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## Explanatory Notes

## Introduction

This publication contains annual statistics of births to Queensland mothers, supplementing those published in the national publication "Births" (Catalogue No. 3301.0). Similar publications are produced by most State Offices.

Registration of births is the responsibility of individual State and Territory registrars and is based on the data provided in an information form completed by one of the parents. This information form is the basis of the data provided to the ABS, by individual registrars, for compilation into the aggregate statistics in this publication.

## Coverage

The Queensland figures shown in this publication represent births to mothers usually resident in Queensland, regardless of where in Australia the birth occurred or was registered.

Births which took place overseas, to mothers usually resident in Queensland, are excluded from this publication. Births which occurred in Queensland, to mothers usually resident overseas, are included with the Queensland figures.

## Explanatory Notes (continued)

Coverage (continued)

Prior to 1985, Queensland birth statistics were published in respect of births registered in Queensland rather than in respect of births to mothers usually resident in Queensland. As shown by Table 4 in this issue, this change in basis has only a minor effect on the Queensland figures.

Date of Occurrence and Date of Registration

With the exception of those in Table 3, the statistics in this publication refer to births registered during the calendar year shown. There is usually an interval between the occurrence and registration of a birth and, as a result of delay in registration, some births occurring in one year are not registered until the following year or even later. However, 98 per cent of all births are usually registered within 3 months of occurrence.

Definitions

Births. For statistics in this publication, the term birth relates, unless otherwise stated, to a live birth, i.e. a child, irrespective of the duration of pregnancy, which, after expulsion or extraction from its mother, showed signs of a heart-beat.

Confinements comprise of pregnancies resulting in at least one live birth. Multiple confinements are confinements resulting in two or more births, at least one of which is live-born.

A fetal death (still birth) is recorded in respect of any child whose heart did not beat after its complete expulsion or extraction from its mother, and who weighed at least 500 grams at delivery or, if birthweight was not recorded, was of at least 22 weeks gestation.

Nuptiality. Live births are identified as nuptial where the father registered was married to the mother at the time of the birth, or where the husband died during the pregnancy. Confinements and children of Aboriginal mothers considered to be tribally married are classified as nuptial. Other confinements, and the children resulting from them, are classified as ex-nuptial whether or not the parents were living together at the time of the birth and whether or not the child may subsequently have been legitimated or adopted.

Previous issue are in respect of current marriages only. Issue of former marriages and fetal deaths are excluded.

Birth rates. In this publication several types of rates are shown. In all cases the rates are expressed per 1,000 of the appropriate population.

The crude birth rate is the number of live births registered during the calendar year per 1,000 of mean estimated resident population.

Age-specific birth rates are the live births registered during the calendar year, according to age of mother, per 1,000 of the female resident population of the same age as estimated for 30 June. For calculating these rates,

births to mothers under 15 years are included in the 15 to 19 years female age group, and births to mothers aged 50 years and over are included in the 45 to 49 years female age group.

Total fertility is obtained by summing the five-year age-specific birth rates and multiplying by five. It represents the number of children 1,000 women would bear during their lifetimes if they experienced the rates of the year shown.

The female gross reproduction rate is the sum of the female age-specific fertility rates (i.e. the number of female live births according to age of mother per 1,000 females of that age) multiplied by 5 and divided by 1,000. It represents the average number of daughters that would be born per woman in a group of women all of whom survive to the end of the reproductive period and bear daughters at each age in accordance with the rates prevailing during that year. It is an indication of the extent to which the population would reproduce itself under these conditions, except that it does not allow for females who fail to survive to the end of the childbearing period.

The female net reproduction rate allows for such mortality. It is obtained by multiplying the female age-specific birth rates by the proportion of survivors at corresponding ages in a life table, adding the products and dividing by 1,000. The female net reproduction rate represents the average number of daughters born to a group of women who are subjected to the fertility rates of that year and to the mortality rates of the life table.

The masculinity ratio is the number of male live births per 100 female live births.

The fetal death rate is the number of fetal deaths per 1,000 of both live births and fetal deaths.

Median is that value (age or duration of marriage) which divides the relevant population into two equal parts, half of the cases falling below this value and half exceeding it.

Geographical Areas

Table 12 provides certain births statistics for statistical divisions, statistical districts, and rings and sectors within the Brisbane Statistical Division.

