

#### Procedure for Special Cases.

(a) Generally the addition of such words (adjectives) as assistant, deputy, junior, senior, sub are to be ignored in determining the appropriate occupational code. However, care must be exercised in determining the code to be used when a person describes himself as an "assistant to" an "occupation" or an "occupation's assistant", that is, in each case in which "assistant" is used as a noun. While a number of these cases are included in the index, others may need to be referred to the Section Leader before a code can be determined accurately.

(b) *Apprentice, cadet.*—Persons who state that they are serving an apprenticeship to a trade or craft are to be coded to that trade or craft; but persons who give as their occupation cadet engineer, cadet chemist, cadet surveyor or other learner in the engineering or science professions are not to be coded to the relevant profession but are to be regarded as technicians and assigned to code 071. On the other hand, an articled law clerk studying to become a barrister or solicitor is to be coded to law clerk, and statistical cadet (C.P.S.) to statistical clerk.

In the index, under the heading Apprentice (so described) and n.e.c., appears a table to be used, as a guide, in coding a person who states his occupation as apprentice without giving further particulars, to enable his occupation to be classified more precisely. Improver, learner are to be regarded as synonymous with apprentice. The occupation code allocated will depend upon the industry code applicable in each individual case.

(c) *Foreman*—Persons who include the term "foreman" or "leading hand" in an occupation description are to be coded to the occupation described, e.g., leading hand plumber or foreman plumber is to be coded to plumber. If a person merely gives as his occupational description the term "foreman", then, if practicable, he should be coded to the "n.e.c." group of the production-process in which he is engaged. In addition, specific provision has been made in the Classification of Occupations to provide codes for "foreman", viz.:—

Under the heading Foreman (so described) and n.e.c. in the index, appears a table to be used as a guide in coding a person who describes himself as foreman without giving further particulars to enable his occupation to be classified more precisely. Leading hand is to be regarded as synonymous with foreman. The occupation code allocated will depend upon the industry code applicable in each individual case.

(d) *Factory worker (so described) and n.e.c.*—In describing occupation, a number of persons employed in factories, or other similar types of establishment, such as mills, refineries, breweries, distilleries, use such terms as factory worker, factory hand, mill hand, refinery hand, &c. Where Census experience has shown that, in particular groups of occupation, this type of occupation description is used extensively, specific codes, suitably described have been introduced into the classification. A number of entries covering this type of worker appear in the index, mainly under factory worker. However, in addition, under the heading Factory worker (so described) and n.e.c. appears a table to be used, as a guide, in coding factory workers and other synonymous occupation descriptions which are not already included in the index. The occupation code allocated will depend upon the industry code applicable in each individual case.

(e) *Labourer (so described) and n.e.c.*—Under the heading Labourer (so described) and n.e.c. in the index appears a table to be used, as a guide, in coding a person who states his occupation as labourer, the precise description for which is not already included in the index, e.g., labourer—tobacco farm. The occupation code allocated will depend upon the industry code applicable in each individual case.

(f) *Machinist (so described) and n.e.c.*—In the index, under the heading Machinist (so described) and n.e.c., appears a table to be used, as a guide, in coding a person who describes himself as machinist without giving further particulars to enable his occupation to be coded more precisely. Machine minder, machine operator, machine attendant are to be regarded as synonymous with machinist. The occupation code allocated will depend upon the industry code applicable in each individual case. However, before adopting this procedure care should be taken to ensure that the evidence on the schedule does not suggest a more appropriate code, e.g., a young female in certain industries who should be coded as office machine operator, occupation code 160.

#### Dual Occupation Descriptions.

When two or more occupation terms are used to describe an occupation, code to the first mentioned, e.g., clerk-typist, code as clerk. Similarly, where a person is engaged in more than one occupation, code to the first-named occupation, e.g., chartered accountant and company director, code to accountant. However, the following terms are regarded as synonymous, irrespective of which term is mentioned first:—

fitter and turner with turner and fitter.
storeman and packer with packer and storeman.
sheep and wheat farmer with wheat and sheep farmer.

*Occupations inadequately described or not stated.*

No person is to be allocated to code 860, Occupation Inadequately Described or Not Stated, without reference to the Section Leader, who, if he confirms its use, is to initial the code.

*Additions and Alterations to the Index.*

Under no circumstances is a coder to make any additions or alterations to the index without specific instructions from the Tabulating Superintendent.

*Incompatible and Doubtful Combinations of Occupation and Other Data.*

The following are examples of incompatible and doubtful combinations of occupation and other data which are to be referred to the Section Leader for decision:—

- (a) Any person in government employment shown as Grade E, O or H.
- (b) Any male who states his occupation as Home Duties.
- (c) Labourer (so described), with Grade E or O, or Female Sex.
- (d) Member of work force under 14 years or over 70 years of age.
- (e) Female engaged in a predominantly male occupation, e.g., mining or quarrying workers, fire brigade officers, metal furnace operatives.

*Definitions.*

Certain occupational descriptions appearing in the alphabetical index are qualified as follows:—

- n.e.c. . . . . Not elsewhere classified. A reported occupation description is only to be coded to the number appearing opposite an index entry, so qualified, after the coder has ascertained that the description on the schedule does not appear elsewhere in the index; and, in particular, under some other order of words.
- (so described) . . . . . When an entry in the index is qualified in this manner, generally only reported occupation descriptions with the same or synonymous wording may be coded to the number appearing opposite the entry.
- (C.P.S.) . . . . . Commonwealth Public Service.
- (S.P.S.) . . . . . State Public Service.
- (L.G.) . . . . . Local Government.
- (P.M.G.) . . . . . Postmaster-General's Department.

In a number of other cases, the name of a government department, or other self-explanatory supplementary information has been added in full.
