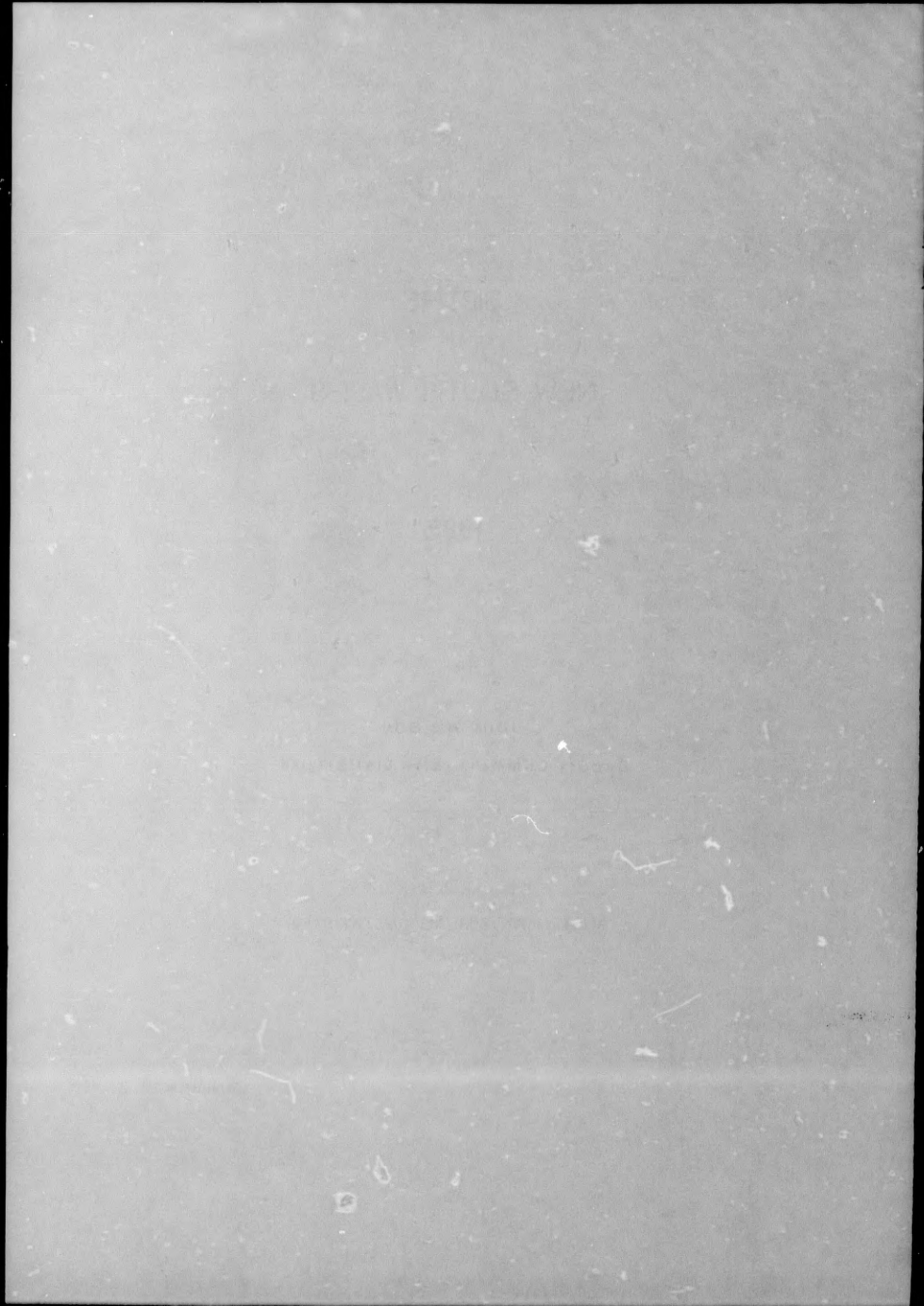

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MAIN FEATURES

NOTE: Abnormal delays in the registration of births at the N.S.W. Registry of Births, Deaths and Marriages in 1984 resulted in more births than expected being registered in 1985 - See Explanatory Notes 7, 8 and 9. This had a corresponding effect on the Australian total. The actual number of births registered in Australia in 1985 to residents of New South Wales was 87,786 (crude rate of 16.04) which was a 13 per cent increase over the 1984 figure of 77,994 (crude rate of 14.41).