Statistical divisions are groupings of local authority areas in relatively homogeneous regions characterized by identifiable social and economic links between the inhabitants and between the economic units within the regions, under the unifying influence of one or more major towns or cities. There are 11 statistical divisions in Queensland as shown on the map on page 17.

Statistical districts have been delineated around selected urban centres with a population of 25,000 or more experiencing urban growth beyond the local authority boundaries. The districts are intended to contain the anticipated spread of the urban centre and associated contiguous small urban centres over the next 20 years. There are currently seven statistical districts in Queensland, centred at Bundaberg, Cairns, Gold Coast, Mackay, Rockhampton, Sunshine Coast, and Townsville.

Rings and sectors have been designed to provide for broader areas than the suburbs of Brisbane City and the surrounding local authority areas within the Brisbane Statistical Division. A map delineating the rings and sectors, and a listing of the suburbs and localities in each, are provided on pages 19 and 20.

Summary of Findings

Number of Births

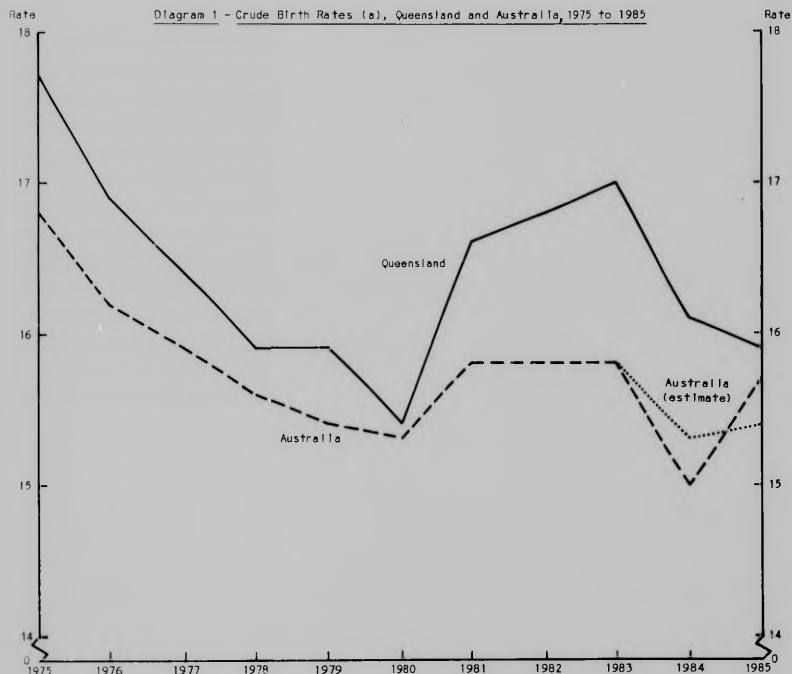
Total births to Queensland mothers during 1985 remained at much the same level as in 1984. The total for 1985 was 40,437, compared with 40,446 for 1984.

Analysis of the 1984 and 1985 figures shows that nuptial births decreased by 1.8 per cent (to 32,901) while ex-nuptial births increased by 8.6 per cent (to 7,536). This substantial rise in ex-nuptial births in 1985 follows a substantial fall in 1984 when ex-nuptial births were down by 8.1 per cent on the 1983 figure.

Birth Rates

The crude birth rate (births per 1,000 mean estimated resident population) for Queensland has declined for the second year in succession. After reaching a peak of 17.0 in 1983, the rate fell to 16.1 in 1984 and to 15.9 in 1985. Prior to this decline, the rate had increased from a record low rate of 15.4 in 1980 after falling consistently since 1971 when a rate of 21.7 was recorded.

The crude birth rate for Queensland is consistently above the national rate, as illustrated by the following diagram. Abnormal delays in the births registration process in New South Wales during 1984 have affected the national figures for 1984 and 1985. Estimates of the national rates, which would have been obtained if there had been no such delays, are also shown in the diagram.

The age-specific birth rates for Queensland females decreased for most age groups in 1985. The largest decrease was in respect of the 20 to 24 year age group for which the rate fell from 111.2 in 1984 to 108.1 in 1985. Similarly, the rate for the 25 to 29 year age group fell from 148.3 to 145.7 and for females aged under 20 years the rate dropped from 31.6 to 29.6. In contrast, the rate for the 30 to 34 year age group increased from 79.6 to 81.6 and for the 35 to 39 year age group the rate increased from 24.5 to 25.4.

