Explanatory Notes

Introduction

This publication contains statistics for overseas shipping and cargo which have been compiled from statistical returns furnished to the Australian Customs Service at each port in Australia.

2. Data are also presented for Queensland railway operations as well as passenger, freight, and aircraft movements at Queensland airports.

3. Details of motor vehicle registrations and road traffic accident statistics, both obtained from ABS collections, are also included.

Shipping

4. Cargo statistics are recorded in revenue tonnes, which is the unit of quantity used predominantly in the shipping industry. It is the basis on which freight is charged and is obtained by adding mass units (tonnes weight) where the freight is charged according to its mass and volume units (cubic metres) where the freight is charged according to its volume. Because revenue tonnes are derived by adding mass units and volume units they should be used with care.

Road Traffic Accidents

Definitions

5. A road traffic accident is an accident which was reported to the police and which followed from the movement of at least one road vehicle on a road and resulted in death or personal injury to any person, or property damage in excess of \$1,000.

6. A road traffic accident involving casualties is recorded when any person involved in the accident dies or is injured.

7. An injury is recorded when any person involved in a road traffic accident requires medical treatment.

8. A death is recorded when any person is killed or dies within 30 days from injuries received in the accident.

9. A road is any thoroughfare open to the public.

10. Statistical divisions. For statistical purposes local authority areas, as defined under the "Local Government Act 1936-1986", and comprising cities shown (C), towns (T), and shires, are grouped into statistical divisions.

Definitions (continued)

11. Brisbane Statistical Division, comprises the Cities of Brisbane, Ipswich, Logan, and Redcliffe, the Shire of Redland, and parts of the Shires of Albert, Beaudesert, Caboolture, Maroon, and Pine Rivers.