- The proportion of ex-nuptial live births to total live births was 15.62 per cent in 1985, the highest ever recorded in New South Wales - this continues the long-term upward trend. (See Table 1.)
- The proportion of ex-nuptial live births where paternity was acknowledged has continued to increase each year from 56 per cent in 1976 (the first year for which such information is available) to 73 per cent in 1985. (See Table 14.)
- The median ages of mothers (all confinements) and fathers (nuptial confinements) have continued to rise steadily, and in 1985 were 27.41 years and 30.64 years respectively (See Table 1.)

EXPLANATORY NOTES

This publication contains annual statistics on births for New South Wales, supplementing those published in the national 'Births, Australia' (3301.0).

2. Birth statistics are presented on the basis of the State or Territory of usual residence of the mother, regardless of where in Australia the birth occurred or was registered. However tables 13-17 in this publication are on the basis of the State of registration, due to the unavailability of certain data items relating to occurrences in other States, and the need to include a table (Table 16) for comparability purposes with previous years.

3. In publications for years prior to 1983, birth statistics were presented on the basis of the State or Territory where the birth was registered.

4. Births to mothers usually resident in Australia which took place overseas are excluded. Births to mothers usually resident overseas which occurred in Australia are included in the State or Territory where the birth occurred.

Statistics

5. With the exception of Table 3, the statistics in this publication refer to births registered (either in New South Wales or elsewhere in Australia) during the calendar year shown.

6. As a result of normal delays in registration, some births occurring in one year are not registered until the following year or even later. However, 98 per cent of all births are usually registered within 3 months of occurrence.

7. During the latter half of 1984 there were abnormal delays (caused by administrative

problems) in the registration processes at the N.S.W. Registry of Births, Deaths and Marriages, the effects of which were not completely overcome until the end of 1985. The significance of the delays is illustrated by the fact that only 77,314 births were registered in 1984 compared with 87,258 in 1985. These figures represent crude rates of 14.29 and 15.94 respectively. If normal circumstances had prevailed, it is estimated that 81,752 births (crude rate of 15.22) would have been registered in 1984 and 82,820 (crude rate of 15.13) in 1985. As a comparison, the 1983 actual figures were 82,739 and 15.43 respectively.

8. As a result of these delays the number of births to mothers whose usual residence was in New South Wales has been affected. There were 77,994 births to New South Wales mothers in 1984 and 87,786 in 1985. These figures represent crude rates of 14.41 and 16.04 respectively. If normal circumstances had prevailed, it is estimated that 82,392 births to New South Wales mothers (crude rate of 15.22) would have been registered in 1984 and 83,388 (crude rate of 15.23) in 1985. As a comparison the 1983 actual figures were 83,307 and 15.54 respectively.

9. Caution should be exercised when comparing the actual number of births registered in 1984 and 1985 (whether relating to births registered in New South Wales or births to N.S.W. mothers registered in Australia) with figures for earlier years for the reasons outlined in Explanatory Notes 7 and 8 above. However, comparisons of proportions, percentages and averages of characteristics with those of earlier years should remain reasonably valid as there is no evidence to suggest that the births not registered in 1984 were atypical.

Definitions

10. Births. For statistics in this publication, the term birth relates to a LIVE BIRTH i.e. A product of conception, irrespective of the duration of pregnancy, which, after expulsion or extraction from its mother, breathes or shows any other evidence of life such as heart-beat.

11. Confinements are pregnancies resulting in at least one live birth. Multiple confinements are confinements resulting in two or more births, at least one of which is live born.

12. Nuptiality. Live births are identified as nuptial, where the father of the child, as stated in the Register of Births, was married to the mother at the time of birth, or where the husband died during the pregnancy. Other confinements, and the children resulting from them, are classified as ex-nuptial whether or not the parents were living together at the time of the birth and whether or not the child may subsequently have been legitimated or adopted.

13. Previous issue is the number of children born alive (whether still living or deceased) to a woman during her current marriage. Children by the same father who were born to the same mother, and legally adopted children are included. However fetal deaths and issue of former marriages are excluded.

14. The crude birth rate is the number of live births registered during the calendar year per 1,000 of the mean estimated resident population.

15. Age specific birth rates are the live births registered during the calendar year, according to age of mother, per 1,000 of the female resident population of the same age as estimated for 30 June. For calculating these rates, births to mothers under 15 are included in the 15-19 female age group, and births to mothers aged 50 and over are included in the 45-49 female age group. Pro rate adjustment is made in respect of births for which age of mother is not given.

