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EXPLANATORY NOTES

Introduction

This publication contains statistics of persons arriving in, and departing from, Australia for the quarter ended 30 June 1986, together with five-year time series for the major characteristics of travellers. Monthly statistics, in less detail, are released in the publication, *Overseas Arrivals and Departures, Australia* (3401.0) in advance of quarterly statistics.

Source of the statistics

2. Persons arriving in, or departing from, Australia are required to complete prescribed questionnaires in the form of Incoming and Outgoing Passenger cards (see Appendix A). These cards provide information to the Department of Immigration and Ethnic Affairs for administrative purposes and serve as the source of statistics of overseas arrivals and departures. In accordance with the *Census and Statistics Act 1905*, information relating to individuals, individual flights or ships and individual carriers, which is contained in these cards or other documents, is treated as confidential by the ABS.

Scope

3. The statistics in this publication relate to the number of movements of travellers rather than the number of travellers (i.e. the multiple movements of individual persons during a given reference period are each counted separately). However, the statistics exclude the movements of operational air crew and ships' crew, transit passengers who pass through Australia but are not cleared for entry, and passengers on pleasure cruises commencing and finishing in Australia aboard ships not then engaged on regular voyages.

Definitions

Category of movement

4. Category of movement is primarily determined by the traveller's selection of his or her own category on the passenger card. This selection is accepted provided it is consistent with other information on the card.

Permanent movement

5. Permanent movement comprises arrivals of settlers (i.e. persons who hold migrant visas, regardless of stated intended period of stay), New Zealand citizens who indicate an intention to settle, those who are otherwise eligible to settle (e.g. overseas born children of Australian citizens), and permanent departures of Australian residents, including former settlers (i.e. those who on departure state that they do not intend to return to Australia). This definition of settlers is now identical to that used by the Department of Immigration and Ethnic Affairs. Prior to 1985 the definition of settlers used by the ABS was the stated intention of the traveller only. Numerically the effect of the change in definition is insignificant, and the change was made to avoid the confusion caused by minor differences between data on settlers published separately by ABS and the Department of Immigration and Ethnic Affairs.

Long-term movement

6. Long-term movement is defined as the arrivals of visitors (except those who hold migrant visas—see paragraph 5) and the temporary departures of Australian residents with the intention to stay, in Australia or abroad respectively, for twelve months or more, together with the departures of visitors and the return of Australian residents who had stayed, in Australia or abroad, for twelve months or more.

Short-term movement

7. Movements of travellers whose intended or actual period of stay is less than twelve months are classified as short-term, except those who on arrival hold migrant visas (see also paragraph 5).

8. A significant number of travellers (i.e. visitors to Australia on arrival and Australian residents going abroad) state exactly 12 months or one year as their intended period of stay. Many of them stay for less than that period and on their departure from, or return to, Australia are therefore classified as short-term. Accordingly, in an attempt to maintain consistency between arrivals and departures, movements of travellers who report their actual or intended period of stay as being one year exactly are randomly allocated to long-term or short-term, in proportion to the number of movements of travellers who report their actual length of stay as up to one month more, or one month less, than one year.

Country of embarkation or disembarkation

9. Country of embarkation or disembarkation refers to the country in which travellers board the flight or ship which brings them to Australia, or alight from the flight or ship which takes them from Australia. Travellers may answer this incorrectly, perhaps naming the country in which their journey commenced or will end, notwithstanding any changes of flight or ship en route.

State of clearance

10. State of clearance refers to the State in which a passenger is cleared by Customs and Immigration authorities. Embarkation or disembarkation and clearance are usually, but not necessarily, in the same State.

State or country of residence

11. State of residence or country of residence refers to the State or country in which travellers regard themselves as living or as last having lived. State of intended residence is derived from the intended address given by settlers and Australian residents returning after a journey abroad. Particularly in the case of the former, this information does not necessarily relate to the State in which a traveller will eventually establish a permanent residence.

Country of birth, residence or citizenship

12. The grouping of countries into regions is based on 'United Nations' classification of world regions.

13. Statistics on country of birth, residence or citizenship have certain limitations. For instance, it is not possible to make a distinction between Northern Ireland and the Republic of Ireland. (for the tables in this publication 'Ireland' refers to 'The Republic of Ireland' plus 'Ireland, undefined') nor to identify separately England, Scotland and Wales. Similarly 'Korea' could refer to North or South Korea and 'Germany' to the Federal Republic or to the Democratic Republic.