## Summary of Findings (continued)

## Birth Rates (continued)

The female net reproduction rate for Queensland fell for the second successive year. After reaching 0.999 in 1983, it has decreased to 0.953 in 1984 and 0.941 in 1985. The rate has been below the replacement level of 1.000 since 1978, having fallen consistently since 1959 when a post-war record of 1.811 was attained.

## Plurality

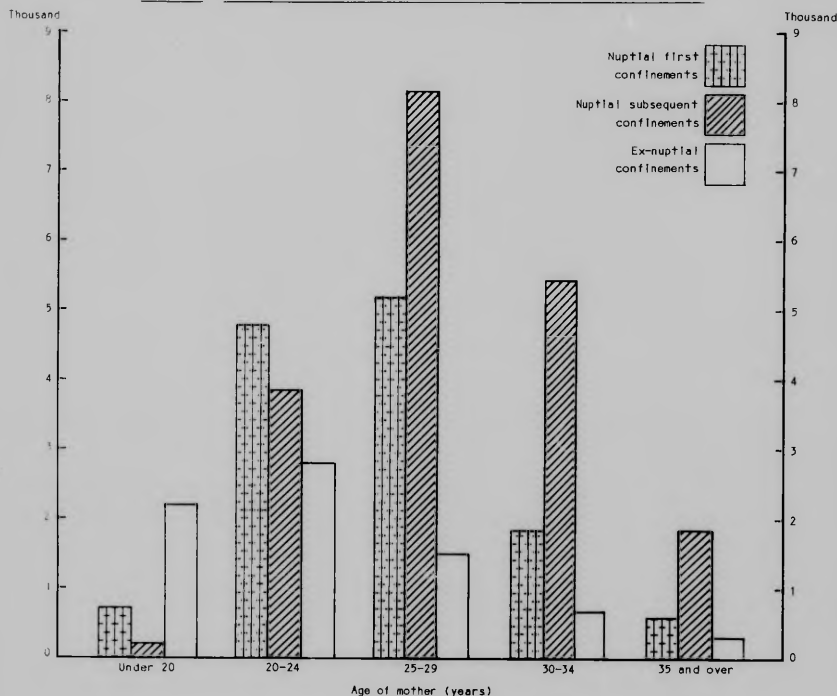
Approximately 11 confinements in every 1,000 during 1985 resulted in multiple births. Of the 40,003 confinements in 1985, 39,572 (98.92 per cent) resulted in single births, 421 (1.05 per cent) produced twins, and the remaining 10 (0.02 per cent) produced triplets. These figures differ little from those obtained in recent years.

## Age of Mother at Birth of Child

Of the 40,437 births during 1985, 34,516 (85.4 per cent) were to mothers aged 20 to 34 years. A further 3,145 (7.8 per cent) were to mothers under 20 years of age and the remaining 2,771 (6.9 per cent) were to mothers aged 35 years and over.

Unmarried mothers tend to be younger than married mothers at time of birth of the child. This is highlighted by the 1985 figures which show that 29.4 per cent of ex-nuptial births were to mothers aged under 20 years, compared with only 2.8 per cent of nuptial births to mothers of that age group. It must be noted, however, that a majority of nuptial confinements (59.7 per cent in 1985) are in respect of second or subsequent births whereas it is likely that most of the ex-nuptial confinements are in respect of first-born children.

Age of Mother at Birth of Child (continued)

The tendency to defer marriage, noted in recent years, is reflected in the median age of mothers at nuptial first confinement. In 1985, median age at nuptial first confinement was 25.9 years, having increased from 23.7 in 1975. For all nuptial confinements, the annual figures for median age of mother at confinement increased consistently during the same period from 25.8 to 27.5 years of age, and for ex-nuptial confinements there was a general rise from 21.3 to 22.5 years of age.

