PREFACE.

In the present Bulletin, the first of its series, are presented some statistics relating to Education, Hospitals and Charities, and Law and Crime for the Commonwealth of Australia.

It will be noticed that in several of the Tables that are given the figures for some of the States are absent, as they were not obtainable. In these cases it was felt that it would be better to furnish the figures at the disposal of the Bureau rather than to omit the Tables altogether. In this connection it may be mentioned that it was intended to include several other Tables, but owing to the absence of information in the case of some of the States these had to be omitted from the present issue. In all these cases the collection of the necessary data by the various States will make it possible to furnish fuller information in future issues of this Bulletin.