State of stay and country of stay for short-term travellers

14. Overseas visitors are asked on arrival for their intended address and on departure for the name of the State in which they spent most time. Australian residents travelling overseas are asked on departure for the name of the country in which they intend to spend most time and on their return for the name of the country in which they spent most time.

Occupation

15. From July 1979, occupation data are only available for permanent and long-term movement. Permanent arrivals are allocated to an occupation group on the basis of recognised occupational qualifications at the time of application for entry to Australia, and permanent departures and all long-term movements are coded to occupation groups on the basis of the occupation stated on the passenger card.

Estimation method

16. Overseas arrival and departure statistics are derived from a combination of full enumeration and sampling. Fully enumerated strata cover all movements by sea regardless of duration of stay, all permanent movements and all movements with a duration of stay of more than one year. All movements by air with a duration of stay equal to or less than one year are sampled and statistics relating to these movements are therefore estimates which may differ from statistics which would have been obtained if details of all these movements had been processed. Details of the sampling method and comments on the sampling errors associated with the estimates are contained in the Technical Note, Appendix B.

Corrections and imputations

17. The imprecision due to sampling errors should not be confused with errors arising from imperfections in reporting, which may occur in any data collection, whether sampled or not. Every effort is made to minimise such errors, both through careful design of the passenger cards and through checks on the information once it is received. During the edit process some items are corrected where they conflict with other known information. Missing replies to certain items such as age, sex and country of birth are also imputed by reference to other related items.

18. Errors of this kind differ from discrepancies arising from the fact that certain information reflects the travellers' intentions at the time the cards were completed. These intentions are of course subject to change. The items

particularly affected by such discrepancies are the distinction between permanent and temporary movement and in the latter case, length of intended stay, country of intended stay, State of intended residence and reason for journey.

NOTE: The estimates in this publication are subject to both sampling and other errors and have been rounded to a level consistent with their general validity. The sums of components may not add to totals, due to rounding.

Additional statistics available

19. In some cases, the ABS can make available information which is not published. This information may be made available in one or more of the following forms: microfiche, photocopy, data tape, computer printout, clerically-extracted tabulations. Generally, a charge is made for providing unpublished information. A full list of Overseas Arrival and Departure tabulations regularly produced is available on request.

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SUMMARY OF FINDINGS

This publication contains statistics on overseas arrivals and departures for June quarter 1986. More up-to-date statistics are published in a monthly publication, *Overseas Arrivals and Departures, Australia* (3401.0) which contains less detailed data for each month.

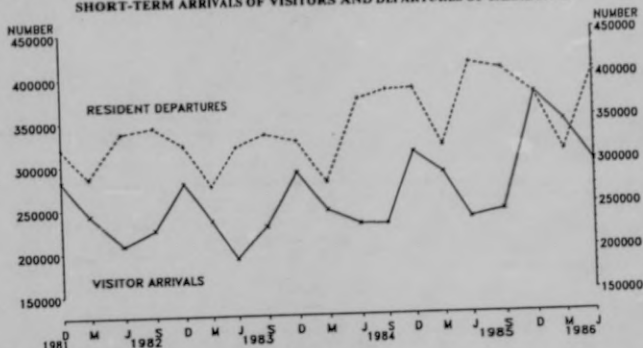
Total Movement

The general increase in overseas movements continued in June quarter 1986. The total number of movements into and out of Australia was 1.4 million, comprising 674,000 arrivals and 747,000 departures. These movements represent an increase of 11 per cent for arrivals and 9 per cent for departures over the corresponding quarter in 1985. As in previous quarters, the bulk of total movements were short-term movements (94 per cent of arrivals and 97 per cent of departures).

Arrivals of Overseas Visitors for Short-term Visits

In June quarter 1986, there were 297,200 arrivals of overseas visitors for short-term visits, an increase of 27 per cent compared with June quarter 1985. The most important sources of visitors were New Zealand (30 per cent of arrivals), U.S.A. (18 per cent), Japan (11 per cent) and the U.K. and Ireland (9 per cent). 48 per cent of short-term arrivals of overseas visitors were for the purpose of 'holiday or accompanying business traveller' compared with 43 per cent in June quarter 1985. The proportion of arrivals for the purpose of 'visiting relatives' was 20 per cent compared with 24 per cent one year ago. As in the past quarters, the intended period of stay for the majority of short-term arrivals was short, with 73 per cent intending to stay for less than one month (including 28 per cent less than one week).