16. Total fertility is obtained by summing the 5 - year age - specific birth rates and multiplying by 5. It represents the number of children 1,000 women would bear during their lifetimes if they experienced the rates of the year shown.

17. The general fertility rate is the number of births to mothers aged 15-44 per 1,000 estimated female resident population of the same age group at 30 June.

18. The female gross reproduction rate is the sum of the female age-specific fertility rates (i.e. the number of female live births according to age of mother per 1,000 females of that age)

multiplied by 5 and divided by 1,000. It represents the average number of daughters that would be born per woman in a group of women all of whom survive to the end of the reproductive period and bear daughters at each age in accordance with the rates prevailing during that year. It is an indication of the extent to which the population would reproduce itself under these conditions, except that it does not allow for females who fail to survive to the end of the childbearing period.

19. The female net reproduction rate allows for such mortality. It is obtained by multiplying the female age-specific birth rates by the proportion of survivors at corresponding ages in a life table, adding the products and dividing by 1,000. The female net reproduction rate represents the average number of daughters born to a group of women who are subjected to the fertility rates of that year and to the mortality rates of the life table.

20. The sex ratio of births is the number of male live births per 100 female live births.

21. The median is that value (age or duration of marriage) which divides the relevant population into two equal parts, one half of the cases falling below this value and one half exceeding it.

Estimated resident population

22. Since the 30 June 1981 Census of Population and Housing, a new conceptual basis has been adopted for calculating official estimates of the population. A detailed explanation of the new basis is given in the ABS Information Paper entitled 'Population Estimates: An outline of the Conceptual Basis of ABS Population Estimates' (Cat. No. 3216-0). On this basis, population estimates are compiled according to the 'place of usual residence' of the population and, as such, are referred to as Estimated Resident Population. All population estimates since 30 June 1981 have been made on this basis, whereas estimates made prior to the adoption of the new concept were based on census counts of persons according to where they were located on census night (i.e. at their 'place of actual location' on that night) plus an adjustment for under-enumeration and updated by using available measures of population change. For comparability purposes, estimates on the new basis have been compiled back to 1971 for the State as a whole and have been used to derive the mean estimated resident populations shown in Table 18.

Statistical areas of New South Wales

23. (a) For the purpose of presenting the principal series of official statistics for the

State, New South Wales is divided into a number of geographical areas. These areas consist, for the most part, of aggregations of local government areas.

(b) The primary division of the State is into 12 statistical divisions. These are intended to represent 'regions' of the State which are characterised by discernible social and/or economic links between the inhabitants and economic units within them, under the unifying influence of one or more major cities or towns. The boundaries of the divisions have accordingly been delineated on the basic criterion that the degree of economic and/or social contact and interaction within each division should be maximised. It should be emphasised that the boundaries of the divisions cannot be regarded as sharp lines of demarcation - they may, of necessity, be positioned within peripheral zones in which the influence of two or more 'focal' cities or towns overlap in varying degrees.

(c) In the case of Sydney and its periphery, some additional factors were taken into account in drawing the divisional boundary. The Sydney Statistical Division is predominantly urban in character - and its boundary was re-delineated in 1976 to embrace the area expected to contain the urban development of Sydney (and associated smaller urban centres) for a period of at least twenty years. This area covers the same area as the 'Sydney Region', as delineated by the State Planning Authority (now the N.S.W. Department of Environment and Planning) in its publication Sydney Region, 1970-2000 A.D., Outline Plan.

(d) The statistical divisions are subdivided to provide a second tier of statistical areas comprising statistical districts and statistical subdivisions.

(e) Statistical districts are areas which encompass an urban centre with a population of 25,000 or more and which are predominantly urban in character. They have been delineated using concepts and criteria similar to those for the Sydney Statistical Division.

(f) Statistical subdivisions within Sydney Statistical Division were delineated in 1976, in order to provide statistical areas of optimum assistance to users (particularly physical and social planners). The boundaries of the seven subdivisions created within Sydney Statistical Division have been drawn to coincide with the regions formed by the former Department of Urban and Regional Development.

(g) Statistical subdivisions outside Sydney Statistical Division are component areas within

statistical divisions which have been delineated broadly on the basis of topographical and/or climatic features and reflect, inter alia, some degree of homogeneity of agricultural activity.

