NO. 16: SUMMARY OF POPULATION AND DWELLINGS FOR THE AUSTRALIAN CAPITAL TERRITORY.

This Bulletin contains an analysis, in summary form, of the population and dwellings of the Australian Capital Territory as enumerated at the Census of 30th. June, 1954. The figures herein have been obtained from machine tabulation and extensive amendment is not anticipated.

In it the population is classified according to age, conjugal condition, birthplace, period of residence in Australia of those born outside Australia, nationality, religion, industry and occupational status. Dwellings are classified according to class, (i.e., private house, flat, etc.) number of rooms, number of inmates, material of outer walls, nature of occupancy, date of building, and rent.

Each major table herein shows the numbers of males, females and persons or of dwellings according to one particular characteristic (e.g., age or conjugal condition of persons and number of rooms or inmates of dwellings). At a later stage a more detailed analysis will be published, showing particulars of both population and dwellings in a series of cross tabulations (e.g. the numbers of persons in the various industries according to their age groups, and the numbers of dwellings according to both numbers of rooms and inmates, etc.)

The figures published in this Bulletin include particulars for the Jervis Bay District of the Australian Capital Territory, but, in accordance with international usage, they exclude the numbers of diplomatic representatives of foreign governments and the High Commissioners representing the governments of the members of the British Commonwealth, with their families and staffs, and also their dwellings. The number of people excluded in this way at the Census of 30th. June, 1954, was approximately 400, and the number of dwellings excluded, 74.

All the following tables exclude particulars of full-blood aboriginals and the dwellings occupied by them.

PART A. - POPULATION OF THE AUSTRALIAN CAPITAL TERRITORY,

CENSUS 30TH. JUNE, 1954.

1. Population, Urban and Rural. The following table sets out population totals for the Australian Capital Territory.

The 1954 Census population of the Australian Capital Territory (viz. 30,315 persons) represented an increase of 79 per cent. over the 1947 Census figure (16,905 persons). This overall increase was due mainly to the increase of 87 per cent. in the population of the City Area (Canberra), which in 1947 amounted to 15,156 persons.

The sex distribution of the total A.C.T. population in 1954, at about 15 per cent. more males than females, was approximately the same as in 1947.

A Census of Canberra only was taken on 14th.-16th. September, 1951, when 23,617 persons (13,112 males, 10,505 females) were enumerated. The increase in the population of Canberra since that date was 4,660 persons (1,964 males, 2,696 females) or about 20 per cent.

The populations of the various districts of the Australian Capital Territory were shown, compared with those of 1947, in a statement recently issued (No. 8 - Population of the Australian Capital Territory - S.S. 261).

2. Age. The following table shows the numbers of each sex in each quinquennial age group at the Censuses of 1947 and 1954.

The principal feature of this table is the increasing predominance of the younger age groups. In 1954, almost 25 per cent. of the population of the Australian Capital Territory was less than 10 years of age, compared with 18 per cent. in 1947. Approximately 39 per cent. of the population was less than 21 years of age in 1954 compared with about 37 per cent. in 1947. Increases occurred in all age groups as compared with 1947 figures, the smallest increase being in respect of the 15-19 years group (which increased 12 per cent.), and the largest being in respect of the 0-4 years group (which increased 142 per cent.).

3. Conjugal Condition. The following table shows the population of the Australian Capital Territory classified according to sex and conjugal condition.

At the 1954 Census 49.95 per cent. of the total population of the Australian Capital Territory stated its conjugal condition as never married (compared with 50.7 per cent. in 1947); 46.7 per cent. as married (including 0.9 per cent. married but permanently separated); 2.6 per cent. as widowed and 0.7 per cent. as divorced. In 1947, 45 per cent. of the Australian Capital Territory population described themselves as married including those married but permanently separated, 3.3 per cent. as widowed and 0.7 per cent. as divorced. The proportion of widowed females to widowed males increased from 2.13:1 in 1947 to 2.6:1 as at 30th. June, 1954.

4. Birthplace. The following table shows the birthplaces of the population of the Australian Capital Territory at the Censuses of 1947 and 1954.

At 30th. June, 1954, the Australian-born portion of the population of the Australian Capital Territory represented 79 per cent., compared with 89 per cent. in 1947. European-born persons comprised 19 per cent. of the Territory population at the 1954 Census, compared with 10 per cent. in 1947, and consisted mainly of persons born in England (6.0 per cent.), Scotland (1.9 per cent.), Poland (1.8 per cent.) and Germany (1.8 per cent.).

The largest increases in numbers of overseas-born persons in the Territory between the Censuses of 1947 and 1954 occurred in respect of the following countries:- England, 828 persons; Poland, 551 persons; Germany, 525 persons; Netherlands, 375 persons; Italy, 302 persons; Scotland 210 persons; and Latvia, 207 persons.