Duration of Marriage at Birth of Child

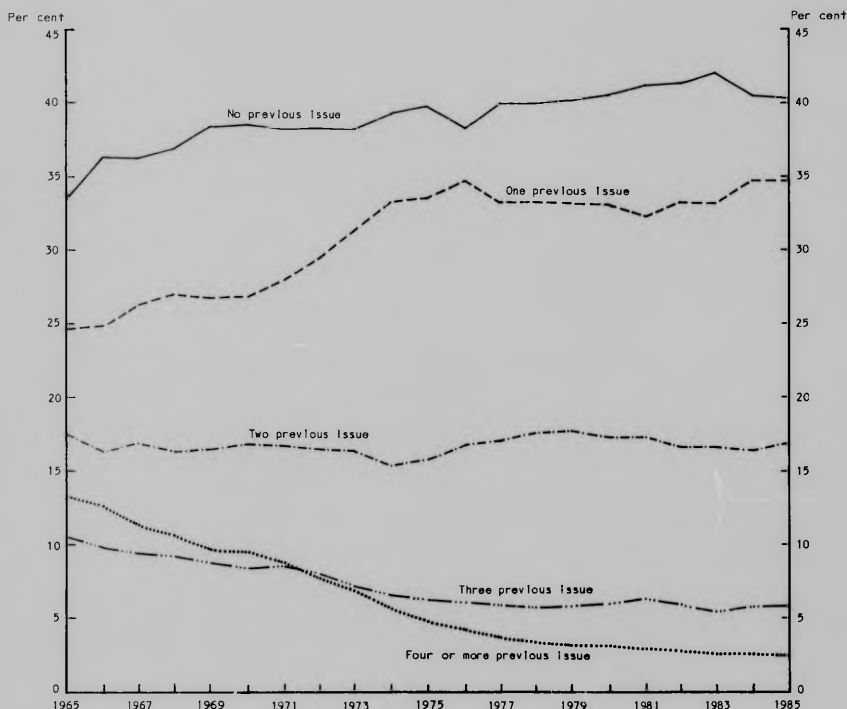
Of the 32,533 nuptial confinements in 1985, 10.4 per cent were in respect of mothers with a duration of marriage of less than 1 year, 44.9 per cent with durations from 1 year to less than 5 years, and the remaining 44.7 per cent with durations of 5 years or more.

In the case of nuptial first confinements, 83.3 per cent were those where the mother had been married for less than 5 years, 25.0 per cent where the mother had been married less than 1 year, and 14.1 per cent where the mother had been married 6 months or less.

Previous Issue of the Marriage

The long-term trend towards smaller families is apparent from the figures showing nuptial confinements classified according to number of previous issue of the existing marriage.

Previous Issue of the Marriage (continued)

Diagram 3 shows that while 13.3 per cent of married mothers who were confined in 1965 have previous issue numbering four or more, the corresponding proportion had decreased to 2.5 per cent in 1985. The proportion for married mothers with three previous issue also declined from 10.5 per cent in 1965 to 5.8 per cent in 1985, whereas the proportion for those with two previous issue remained relatively constant (17.5 per cent in 1965 and 16.8 in 1985). In contrast, the proportion for mothers with one previous issue rose significantly from 24.6 per cent to 34.7 per cent in the period and the proportion for mothers with no previous issue increased from 34.0 per cent to 40.3 per cent.

Birthplaces of Parents

In 1985 there were 24,187 nuptial confinements for which both parents were Australian-born. This represents 74.3 per cent of all nuptial confinements. In another 5,875 (18.1 per cent) nuptial confinements only one parent was Australian-born, while in the remaining 2,471 (7.6 per cent) such confinements both the mother and father were born overseas. Less than half (47.6 per cent) of all nuptial confinements in 1985 were in respect of cases where both the mother and father were born in Queensland.

For ex-nuptial confinements, details are available only for the mother and the 1985 figures show that 6,542 (87.6 per cent) of these were in respect of Australian-born mothers while 928 (12.4 per cent) were for overseas-born mothers. Almost two-thirds (64.1 per cent) of all ex-nuptial confinements were of mothers born in Queensland.