(h) The statistical areas, and their constituent local government areas, are listed in Table 5 on pages 3-13 and are shown on the map at the back of this publication. It should be noted that the local government areas and the boundaries shown on this map are those which existed at 30 June 1985.

Additional statistics available

24. In some cases, the ABS can also make available information which is not published - see Appendix A for details. This information may be made available in one or more of the following forms: microfiche, photocopy, data tape, computer printout, clerically-extracted tabulation. DIAGRAM A. LIVE BIRTHS, N.S.W. : WEIGHT AT BIRTH, 1985

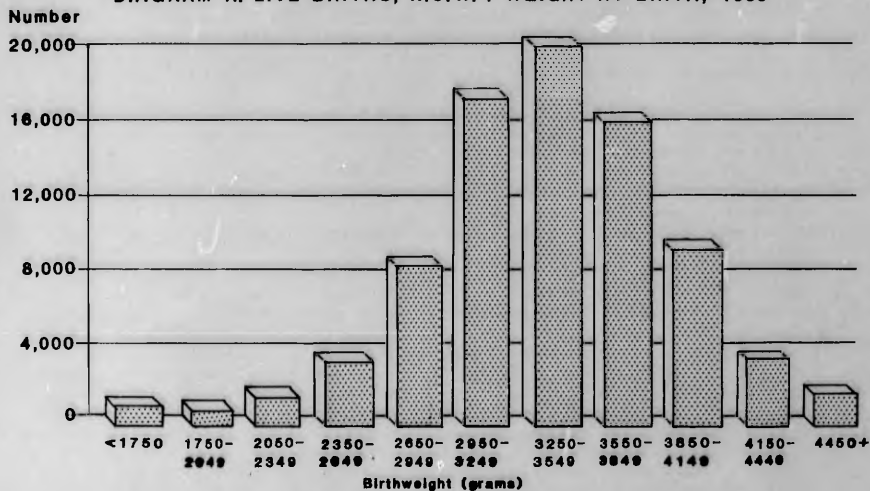

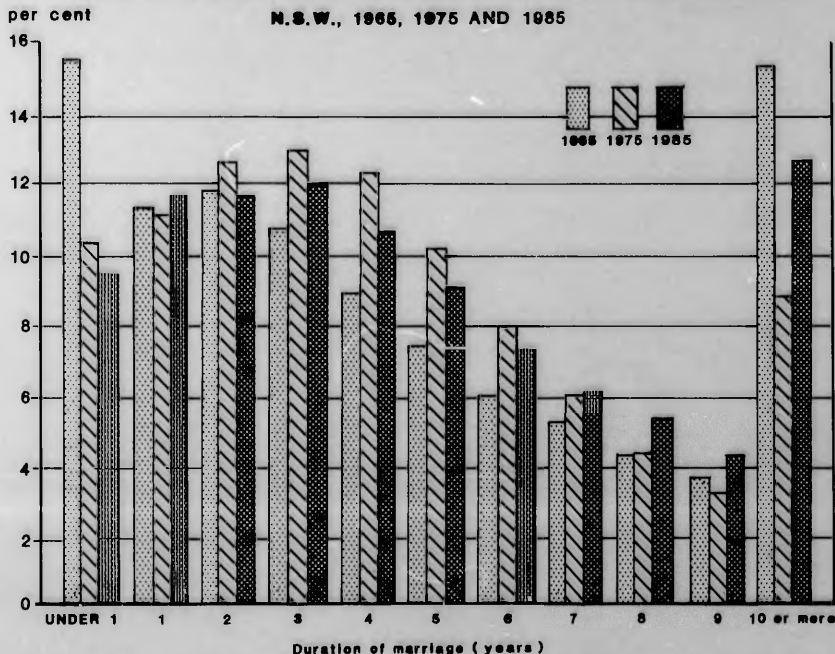

APPENDIX B

CHANGE TO USUAL RESIDENCE STATISTICS

Since 1983 statistics on live births have been based on the State (or Territory) of usual residence of the mother at the time of birth. Previously they were based on the State (or Territory) of registration. This change brings birth statistics, a component of population change, in line with the estimated resident population series, which changed to a State of usual residence basis in June 1981.

An explanation of the 'place of usual residence' concept for population estimates is given in the ABS Information Paper entitled 'Population Estimates: An Outline of the New Conceptual Basis of ABS Population Estimates' (3216.0) released on 29 March 1982.