5. Period of Residence in Australia of those born outside Australia. The effect of the post-war immigration policy shown in the above figures is also reflected in the following table which sets out details of the period of residence in Australia of persons born outside Australia. Of the 6,467 persons of the 1954 population born outside Australia, 4,843 (or almost 75 per cent.) have resided in Australia for less than eight years. In 1947 the greater proportion of the overseas-born Territory population had spent more than ten years in Australia.

6. **Nationality (i.e.-Allegiance).** At the 30th. June, 1954, 27,395 persons or almost 90.5 per cent. of the population of the Australian Capital Territory were of British nationality, that is, owing legal allegiance to the British Crown, compared with 16,856 persons or 99.7 per cent. in 1947. The number of foreign nationals increased from 49 in 1947 to 2,920 at 30th. June, 1954.

Of the 6,467 persons constituting the oversea-born Territory population, 3,547 were British subjects, while the remainder, 2,920 persons, owed foreign allegiance.

The most numerous foreign nationals in the Australian Capital Territory at 30th. June, 1954 were :- Polish, 663; Dutch, 387; Italian, 285; German, 207; and Ukrainian, 206.

The Census figures, as stated earlier, exclude the numbers of diplomatic representatives of foreign governments and the High Commissioners representing the governments of the members of the British Commonwealth, with their families and staffs.

7. **Religion.** The following table sets out particulars of the religions of those persons who answered this question (which is not obligatory), at the Census of 30th. June, 1954.

There were 2,360 persons who gave no reply to this question in 1954.

This represented 7.8 per cent. of the population of the Territory (compared with 1,378 persons or 8.2 per cent. in 1947).

The denominations with the largest number of adherents in 1954 were Church of England, 11,579; Roman Catholic and Catholic (so described) 9,337; Presbyterian, 3,006; Methodist, 1,807; Lutheran, 430; and Greek Orthodox, 426.

Of those who stated their religious belief, the greatest numerical increase since 1947 was recorded by the Roman Catholic and Catholic (so described). These increased by 4,933 persons on the figures for 1947, followed by Church of England with an increase of 4,488 persons; Presbyterian, 1,062; Methodist, 451; and Lutheran, 412.

Among the denominations with the largest number of adherents, the greatest proportional increases since 1947 were recorded by Roman Catholic and Catholic (so described), (112 per cent.), Church of England, (63 per cent.), Presbyterian, (55 per cent.), and Methodist, (33 per cent.).

There were also proportionally large increases in the Lutheran and Congregational religions.

In all Christian religions represented in the Australian Capital Territory there were 27,613 adherents at the Census of 30th. June, 1954, compared with 15,318 in 1947. The proportion to total population on both occasions was about 91 per cent.

The numerically largest industry group at 30th. June, 1954 was Public Authority (N.E.I.) and Professional Activities which absorbed 6,958 persons (slightly more than 50 per cent. of the work force), and comprised 5,061 males (47.7 per cent.) and 1,897 females (61.8 per cent.). This was followed by the predominantly male industrial group Building and Construction, 1,798 persons (representing 13.1 per cent. of persons in the work force) and Amusement, Hotels, Cafes, Personal Services etc., 1,114 persons (8.1 per cent. of the work force). In 1947 the proportional importance of these three Industrial Groups to the then total work force was as follows:- Public Authority etc., 46.3 per cent. Building and Construction, 17.9 per cent., Amusement etc., 8.8 per cent.

9. Occupational Status. The following table sets out details of the Occupational Status of the population (i.e. the capacity in which persons are engaged in the various branches of industry, whether as employer, employee, etc.) of the Territory at 30th. June, 1954, compared with the 1947 Census.

Of the total persons in the work force at 30th. June, 1954, 12,607 were employees, compared with 7,543 in 1947 (about 91 per cent. in each case); there were 500 employers (3.7 per cent. of the work force), compared with 275 (3.3 per cent.) in 1947; and 478 self-employed persons (3.5 per cent.) compared with 277 (3.4 per cent. of the work force) in 1947.

PART B. - DWELLINGS IN THE AUSTRALIAN CAPITAL TERRITORY,

CENSUS, 30TH. JUNE, 1954.

1. Summary of Population and Dwellings. - For the purpose of the Census, a dwelling is any habitation occupied by a household group living together as a domestic unit, whether comprising the whole or only a part of a building.

Detailed information supplied in this part of the Bulletin relates to private dwellings occupied at the date of the Census; in addition, however, the numbers of other than private dwellings (hotels, boarding houses, hospitals, etc.), and of unoccupied dwellings and of dwellings being built at Census date are also given.

"Unoccupied dwellings" include "week-end" dwellings, holiday dwellings, and other dwellings temporarily unoccupied on the night of the Census. They include newly completed dwellings awaiting occupation.

"Dwellings being built" relate to unoccupied dwellings of all types being built at 30th. June, 1954, and are therefore not identical with the numbers of houses and flats under construction at that date, since some of these were occupied before completion.

The following table is a summary of the population and dwellings (as defined above) of the Australian Capital Territory at the Censuses of 1947 and 1954:-

3. Dwellings by Class. Occupied dwellings are classified into private and other dwellings. Private dwellings comprise mainly private houses, shares of private houses, flats and tenements.