Diagram 4 - Nuptial and Ex-nuptial Confinements by Birthplace, Queensland, 1985

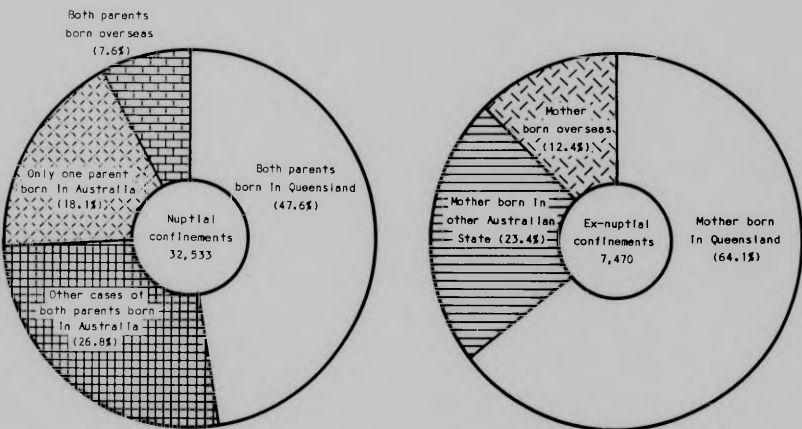

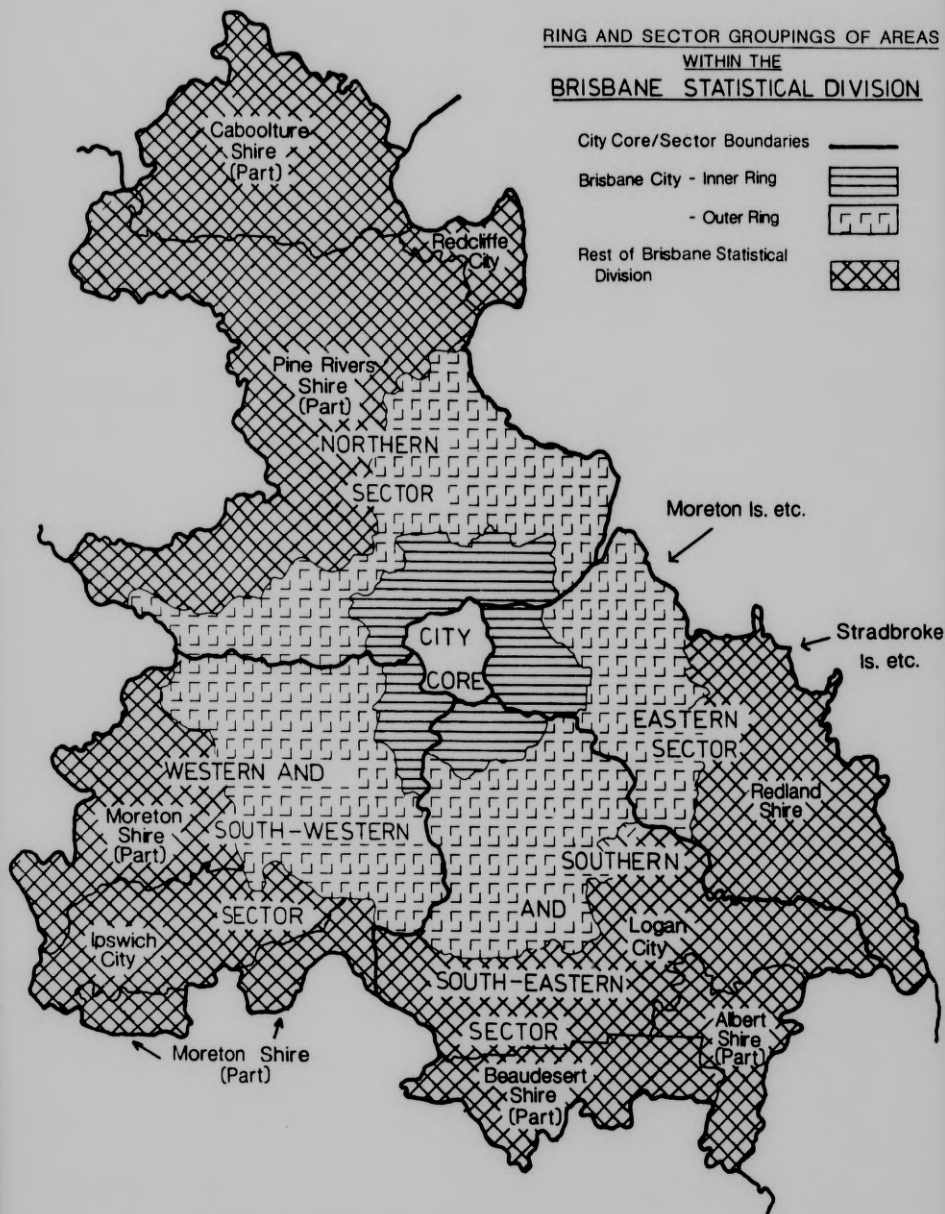