In this bulletin, some tables show data on the State of usual residence basis while others show data on the State of registration basis (see Explanatory Note 2, and table footnotes). However, as can be seen from the following table, the change in basis has had only a marginal effect.

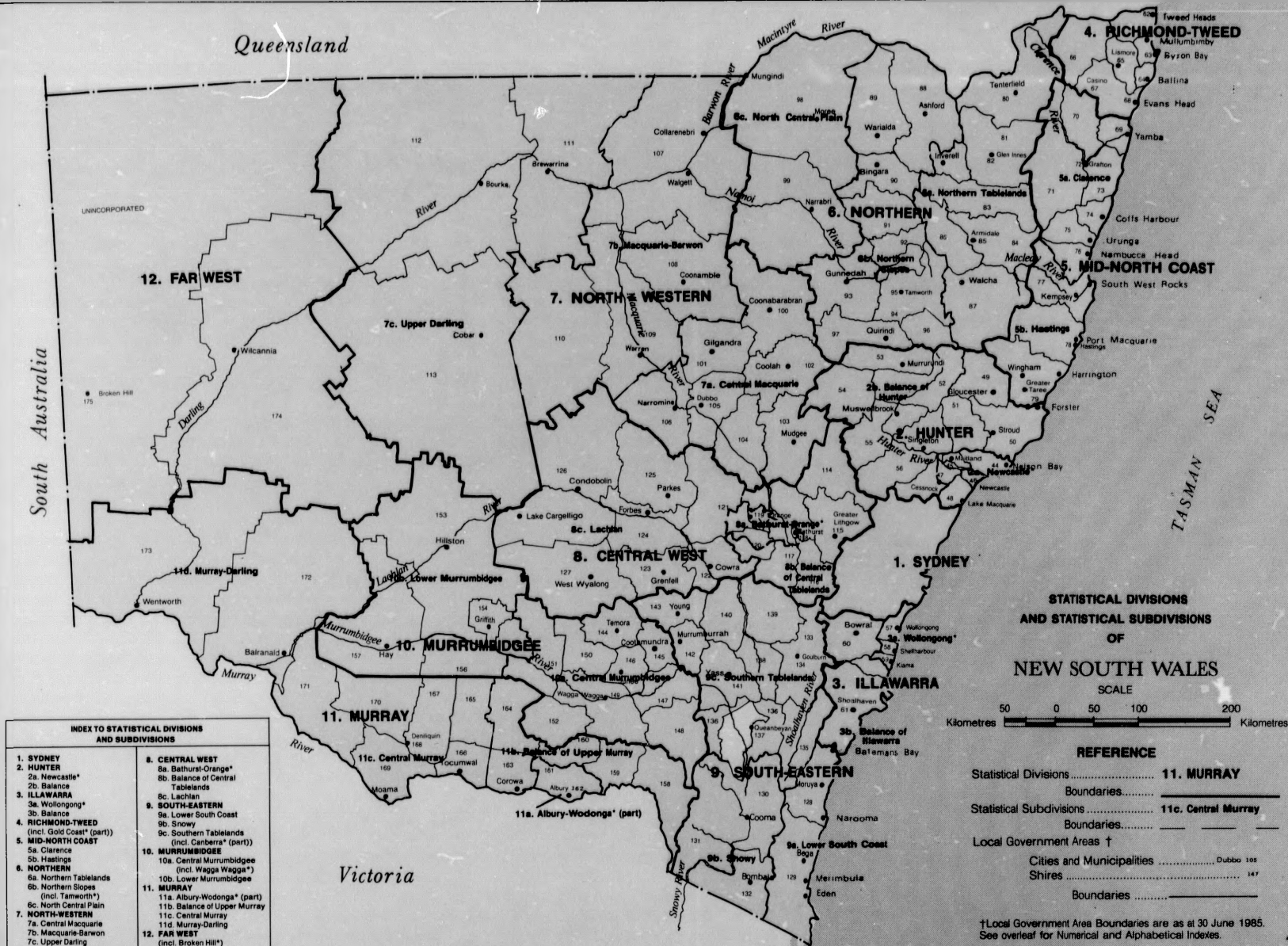

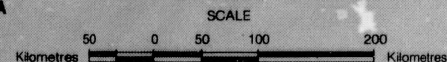
