

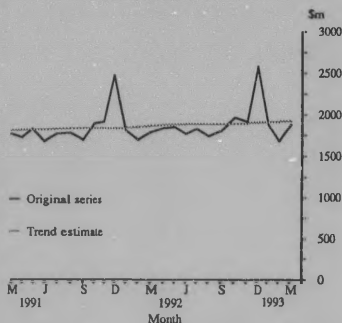

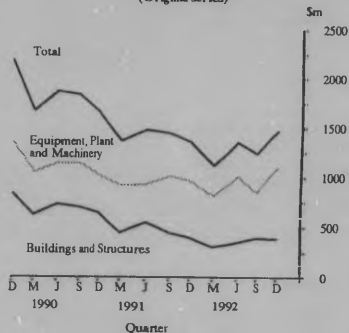


Retail trade

In March 1993, turnover of retail establishments in Victoria was \$1,897.9m, representing 24.2 per cent of the national figure of \$7,835.2m.

With the exception of July 1992, the Victorian trend estimate increased each month since December 1991. The trend estimate in March 1993 was 2.9 per cent above the corresponding March 1992 figure. At the national level, the trend estimate increased in each of the twelve months to March 1993, with an increase of 2.6 per cent over the whole period.

Private new capital expenditure

Actual private new capital expenditure in Victoria during the December quarter 1992 was \$1,473m, which was 8.5 per cent above the December quarter 1991 level. In seasonally adjusted terms, the December quarter 1992 expenditure was 12.4 per cent above the September quarter 1992.

At the national level, actual new private capital expenditure during the December quarter 1992 was \$7,020m, which was 10.7 per cent above the December 1991 level. In seasonally adjusted terms, the December quarter 1992 expenditure was 13.0 per cent above the September quarter 1992.

Readers are reminded that trend estimates are subject to revision as subsequent months data become available.

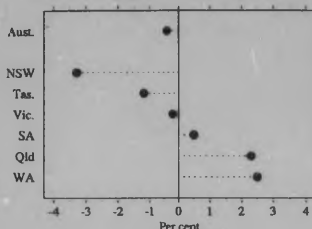

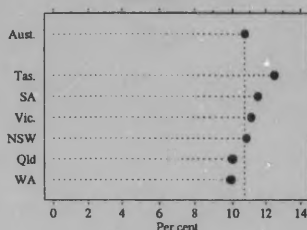

VICTORIA IN RELATION TO OTHER STATES AND AUSTRALIA

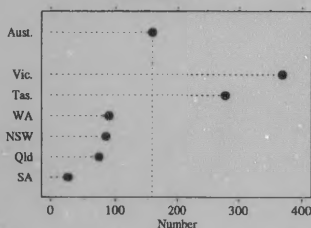
EMPLOYED PERSONS

April 1993



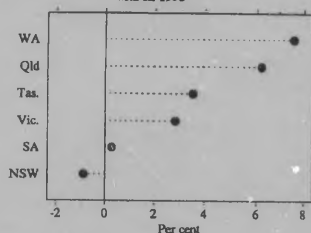
UNEMPLOYMENT RATE

April 1993



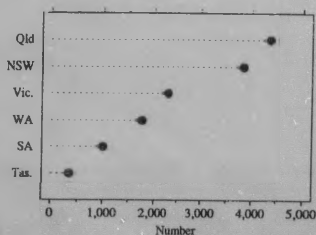
INDUSTRIAL DISPUTES

December quarter 1992

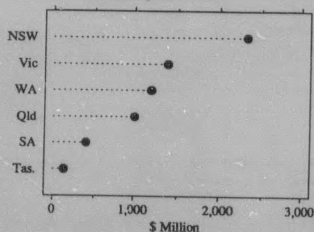

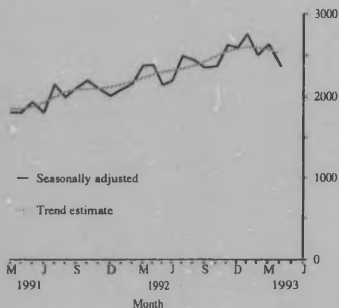
UNEMPLOYMENT RATE OF THE CIVILIAN

(Seasonally adjusted)



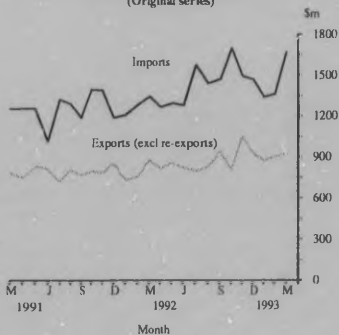
CONSUMER PRICE INDEX: ALL GROUPS
Percentage change from previous quarter



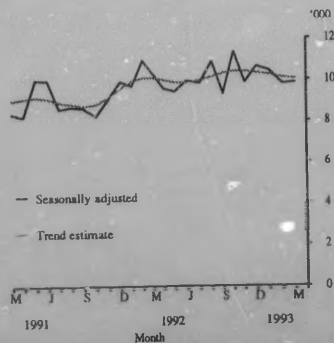
NUMBER OF NEW RESIDENTIAL DWELLING
UNITS APPROVED, VICTORIA



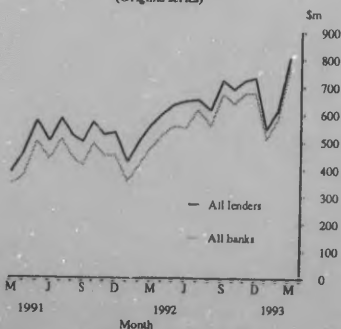
VALUE OF IMPORTS INTO, AND EXPORTS