Departures of Australian Residents for Short-term Visits overseas

The number of Australian resident departures for short-term visits overseas during the June quarter 1986 was 404,100, a decline of 2 per cent compared with June quarter 1985. The U.K. and Ireland were the main destinations (17 per cent of resident departures), followed by New Zealand (13 per cent), the U.S.A. (10 per cent), Hong Kong (7 per cent) and Indonesia (6 per cent).

In June quarter 1986, nearly 58 per cent of resident departures for short-term visits overseas were for the purpose of 'holiday or accompanying business traveller', another 20 per cent were for 'visiting relatives' and a further 17 per cent were for 'business, employment' purposes. The intended period of stay of most short-term departures (53 per cent) was less than one month (including 5 per cent for less than one week).

Permanent and Long-term Movement

Arrivals for permanent settlement and long-term visits during June quarter 1986 numbered 43,200, an increase of 19 per cent compared with June quarter 1985.

The number of settlers born in Europe who arrived in June quarter 1986 was 7,500, an increase of 42 per cent over the number in June quarter 1985 (5,290). Settlers born in Oceania (mainly New Zealand) numbered 4,160, an increase of 30 per cent over the corresponding quarter in 1985 (3,210). Settlers born in Asia numbered 9,730 in June quarter 1986, an increase of 15 per cent over the 8,450 recorded in the June quarter 1985. As a result of the different rates of increase, the proportion of settlers born in Europe increased from 28 per cent of all settlers arriving in June quarter 1985 to 31 per cent for the same quarter in 1986, and the proportion of those born in Asia declined from 45 per cent to 40 per cent. The proportion of settlers born in Oceania remained the same as in the March quarter 1985, at 17 per cent.

APPENDIX B

TECHNICAL NOTE: METHOD OF SAMPLING AND RELIABILITY OF ESTIMATES

Method of sampling

All movements by air with a duration of stay less than one year are sampled using the following stratification:

Country of Citizenship	Sample
U.S.A., U.K., Ireland, Australia or New Zealand	1 in 20
Canada or Japan	1 in 10
Any other individual country	1 in 4

Reliability of estimates

Estimates based on a sample are subject to sampling variability, i.e. they may differ from those that would be obtained from a full enumeration.

The sampling error associated with any estimate can be estimated from the sample results and one measure so derived is the standard error. Given an estimate and the standard error on that estimate, there are about two

chances in three that the sample estimate will differ by less than one standard error from the figure that would have been obtained from full enumeration, and about nineteen chances in twenty that the difference will be less than two standard errors. Another measure of the sampling error is the relative standard error which is obtained by expressing the standard error as a percentage of the estimate.

It would be impracticable to publish estimates of standard errors for all figures in individual tables. However, the following table of standard errors and relative standard errors gives an indication of the magnitude of the sampling error associated with any estimate of a particular size for short-term and total movement. Long-term movement is subject to some sampling in that some movements of one year's duration (which are sampled) are allocated to the long-term category. The numbers involved, however, are small and resultant sampling errors associated with figures of long-term movement are negligible.

An example of the use of this table is as follows: if the estimate of the number of Australian resident departures for short-term visits is 500, then the standard error on this estimate is 95, i.e. there are two chances in three that the actual number of Australian resident departures for a short-term visit will lie between 405 and 595 and nineteen chances in twenty that it will lie between 310 and 690.

As the table shows, the larger the size of an estimate the smaller the relative standard error. For any estimate of greater than 10,000 the relative standard error will be less than 4 per cent and so the sampling error can be assumed to be negligible for most practical purposes.

The estimate of the difference between an estimate in two different periods or between estimates from the same period is also subject to sampling error. The standard

error on the difference between any two estimates which are subject to sampling error can be approximated by using the larger standard error of the estimates inflated by a factor of 1.4. An example of the use of this procedure is as follows:

Assume the estimates of the number of arrivals to Australia of visitors who stated 'attending convention' as the purpose of journey in July 1983 and 1984 are 1,500 and 900 respectively. The difference between the 1983 and the 1984 figures is 600 and the standard errors on these estimates are approximately 115 and 87. The standard error on the difference is approximately $(1.4 \times 115) = 161$, and there are nineteen chances in twenty that the estimate of the difference between the two years will lie between 240 and 960.