In previous Censuses dwellings returned on the Schedules as tents, sheds, huts, garages, etc., were included with private houses. In the Census of 1954 these dwellings will be shown as a separate group wherever practicable, but will be linked with private houses to preserve continuity with past Census results. Separate particulars were shown in the 1947 Census publications for private houses which were shared by two or more family units and for which only one Householder's Schedule was received, but in 1954 these dwellings have been included with private houses.

"Share of a Private House" is a portion of a shared private house which is occupied separately and for which portion a separate Householder's Schedule was furnished.

"Flat" is part of a house or other building which can be completely closed off and which includes both cooking and bathing facilities.

"Other" private dwelling is part of a building which is not a self-contained unit. It may be a tenement, an apartment, room(s), etc.

"Dwellings other than Private" include Hotels, Boarding Houses, Lodging Houses, Hostels, Hospitals, Educational, Religious and Charitable Institutions, Defence and Penal Establishments, etc.

Occupied private houses constituted about 90 per cent. of all occupied dwellings in the Australian Capital Territory at 30th. June, 1954 - all occupied private dwellings amounted to almost 99 per cent. The proportions in 1947 were very similar. The total occupied private dwellings (7,031) represented an increase of 3,469 or 97 per cent. over the 1947 figure (3,562).

4. Dwellings according to Material of Outer Walls. Since the 1947 Census, occupied private dwellings of brick in the Australian Capital Territory have increased by 59 per cent. to 3,613 in 1954; whilst wooden private dwellings increased by 152 per cent. to 2,078 in 1954, and the proportional increase of fibro-cement and concrete private dwellings have been even greater. More than 51 per cent. of the private dwellings in the Territory in 1954 were of brick, 30 per cent. of wood, 13 per cent. of fibro-cement and 5 per cent. of concrete.

5. Number of Rooms per Dwelling. The greatest increases (both numerical and proportional) in the numbers of occupied private houses since the 1947 Census occurred in the 4, 5 and 6-roomed houses, which increased by 126 per cent., 105 per cent. and 102 per cent. respectively. The numbers of flats in the 3 and 4-roomed class also showed considerable increases.

There were, at 30th. June, 1954, 5,933 occupied private dwellings in the Territory with 4, 5 or 6 rooms. This represented more than 84 per cent. of all occupied private dwellings in the Australian Capital Territory (compared with 79 per cent. in 1947).

c. Number of Inmates per Dwelling. Occupied private dwellings in the Territory with 2 inmates increased by 126 per cent. from 631 in 1947 to 1,426 in 1954. The proportional increase in dwellings with 3, 4 and 5 inmates were 96 per cent., 93 per cent. and 114 per cent. respectively.

At the 30th. June, 1954, there were 6,136 occupied private dwellings in the Territory (or 87 per cent. of the total) with 5 inmates or less, compared with 3,001 such dwellings (84 per cent.) in 1947. In rural districts there were 443 private dwellings with 5 inmates or less (or 85 per cent. of the total) in 1954 compared with 322 (or 79 per cent.) in 1947.

7. Dwellings according to Nature of Occupancy. Almost 80 per cent. (5,617) of all occupied private dwellings in the Australian Capital Territory were occupied by tenants at 30th. June, 1954, compared with 2,861 tenanted houses (or 80.3 per cent. of the total) in 1947. At 30th. June, 1954, 782 private dwellings (11 per cent.) were occupied by the owners, compared with 419 (12 per cent.) in 1947. Dwellings being purchased by instalments numbered 559 (8 per cent.) in 1954, compared with 185 (5 per cent.) in 1947. The proportional increases since 1947 were:- tenanted, 96 per cent.; owners, 87 per cent.; purchasers by instalments, 202 per cent.

8. Dates of Building of Dwellings. Information furnished on Householders' Schedules showed that private dwellings of all types built in the Territory since the beginning of 1950, and which were occupied at 30th. June, 1954, numbered 2,643, or 38 per cent. of the total occupied dwellings in the Territory. The highest figure for any individual year since 1947 was recorded for 1952 - 702. Almost 50 per cent. of the total occupied private dwellings (3,495) were shown as having been built before 1947.

9. Weekly Rent (Unfurnished) of Tenanted Private Dwellings. The following table shows particulars of rents paid for unfurnished private dwellings in the Australian Capital Territory, as compiled from information supplied on individual Householders' Schedules at 30th. June, 1954. There were 1,627 occupied private dwellings of all types with unfurnished rentals of up to 30 shillings per week in 1954 as compared with 1,499 in 1947. In the 30s. to 60s. group there were 2,232 as compared with 986 in 1947, and in 60s. and over there were 1,200 as compared with 24 in 1947. The proportions of each of these three groups to the totals are:- Up to 30s. - 1947, 52 per cent. - 1954, 29 per cent.; 30s. - 60s. - 1947, 34 per cent. - 1954, 40 per cent.; 60s. and over - 1947, 0.8 per cent. - 1954, 21 per cent.
